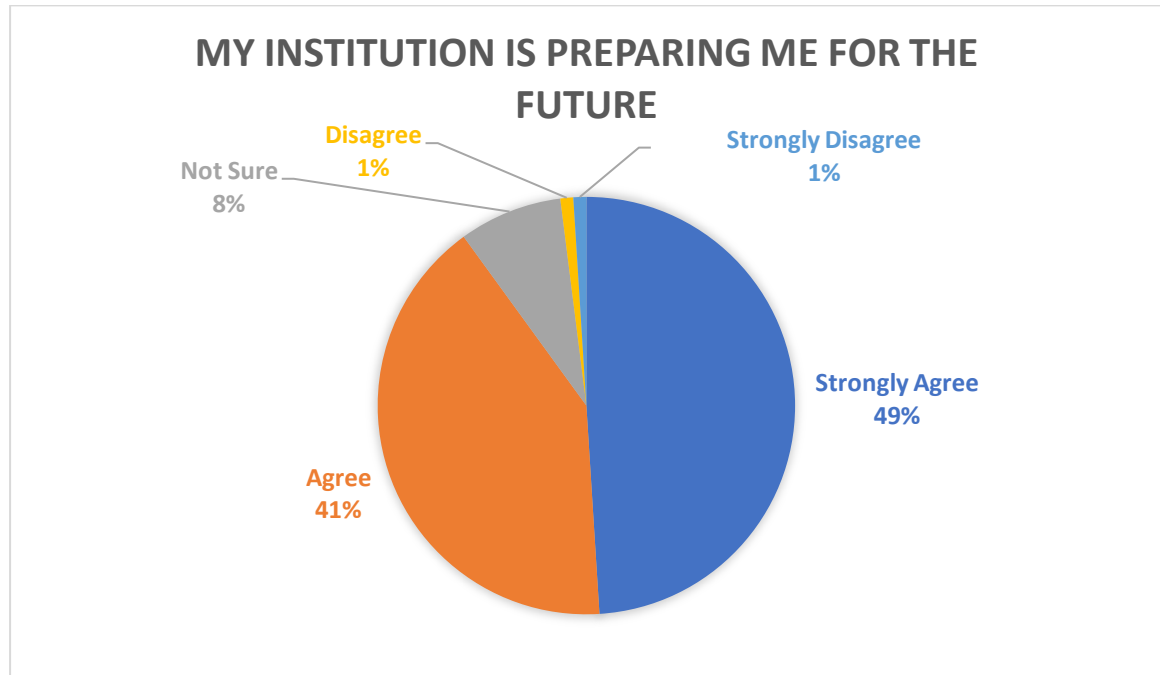

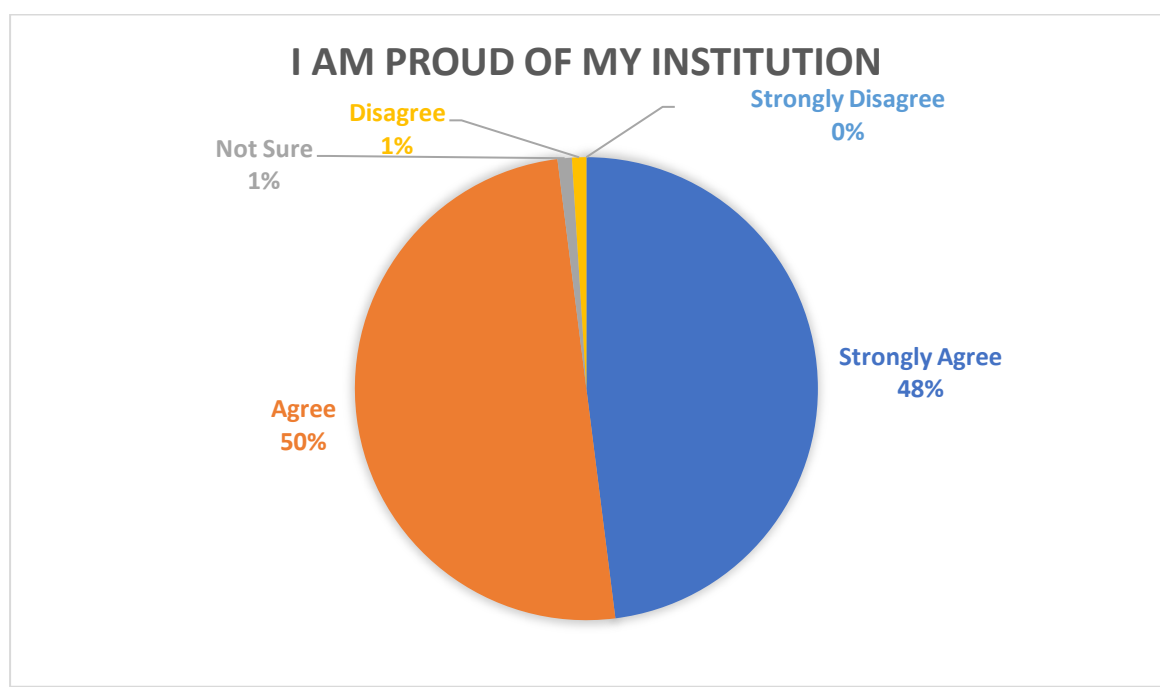
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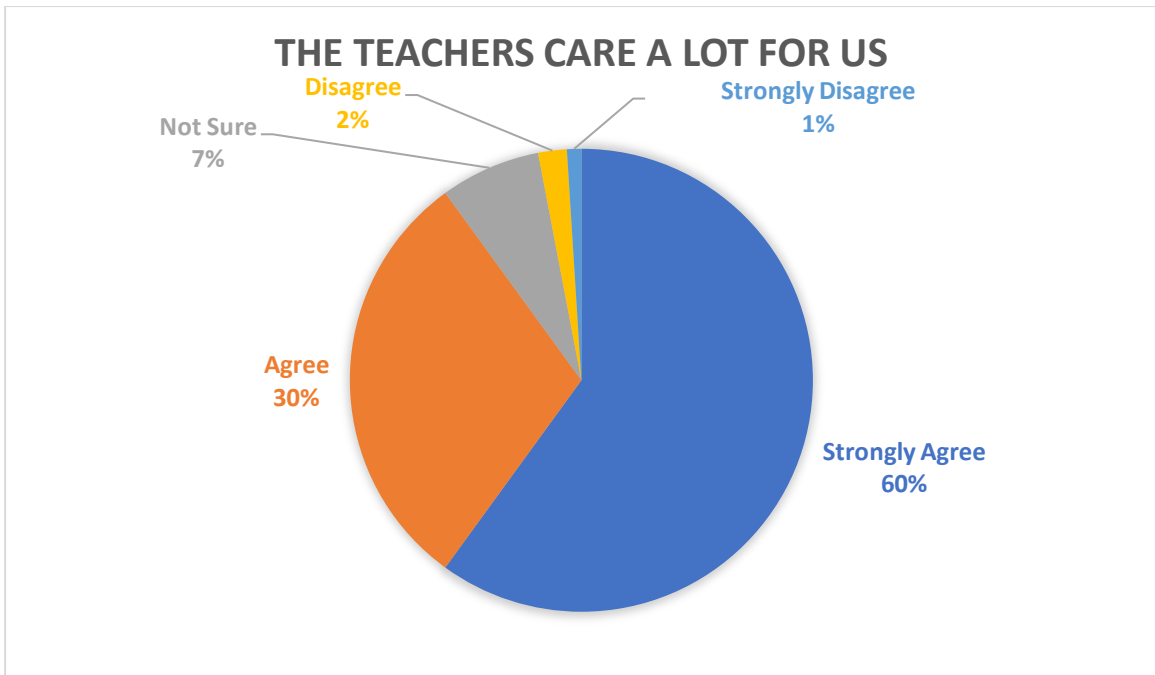
Students' Feedback Analysis Report 2019-20



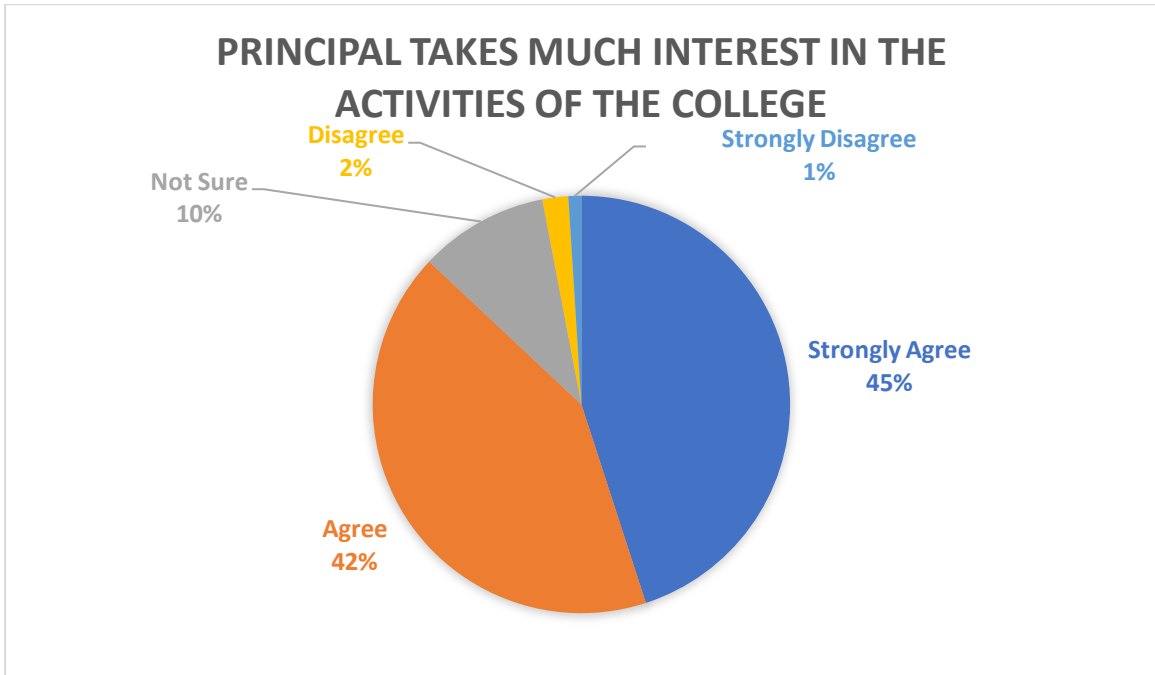
The data suggests that a majority, 90% in total, either strongly agree or agree that their institution is preparing them for the future.



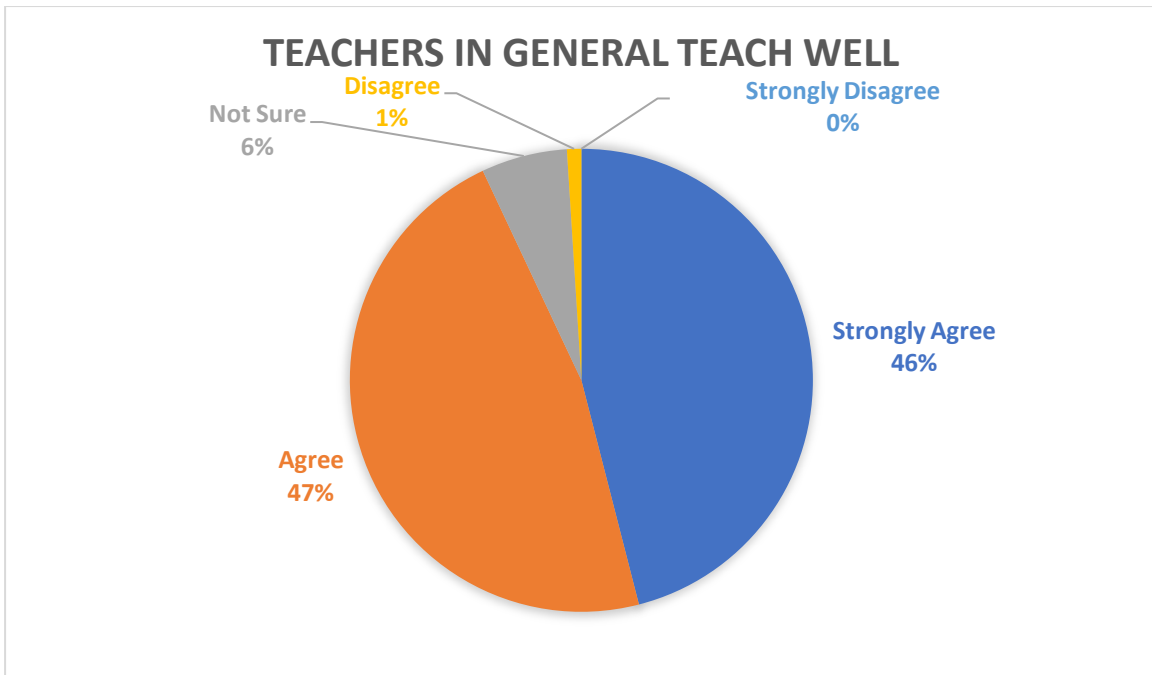
The pie chart indicates a significant majority, 98% in total, expressing either strong agreement or agreement with being proud of their institution.



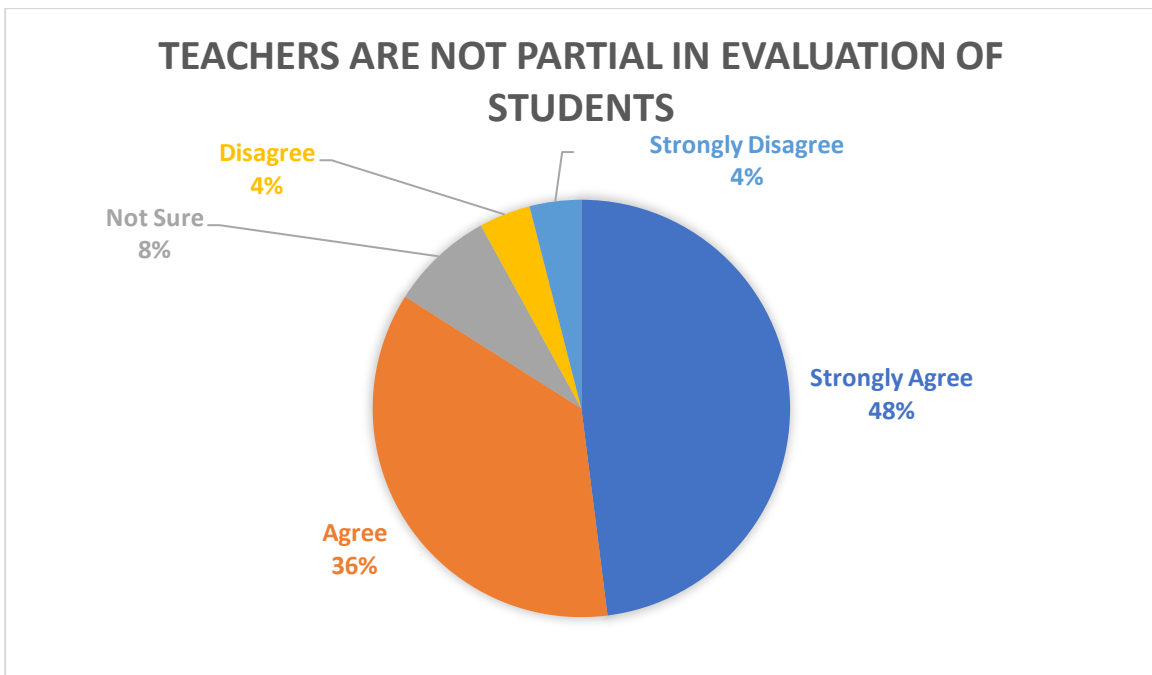
The above pie chart shows a substantial majority, 90% in total, either strongly agreeing or agreeing that their teachers care a lot for them.



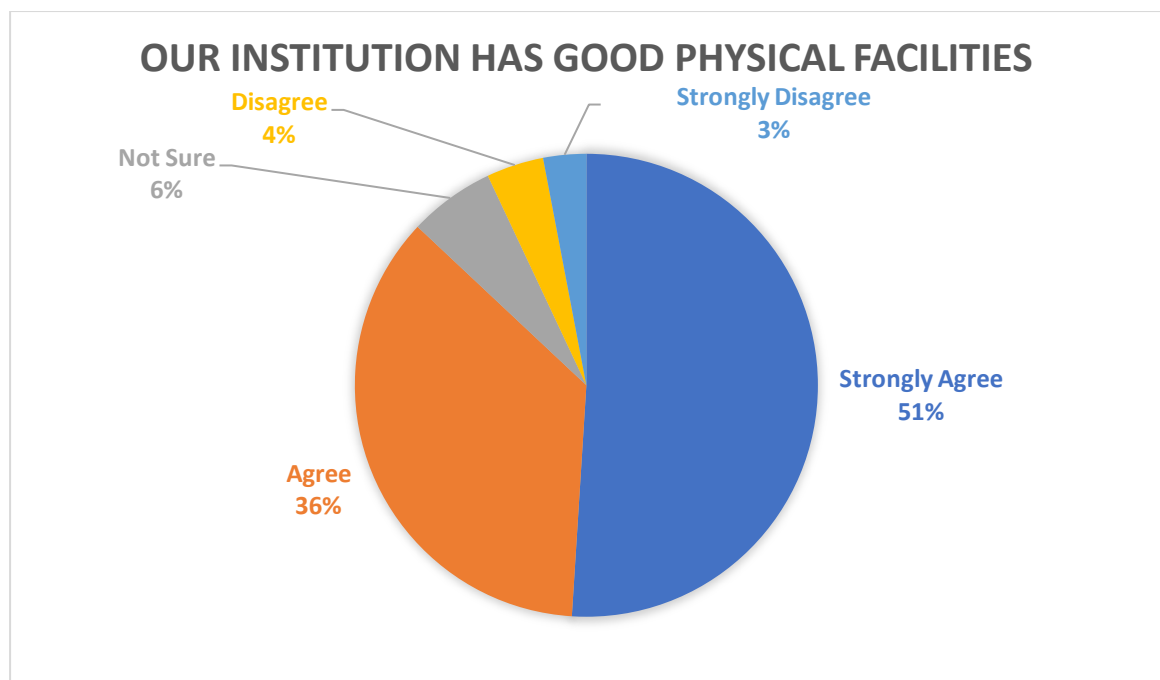
The distribution shows a notable majority, 87% in total, either strongly agreeing or agreeing that the principal takes much interest in the activities of the college.



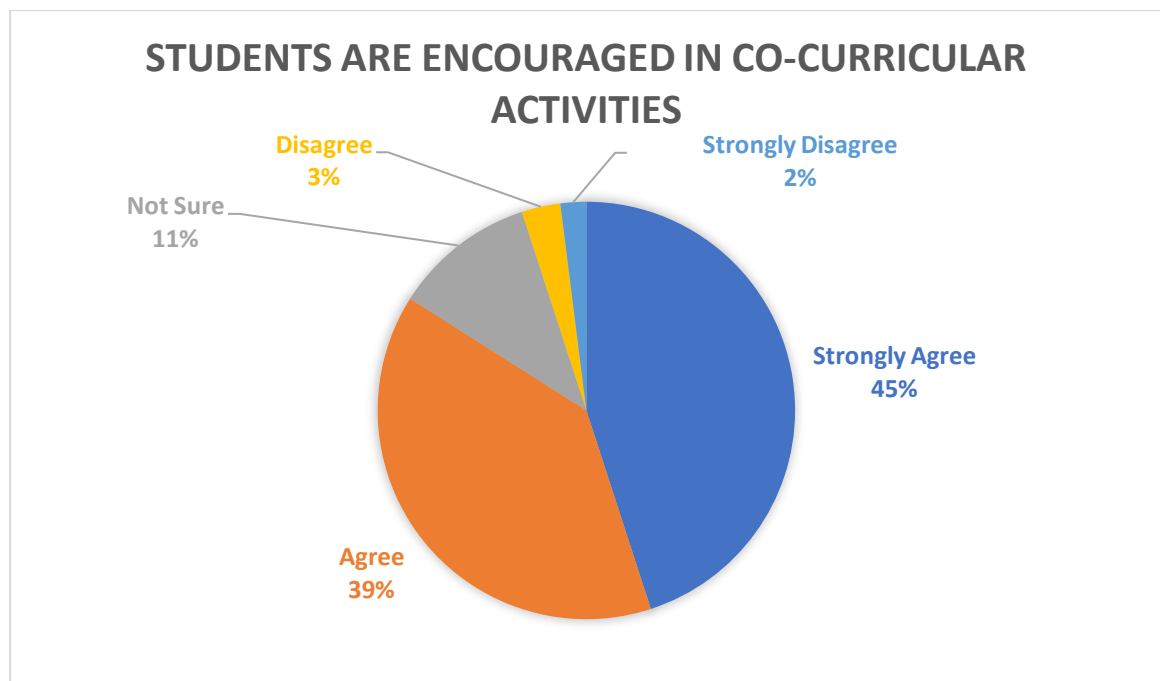
The data suggests a strong consensus among respondents, with 93% either strongly agreeing or agreeing that teachers in general teach well.



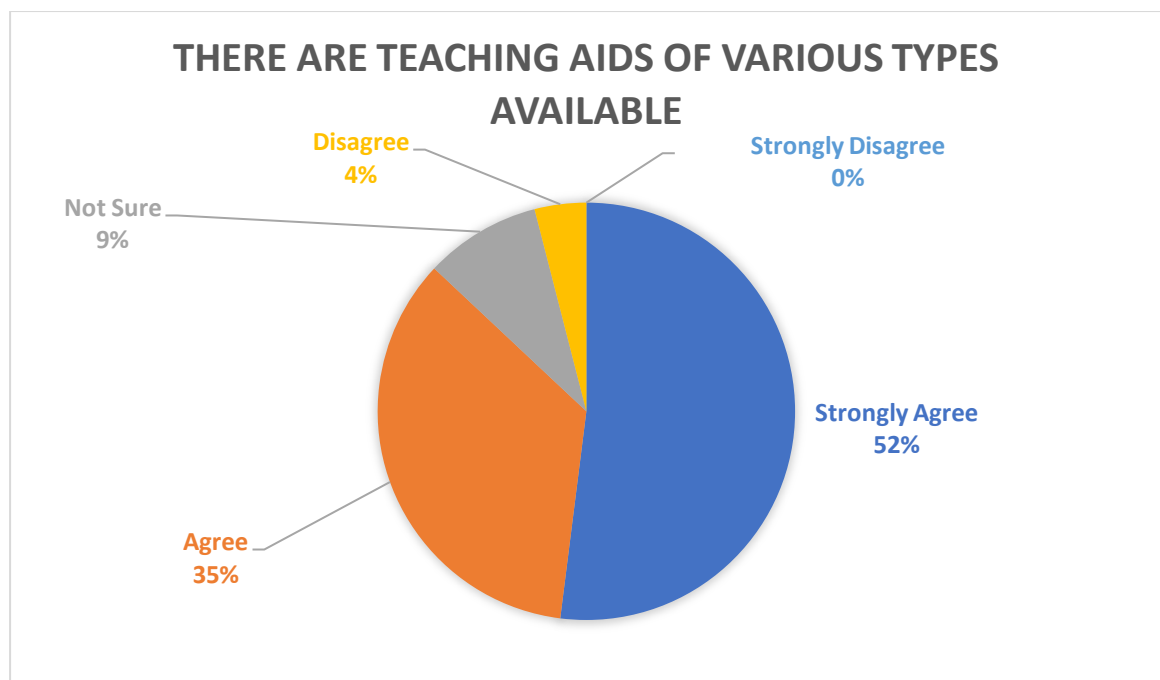
The survey results indicate that a majority (84%) either strongly agree or agree that teachers are not partial in evaluating students.



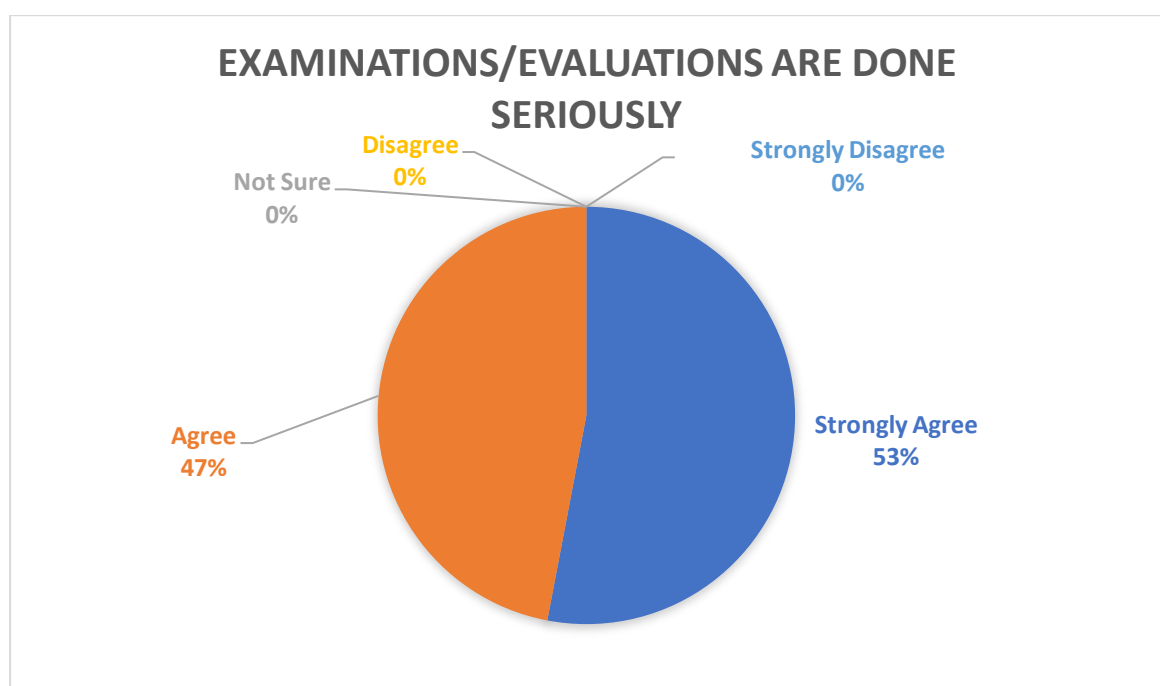
The pie chart indicates that most respondents have a positive perception of the physical facilities in the institution.



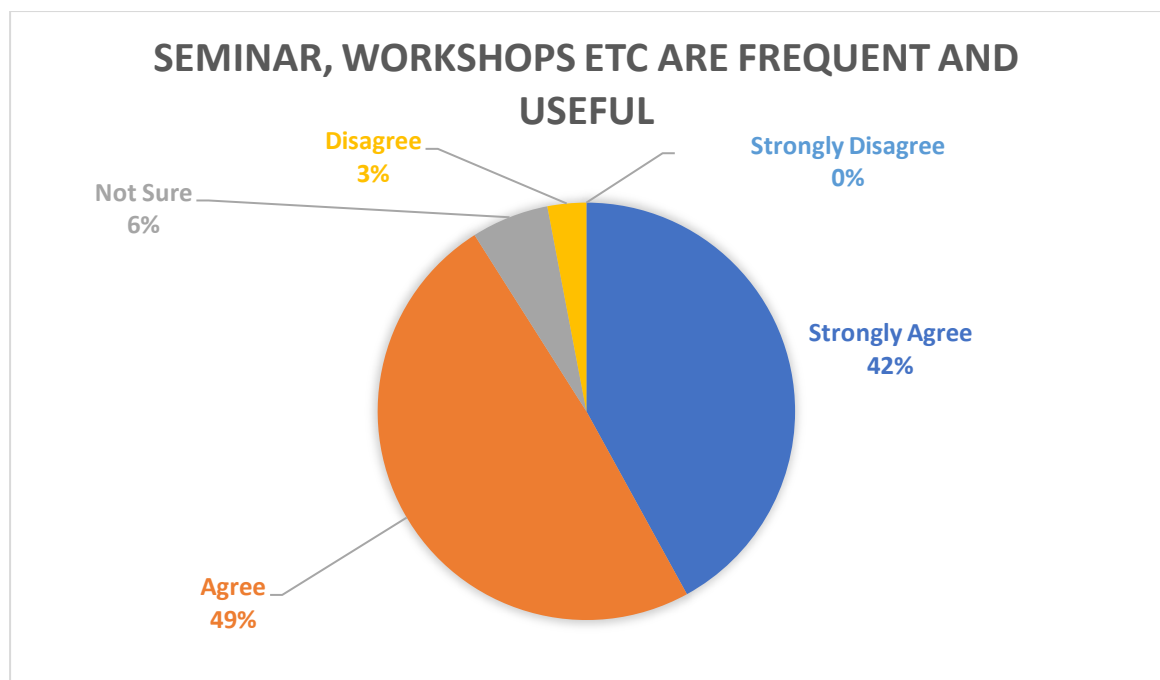
From the survey data, it's evident that a significant majority of respondents believe that students are encouraged in co-curricular activities.



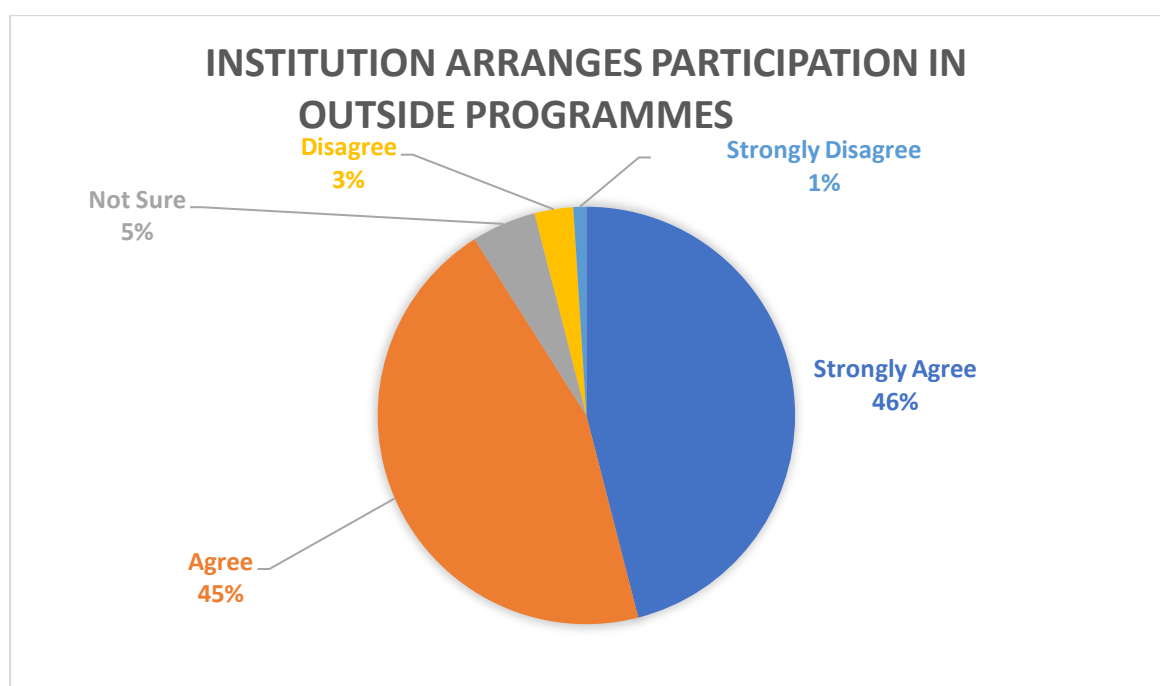
The survey results indicate a high level of agreement regarding the availability of various types of teaching aids, with 87% expressing a positive view.



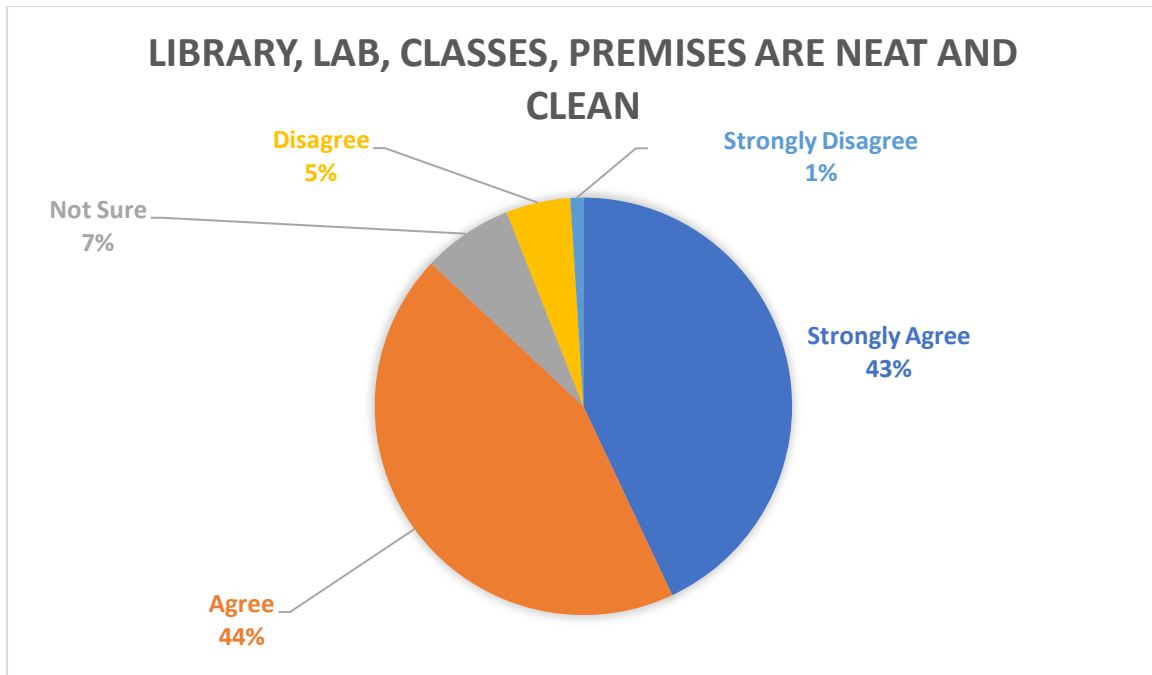
The data indicates an overwhelmingly positive perception regarding the seriousness with which examinations/evaluations are conducted within the institution.



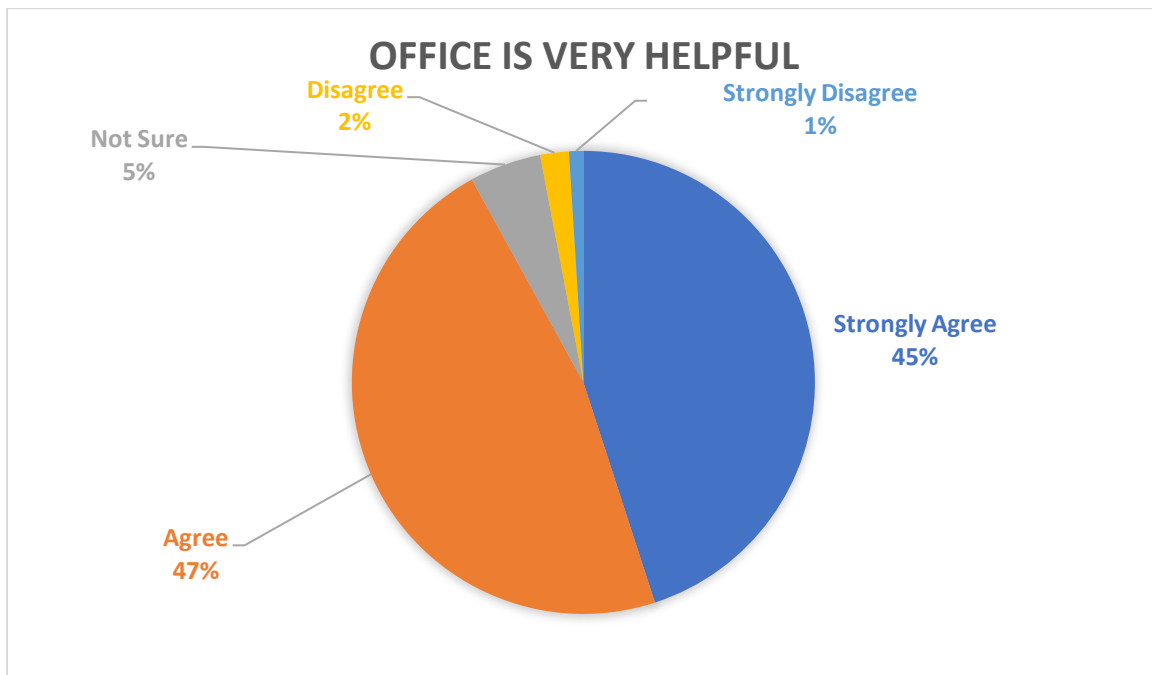
The survey results demonstrate a predominantly positive perception regarding the frequency and usefulness of seminars, workshops, and similar events within the institution.



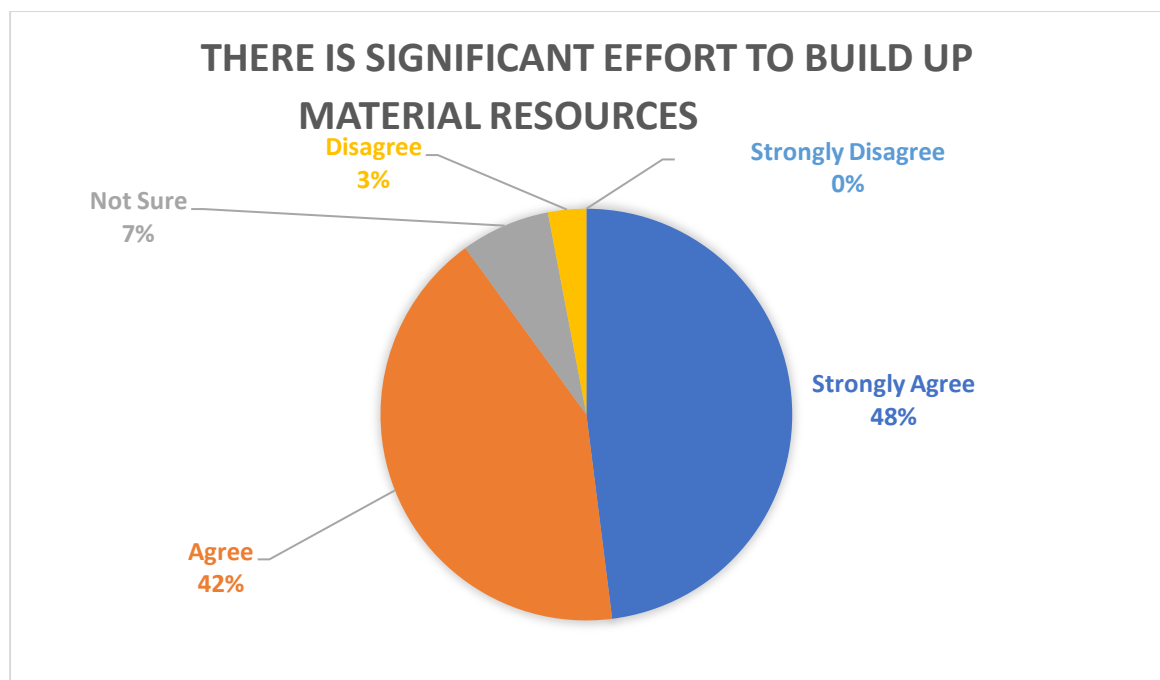
The pie chart illustrates a positive sentiment regarding the institution's involvement in arranging participation in outside programs.



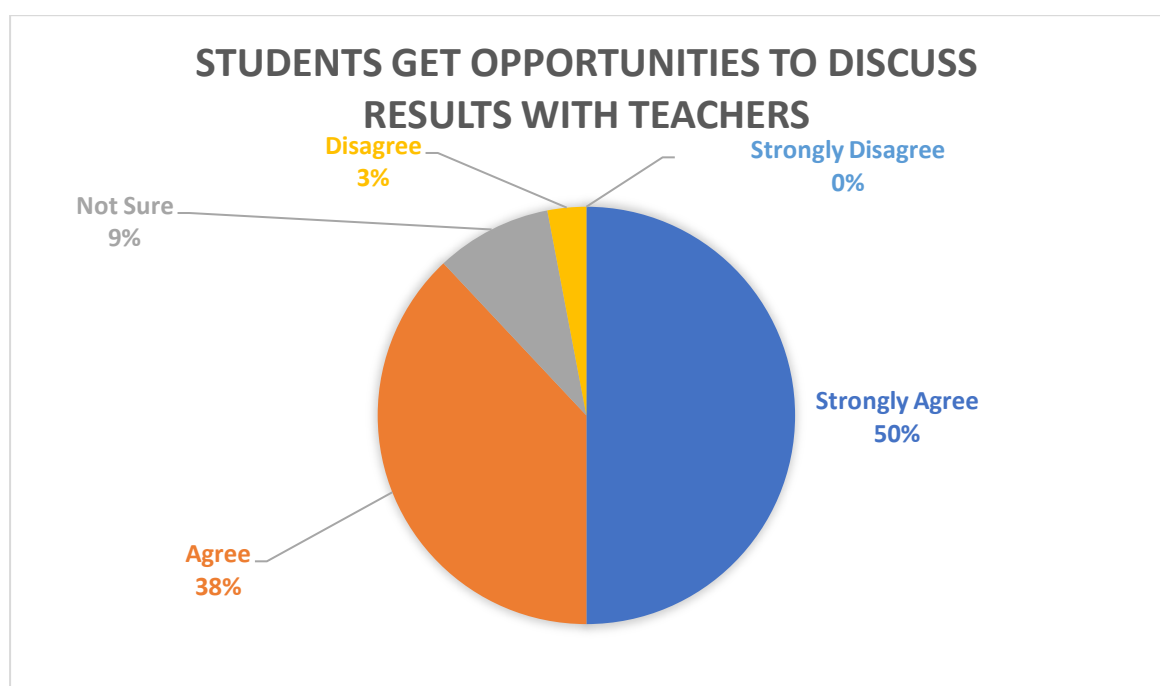
The pie chart demonstrates a positive perception regarding the cleanliness of various spaces within the institution.



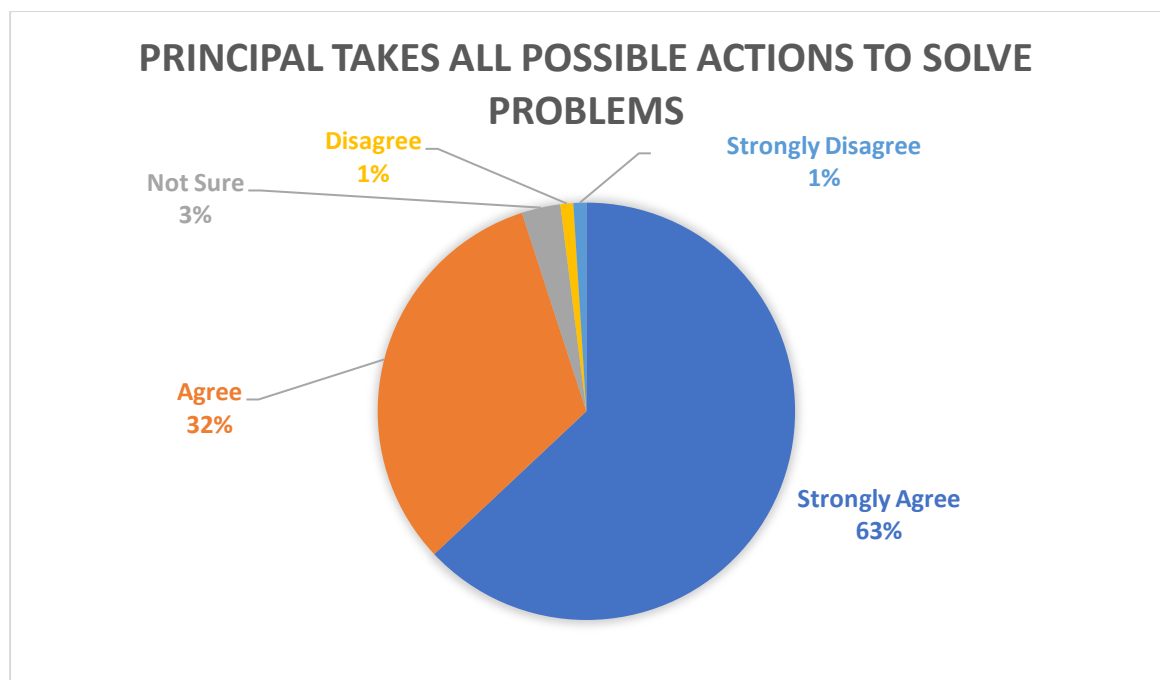
The pie chart indicates a strong positive perception towards the helpfulness of services provided by the office.



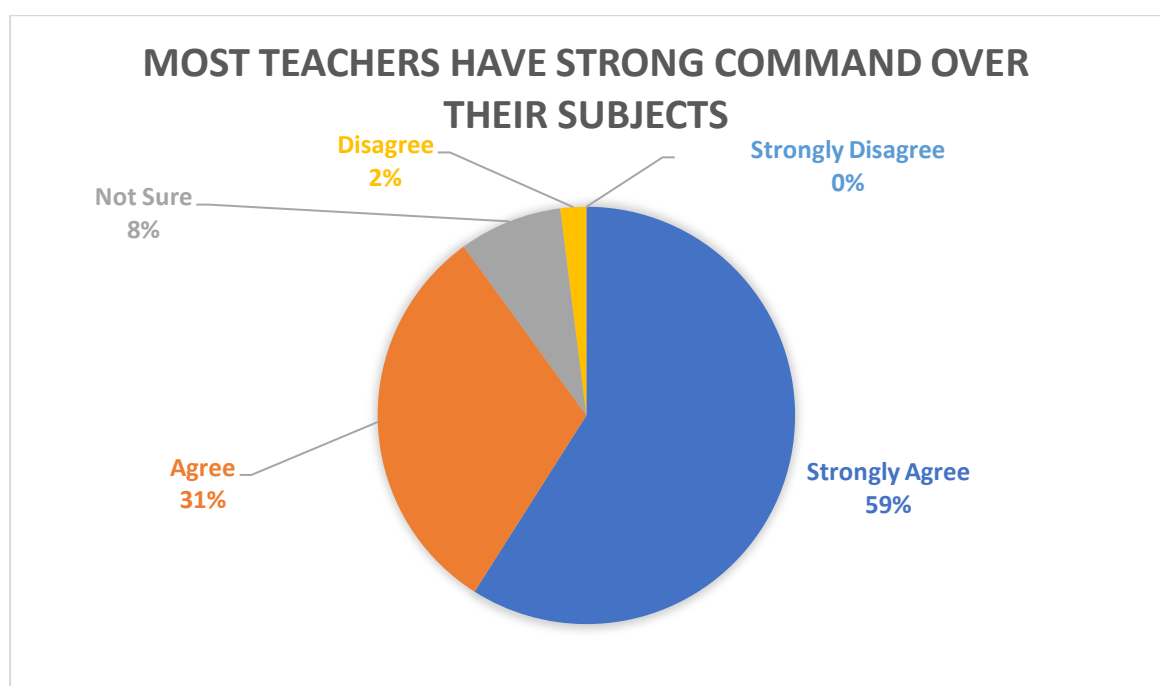
The pie chart illustrates a positive perception regarding the efforts to build up material resources within the institution.



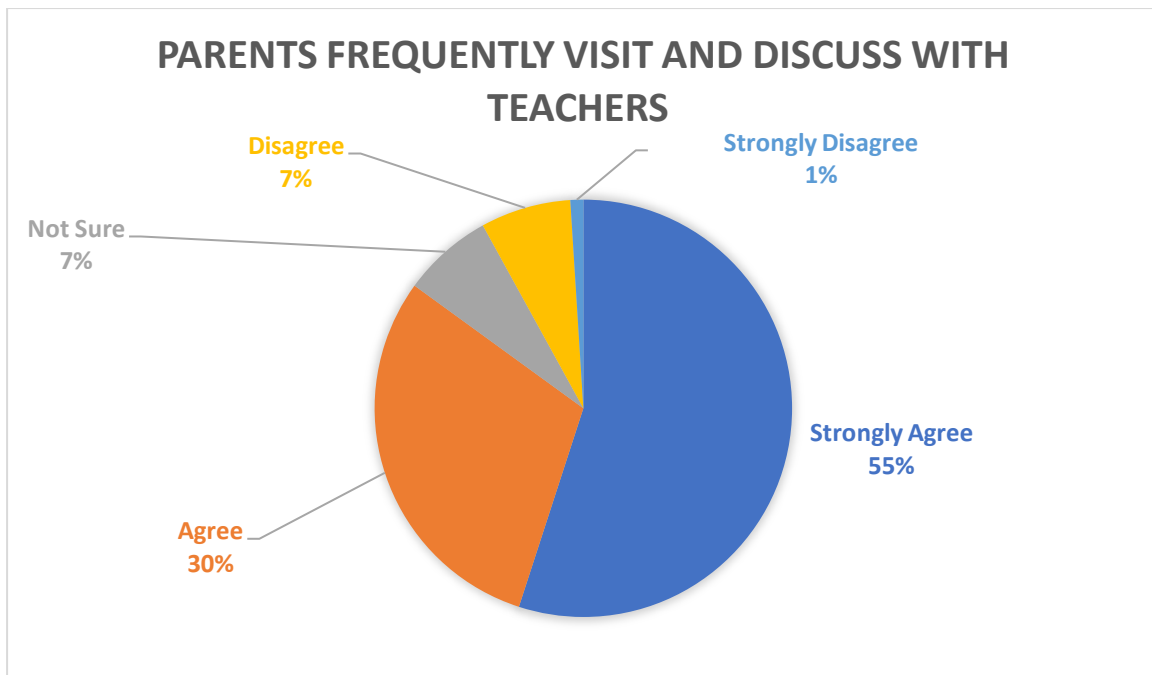
The pie chart indicates a positive perception regarding the opportunity of students to discuss results with their teachers.



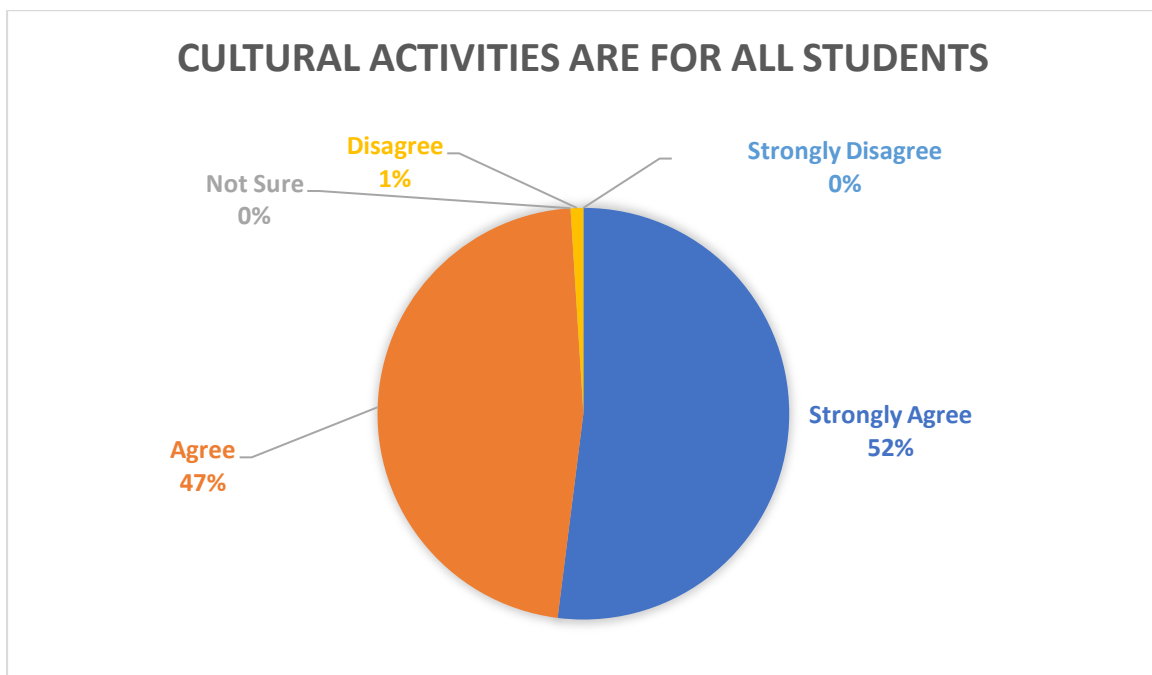
The data strongly indicates a positive perception about the principal’s actions in problem-solving within the institution.



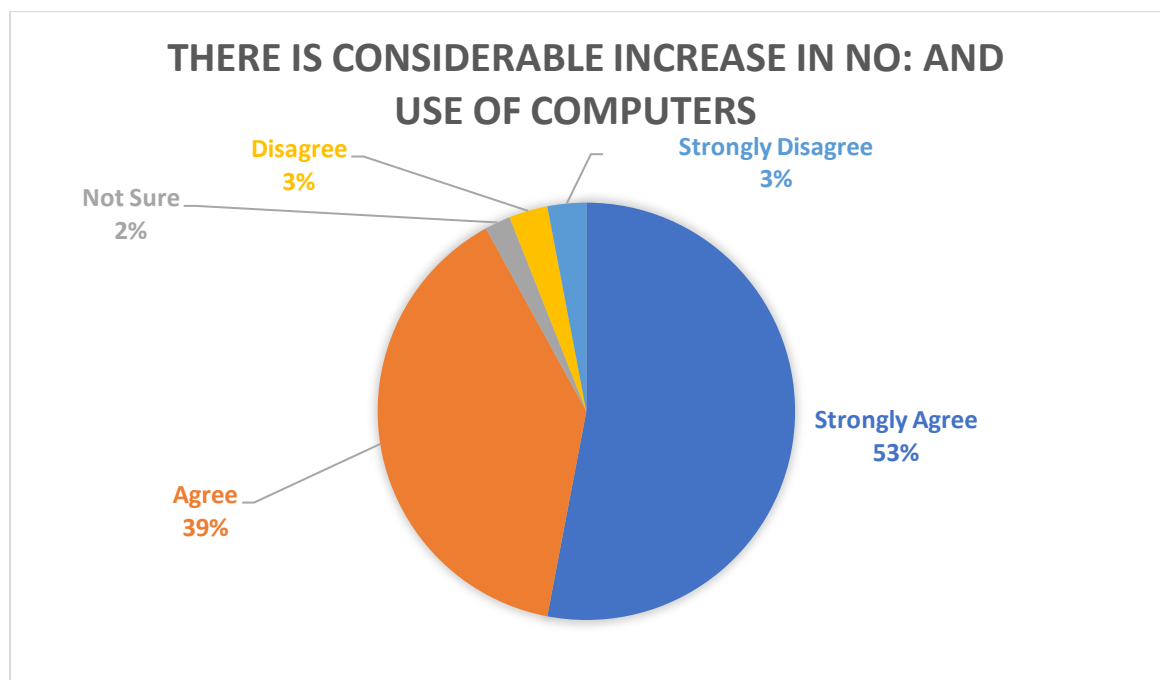
The pie chart illustrates a very positive perception regarding the proficiency of teachers in their respective subjects.



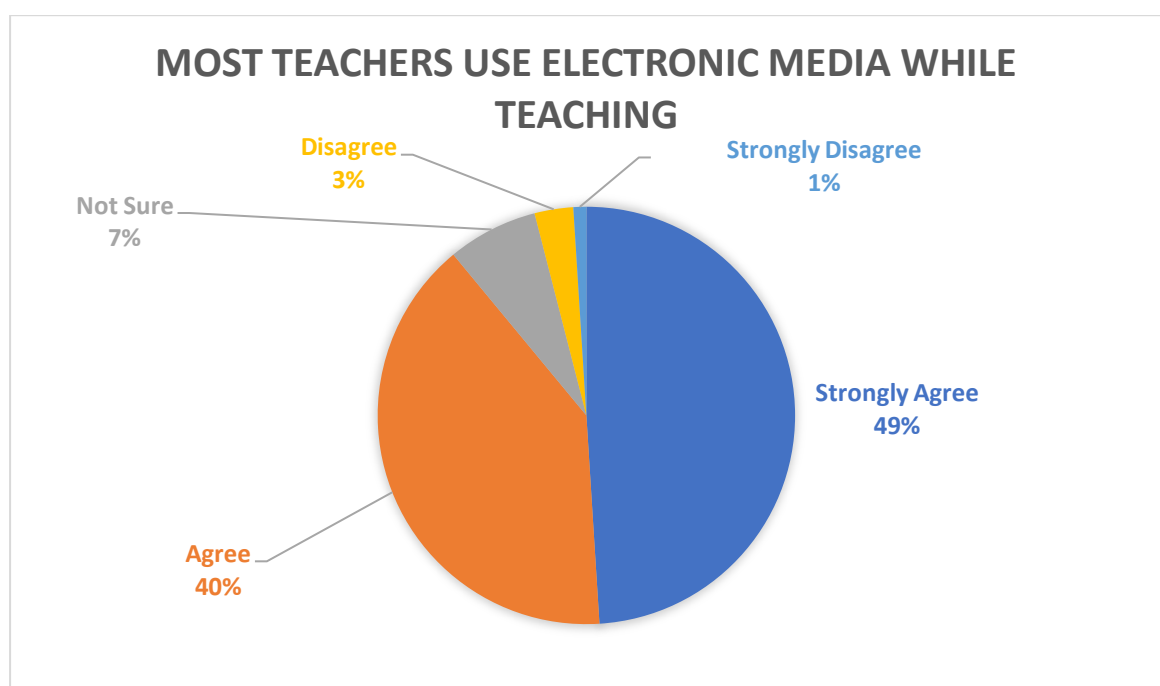
The pie chart indicates a positive perception regarding parental involvement in visiting and discussing matters with teachers.



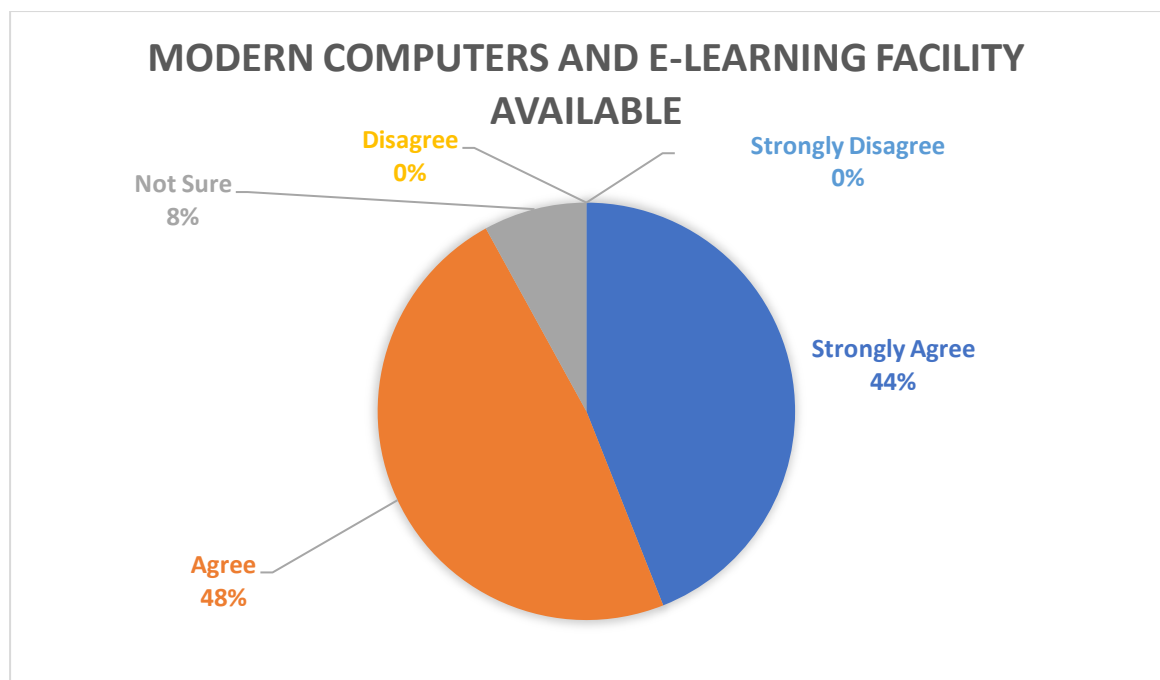
The pie chart demonstrates a strong positive perception that cultural activities are all students inclusive.



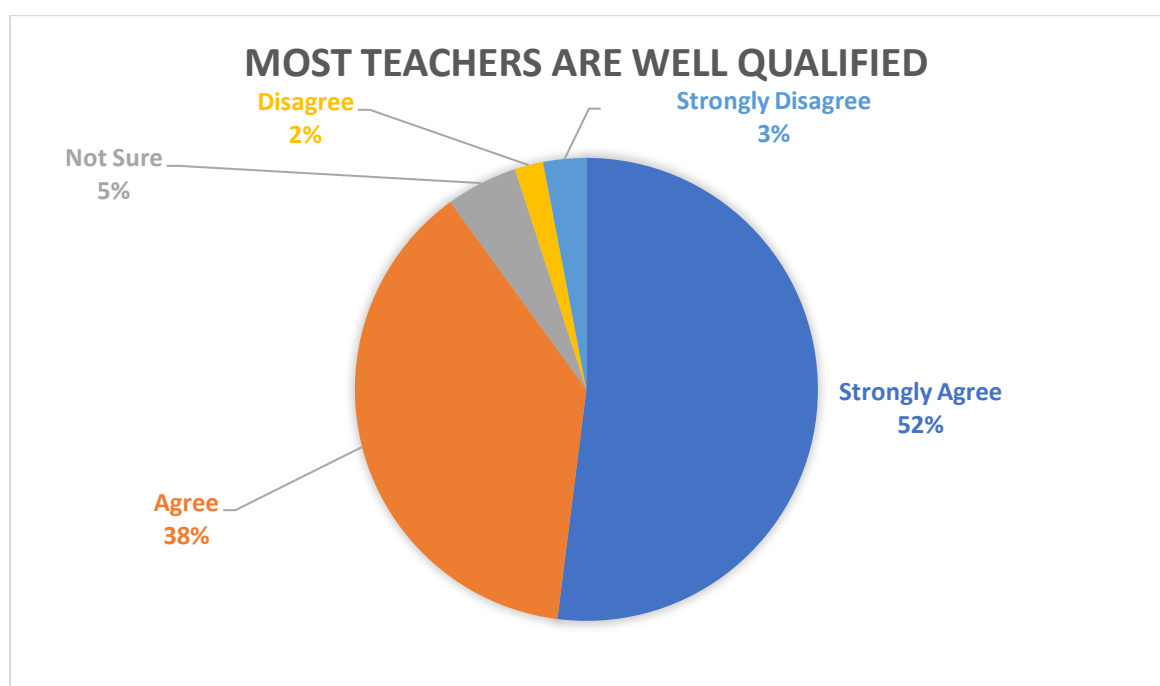
The pie chart reveals a strong positive perception that there has been a significant increase in the number and utilization of computers within the institution.



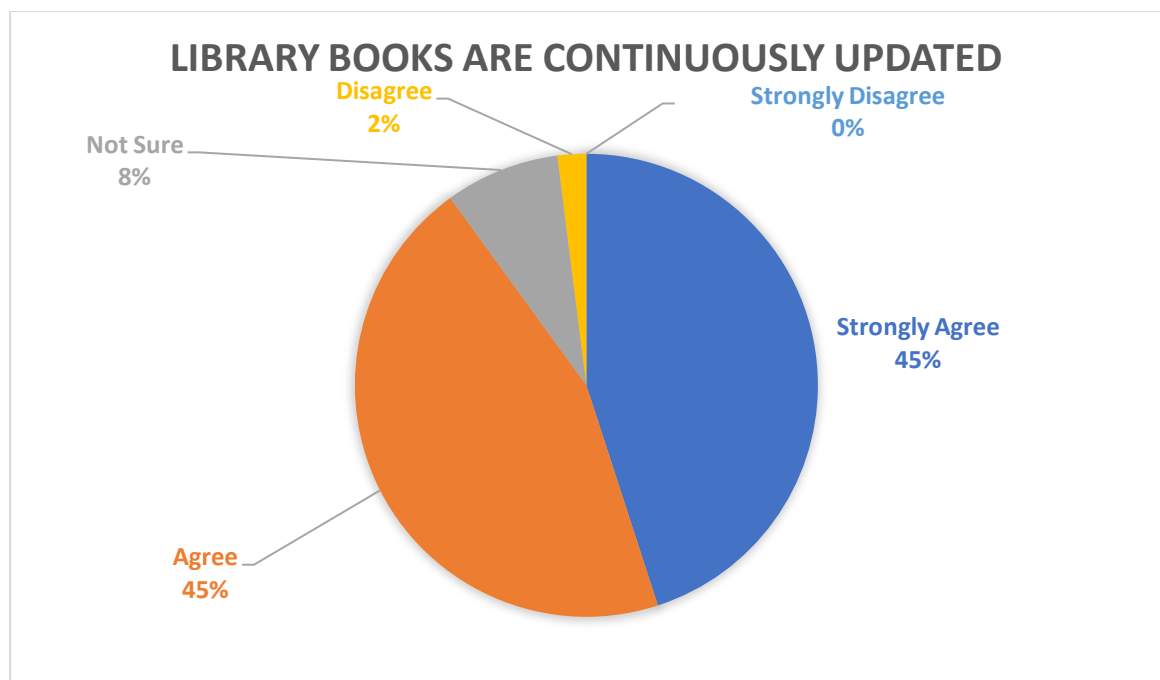
The data indicates a positive perception regarding the use of electronic media by teachers during teaching sessions.



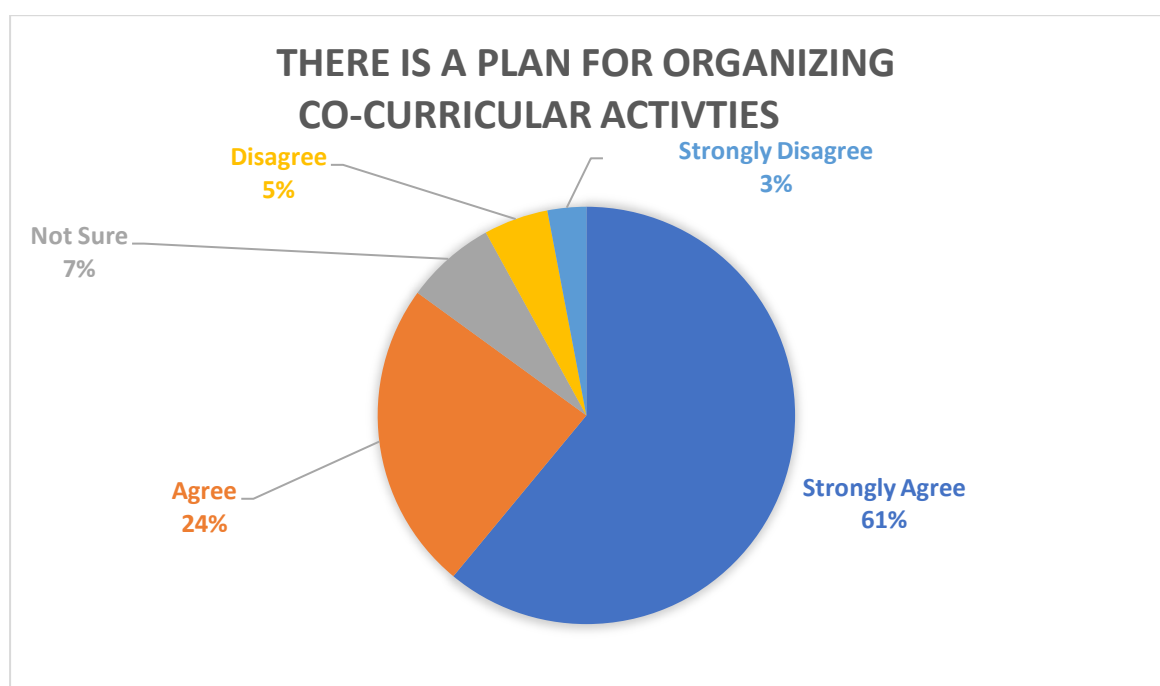
The data strongly suggests a positive perception regarding the availability of modern computers and e-learning facilities within the institution.



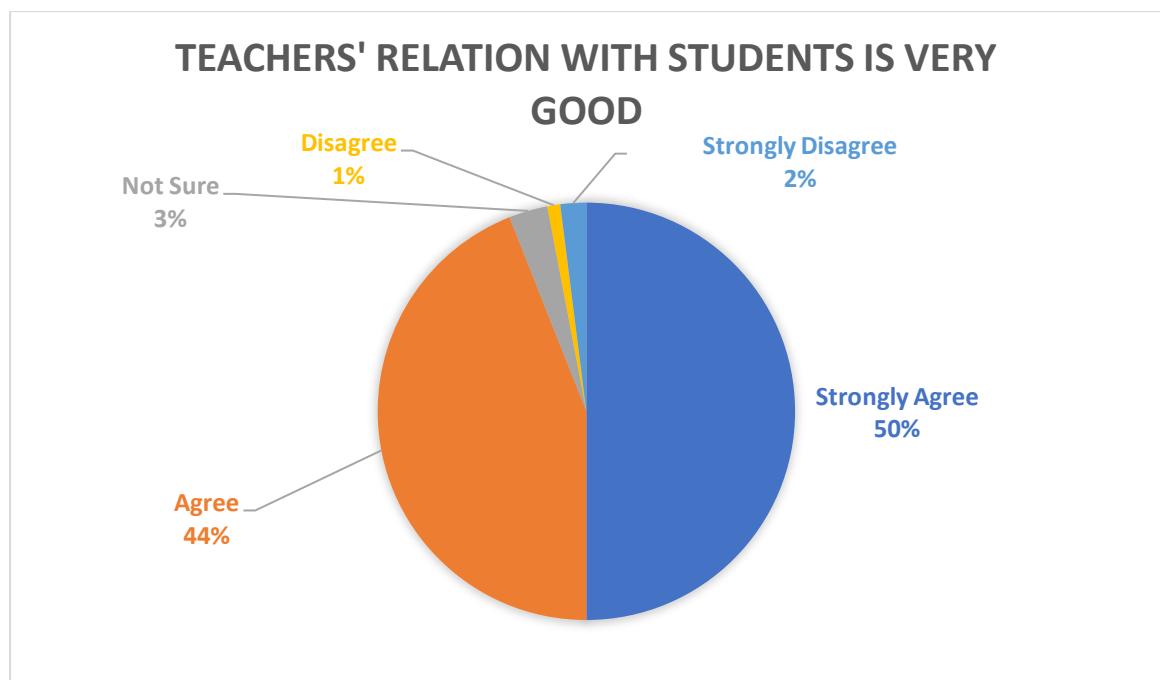
The data illustrates a positive perception regarding the qualifications of teachers within the institution.



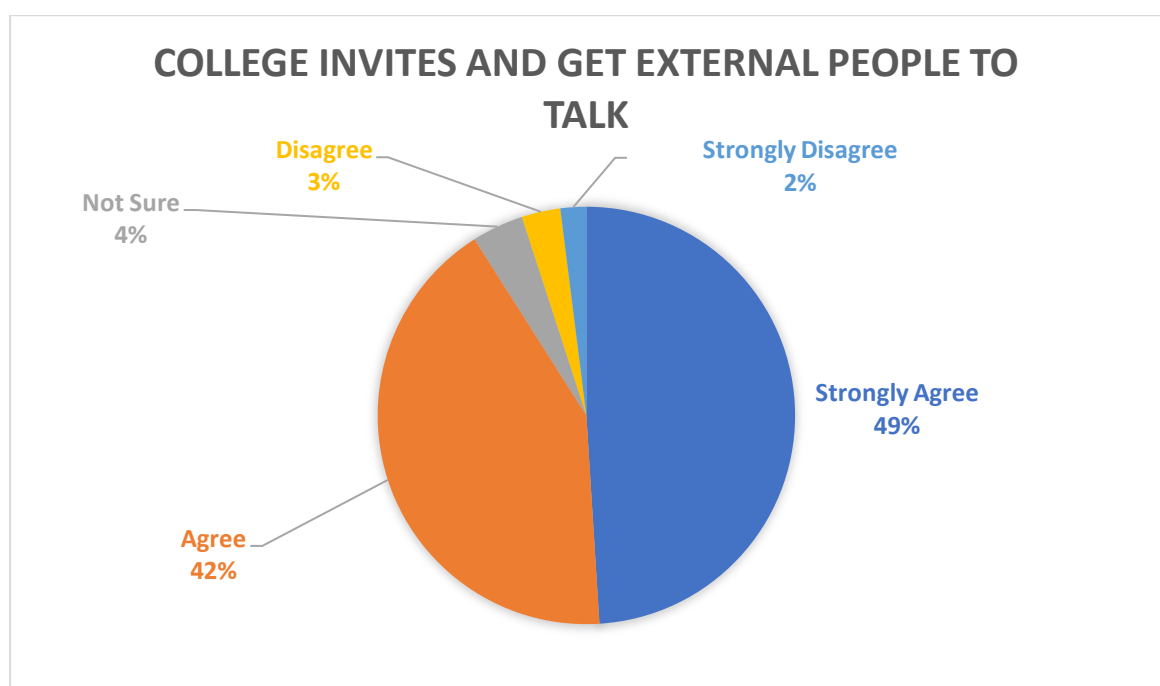
The survey suggests a widespread belief that libraries regularly update their book collections with new materials.



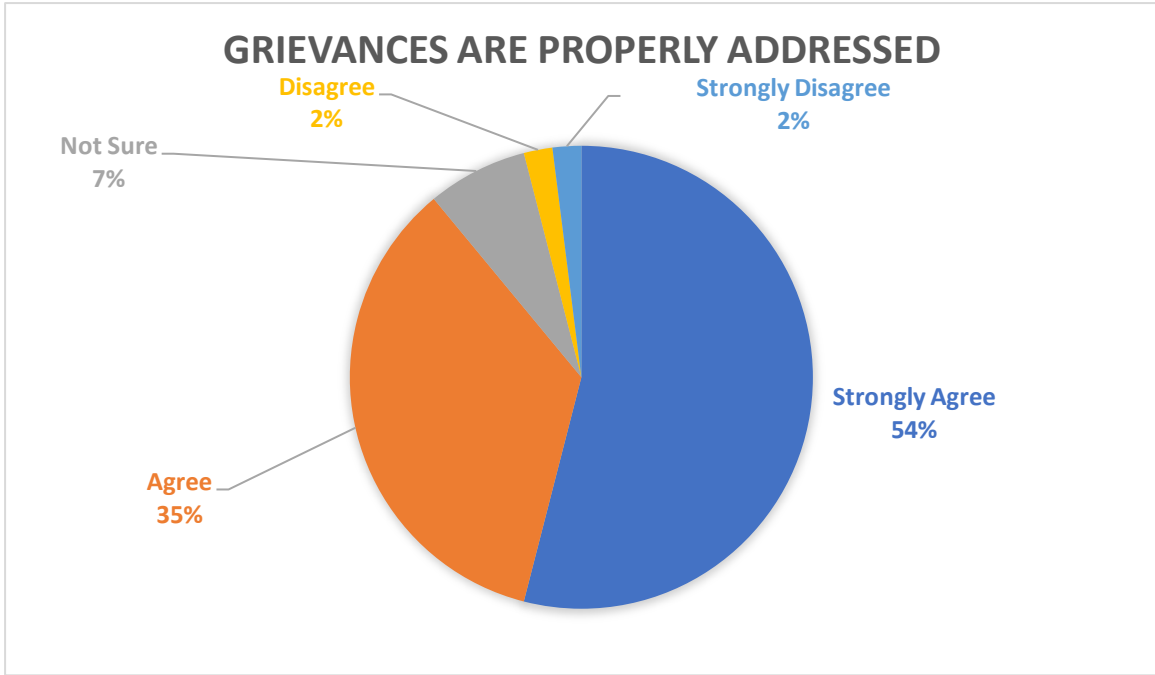
The pie chart illustrates that most respondents believe that there is a plan in place for organizing co-curricular activities.



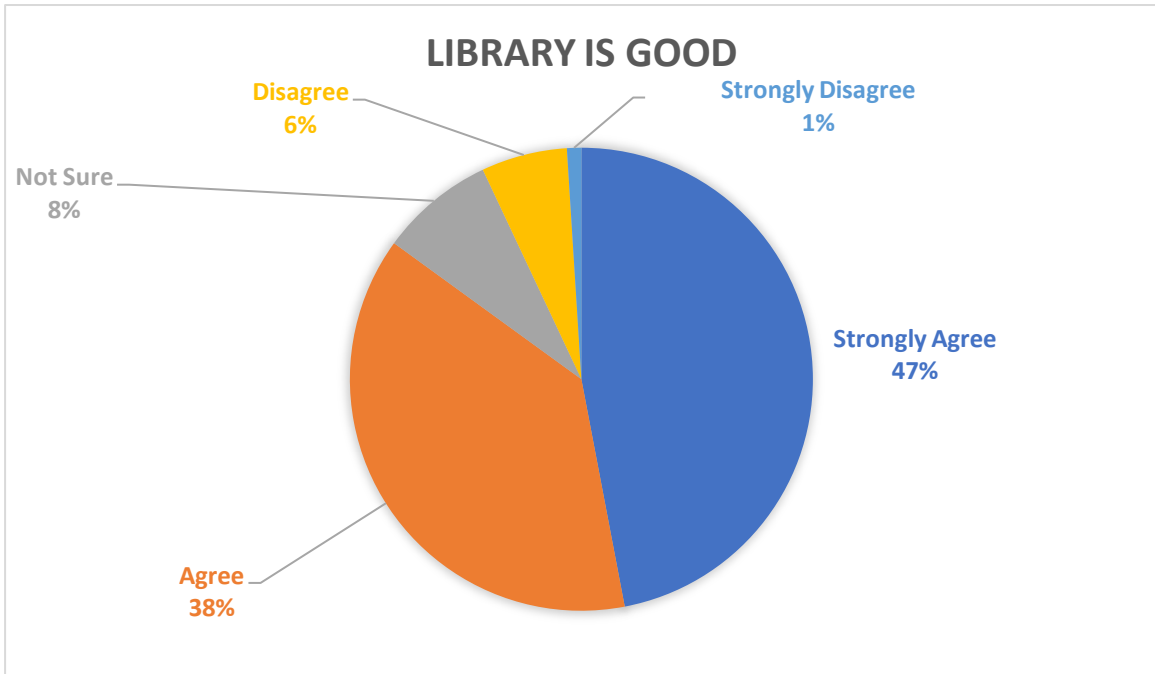
The data indicates a positive sentiment towards the relationship between teachers and students.



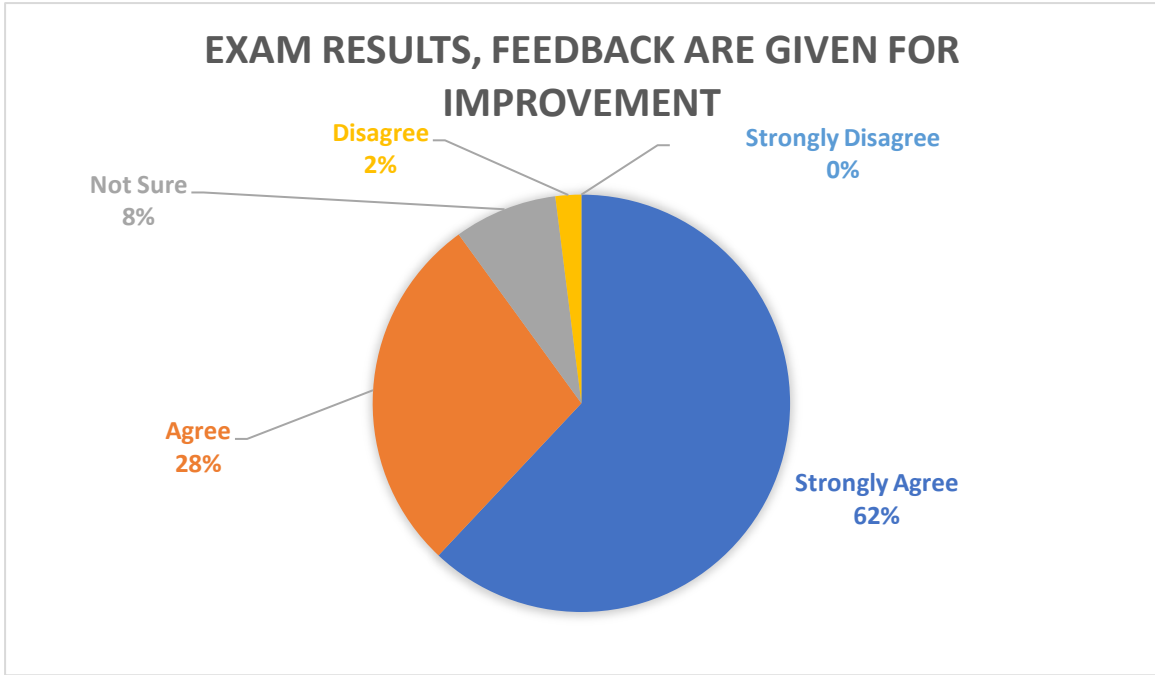
The data indicates a strong acknowledgement or awareness among those surveyed about the college's initiative to bring in outside voices for presentations or discussions.

Inclusive Environment: Cultural activities are seen as inclusive, and parental involvement is encouraged.


Open Communication: The opportunity to discuss results with teachers is valued, and the college brings in outside perspectives.

Effective Grievance Handling: Grievances are perceived as handled well.

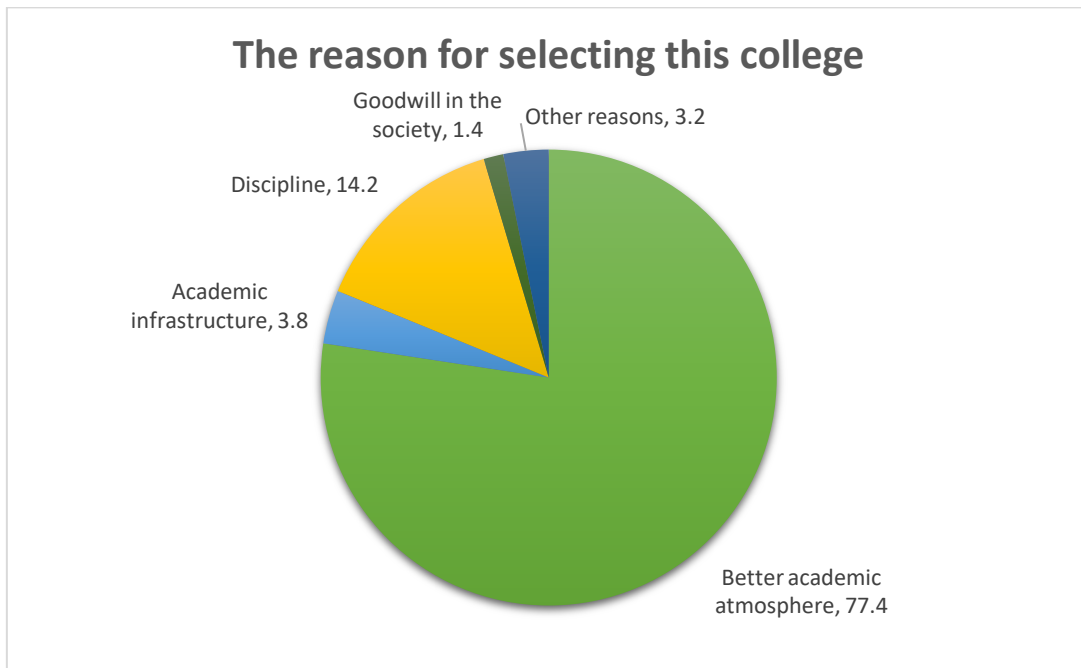
Overall: The institution seems to provide a supportive and enriching learning environment, preparing students for the future while fostering a sense of community and belonging.



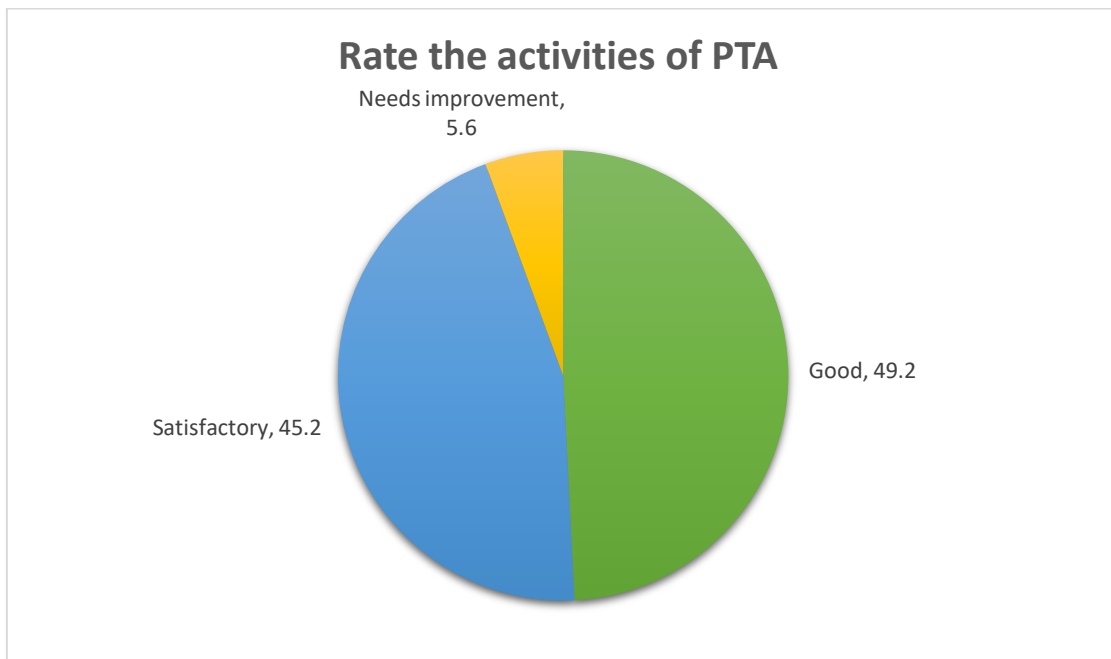

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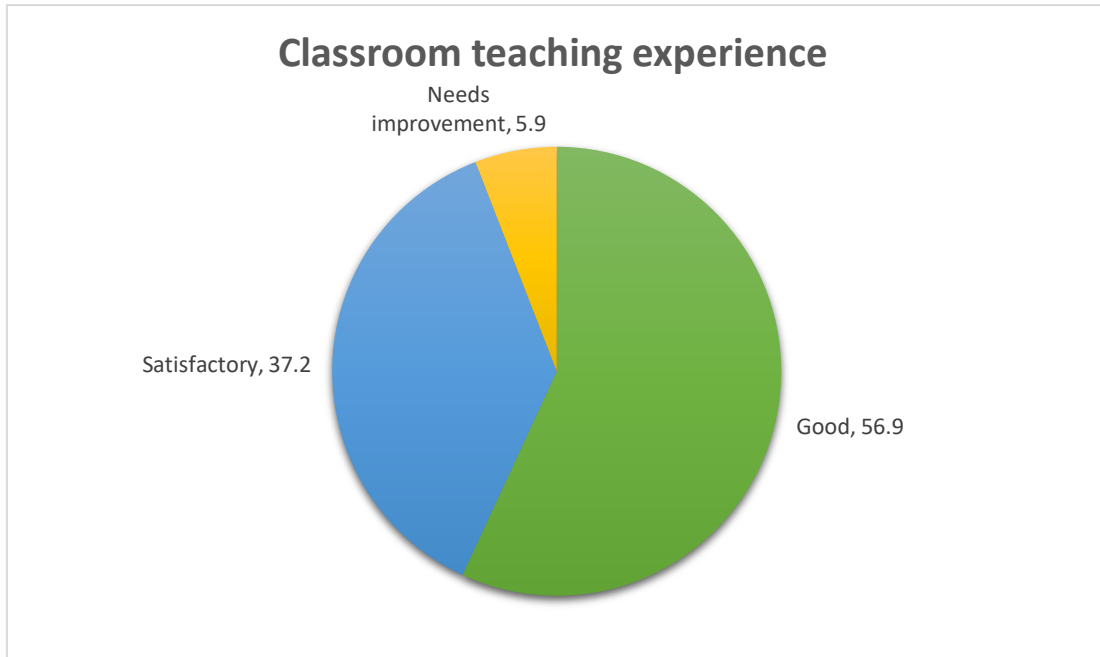

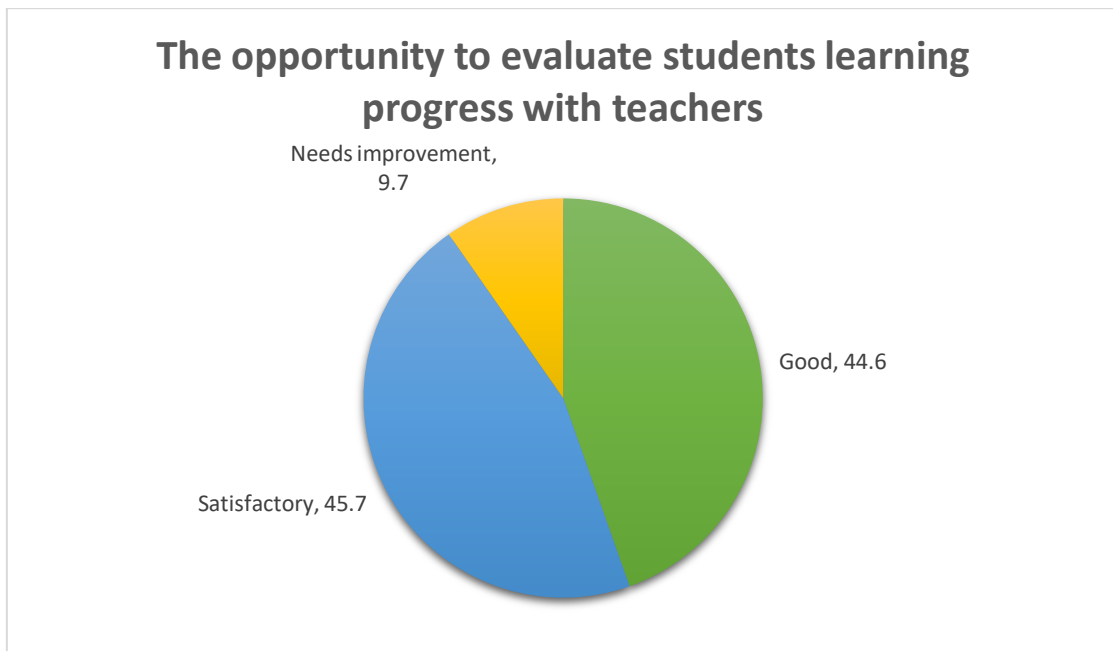
The pie chart shows the reason for selecting the college. The main reason is a better academic atmosphere.



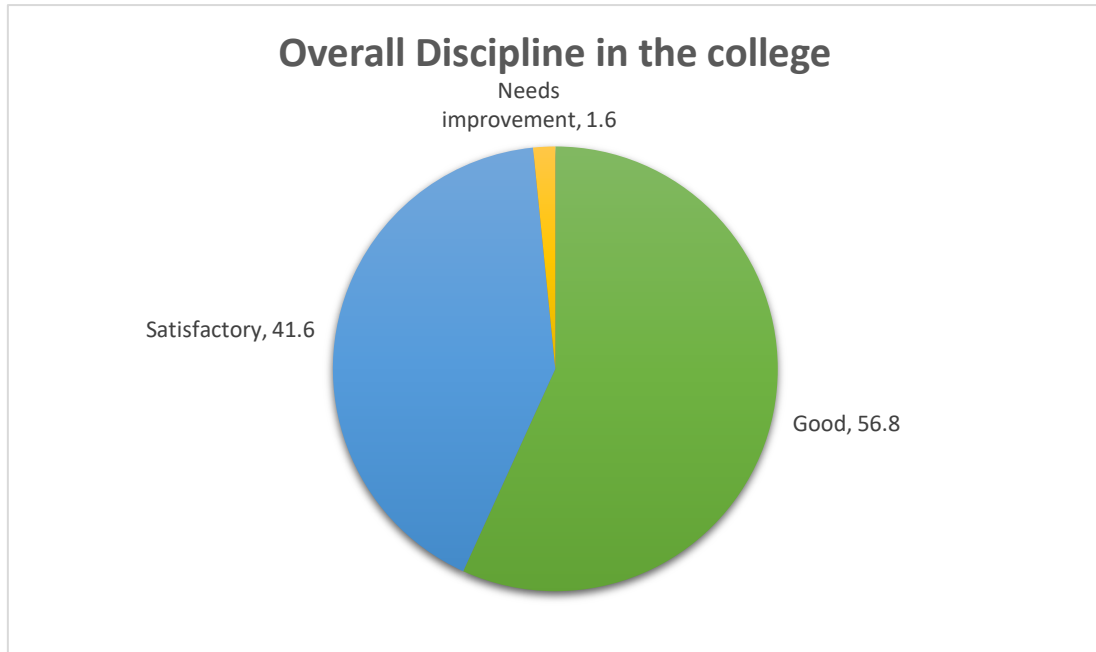
The pie chart indicates the rating of the activities of the Parent-Teacher Association. Most of the respondents find the PTA activities to be good.



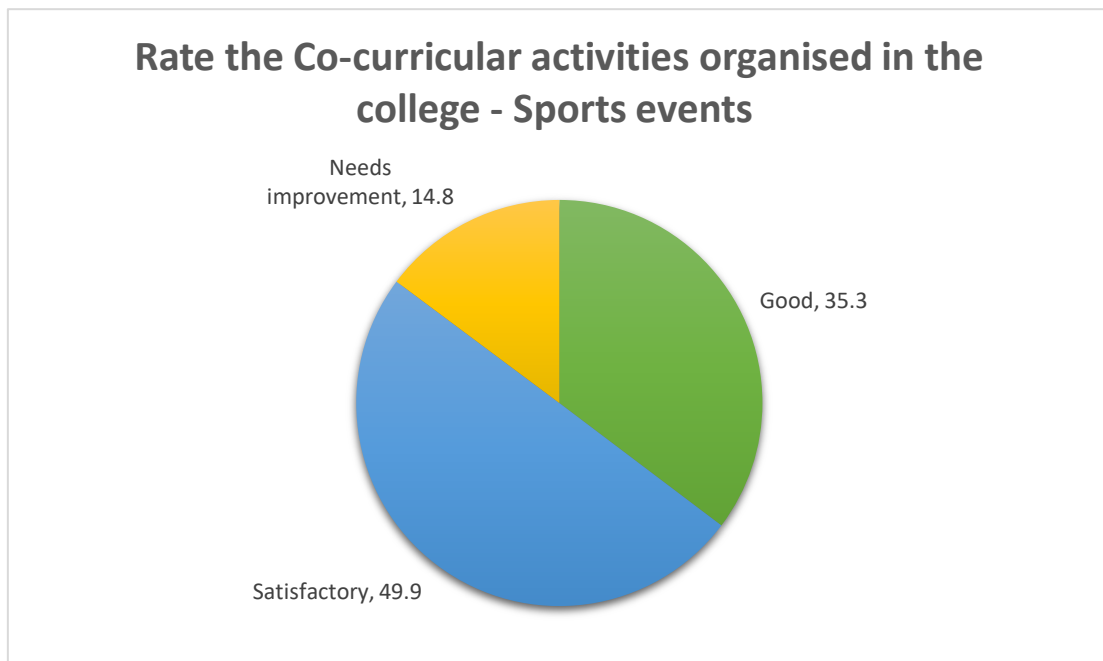
This pie chart outlines the perceptions of the classroom teaching experience. The majority considers the classroom teaching experience to be good.



This pie chart illustrates opinions of parents on the opportunity to evaluate students' learning progress with teachers. Most of the respondents perceive it as satisfactory.



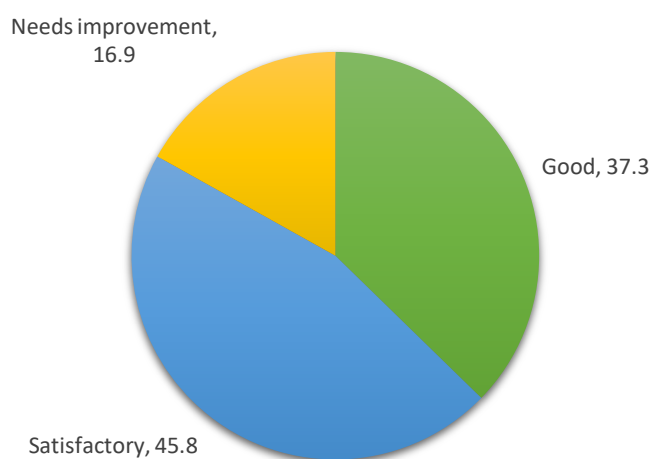
The pie chart depicts perceptions of the overall discipline in the college. The majority perceives the discipline as good.



The pie chart illustrates ratings for the co-curricular activities, specifically sports events, organized in the college. Most of the respondents finds them satisfactory.

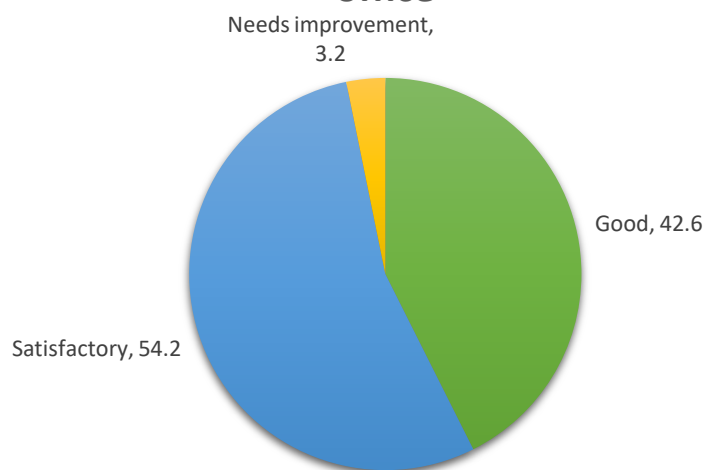


Rate the Co-curricular activities organised in the college - Arts and cultural events

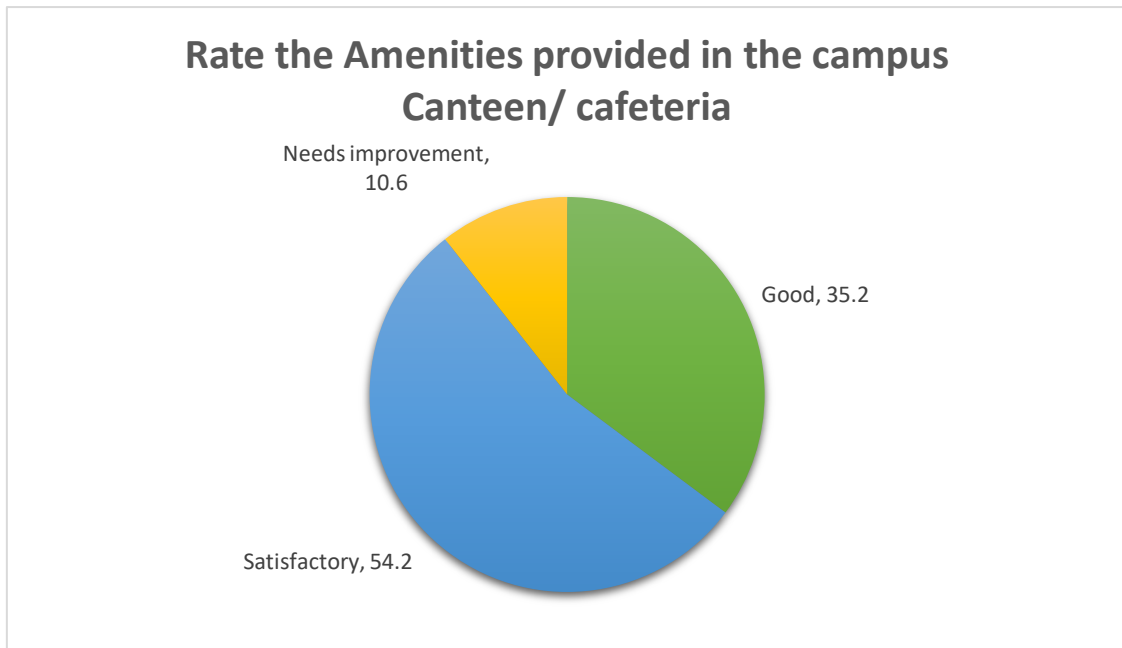


The pie chart demonstrates ratings for the co-curricular activities, particularly arts and cultural events, organized in the college. Most of the respondents find them satisfactory.

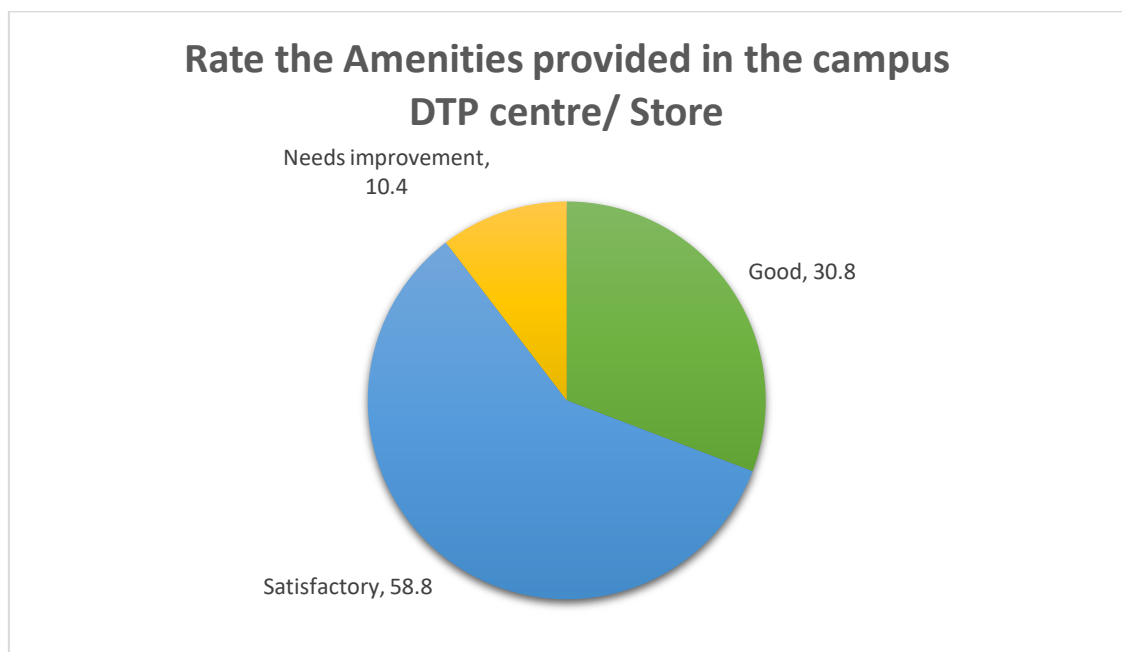

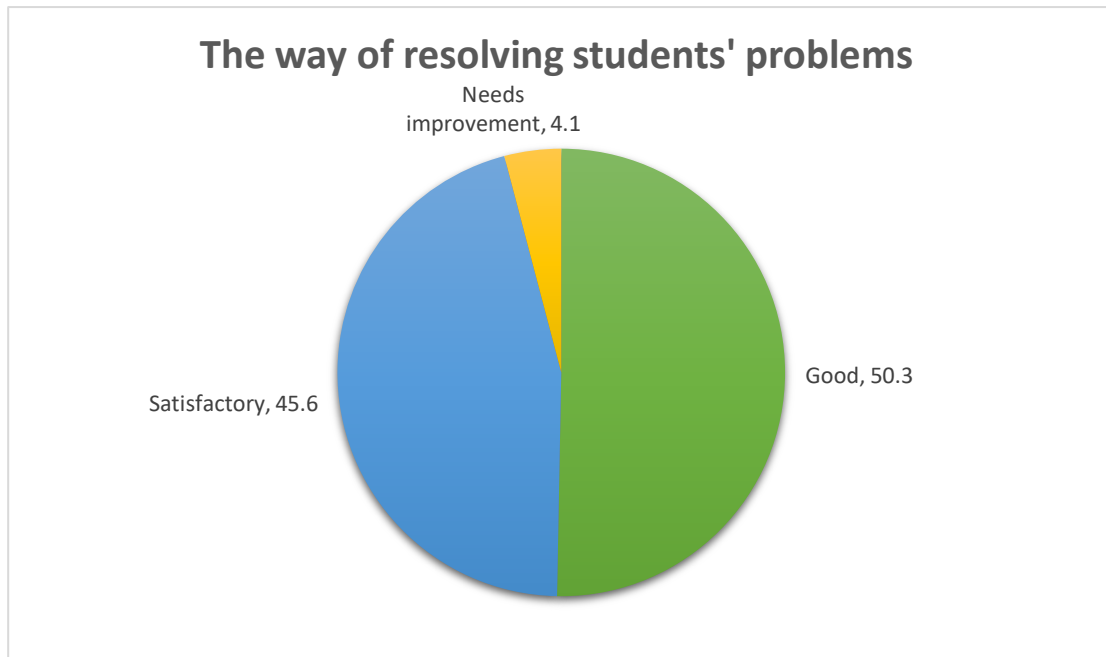
The pie chart outlines feedback regarding the services offered by the college office. Majority finds these services satisfactory.



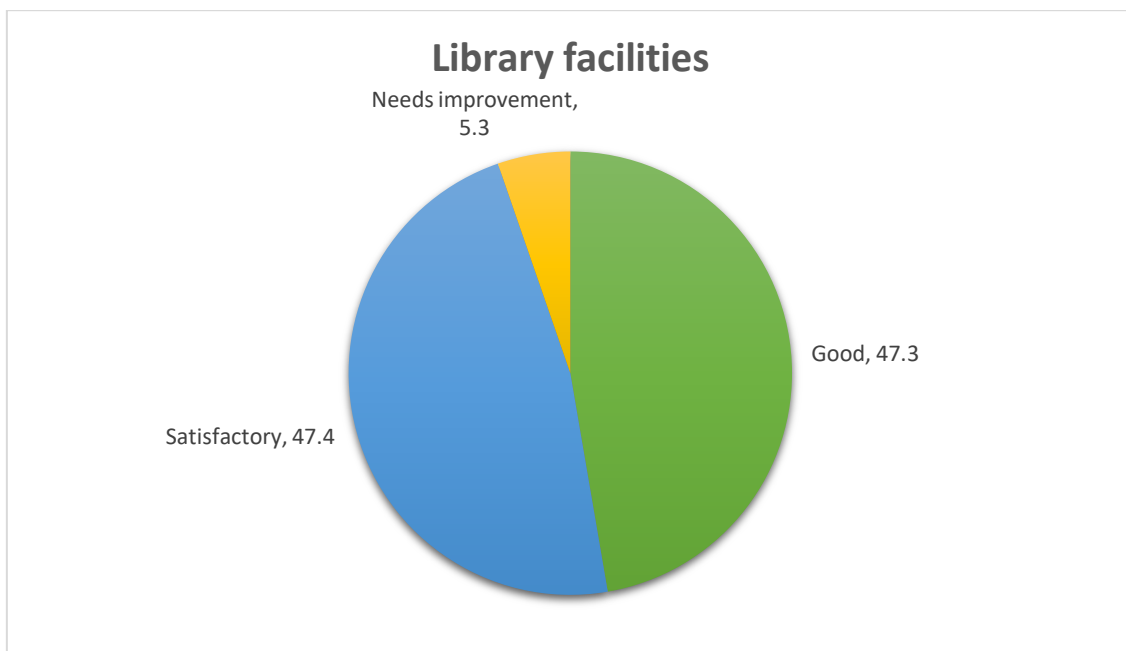
The pie chart illustrates ratings for the amenities provided in the campus, specifically focusing on the canteen or cafeteria. Most of the respondents finds them satisfactory.



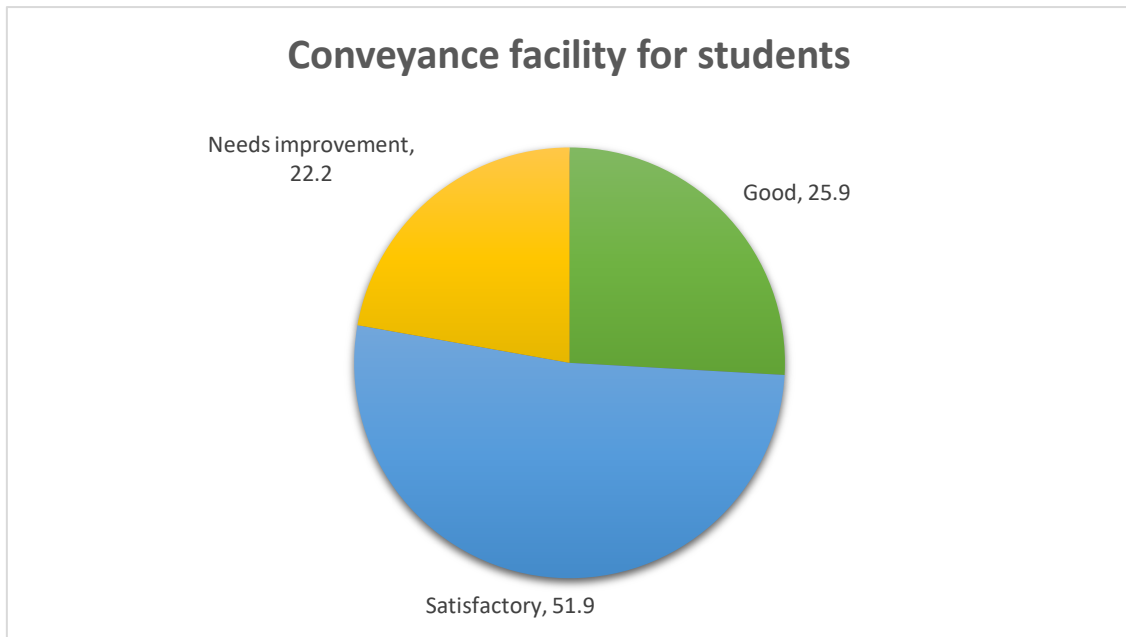
The pie chart illustrates ratings for the amenities provided in the campus, specifically the DTP center or store. Most of the respondents finds them satisfactory.



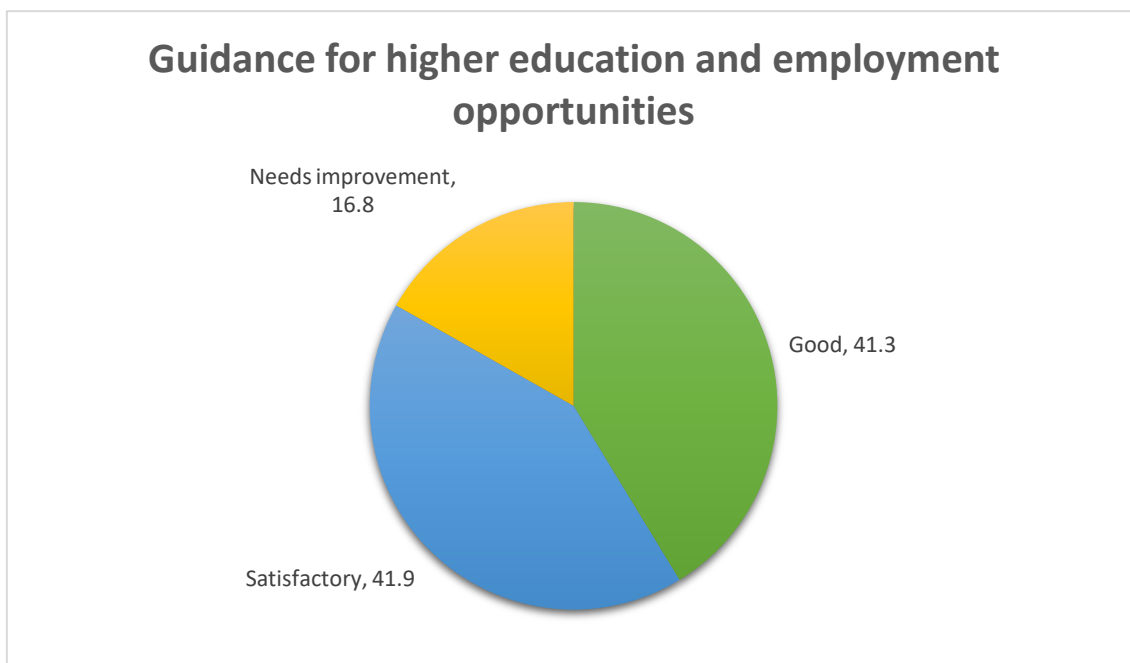
The pie chart outlines perceptions regarding the way student problems are resolved. Most of the respondents views the resolution process as good.



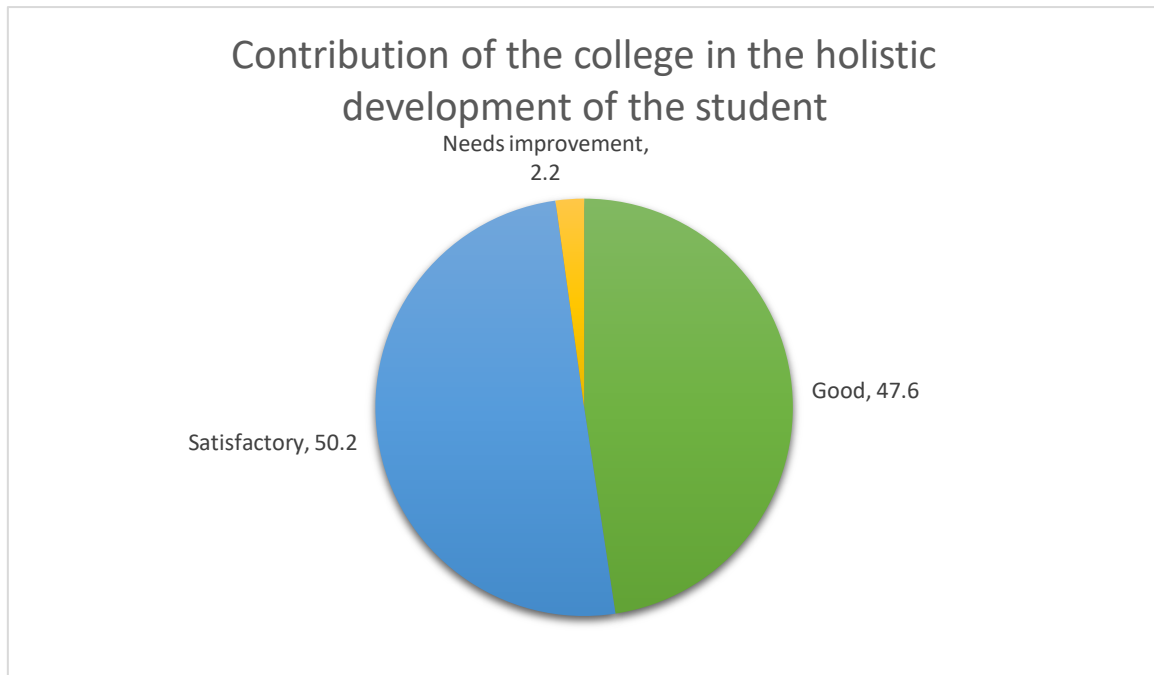
The pie chart represents perceptions of library facilities. Most of the respondents consider the library facilities as satisfactory.

Student Progress Evaluation: While satisfactory, further exploration of parents' desire for more involvement in evaluating student progress might be beneficial.

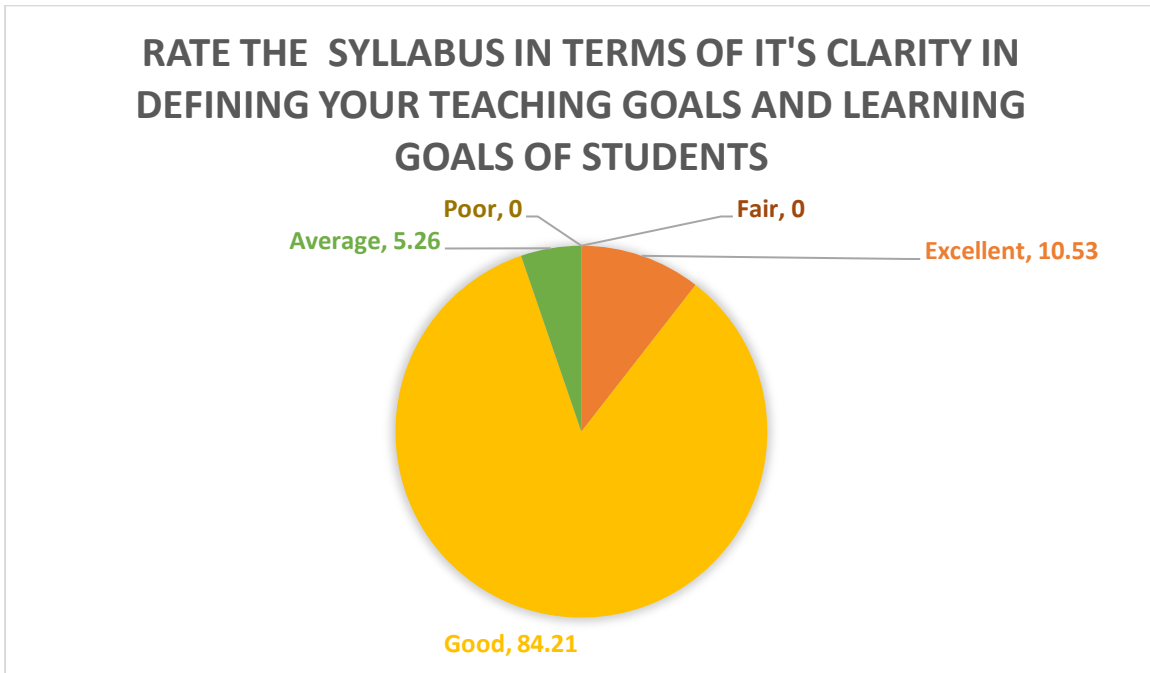
Conveyance: With only half finding it satisfactory, investigating and addressing concerns about the transportation system could be helpful.

Overall: Parents seem generally satisfied with the college, with most aspects receiving "good" or "satisfactory" ratings.

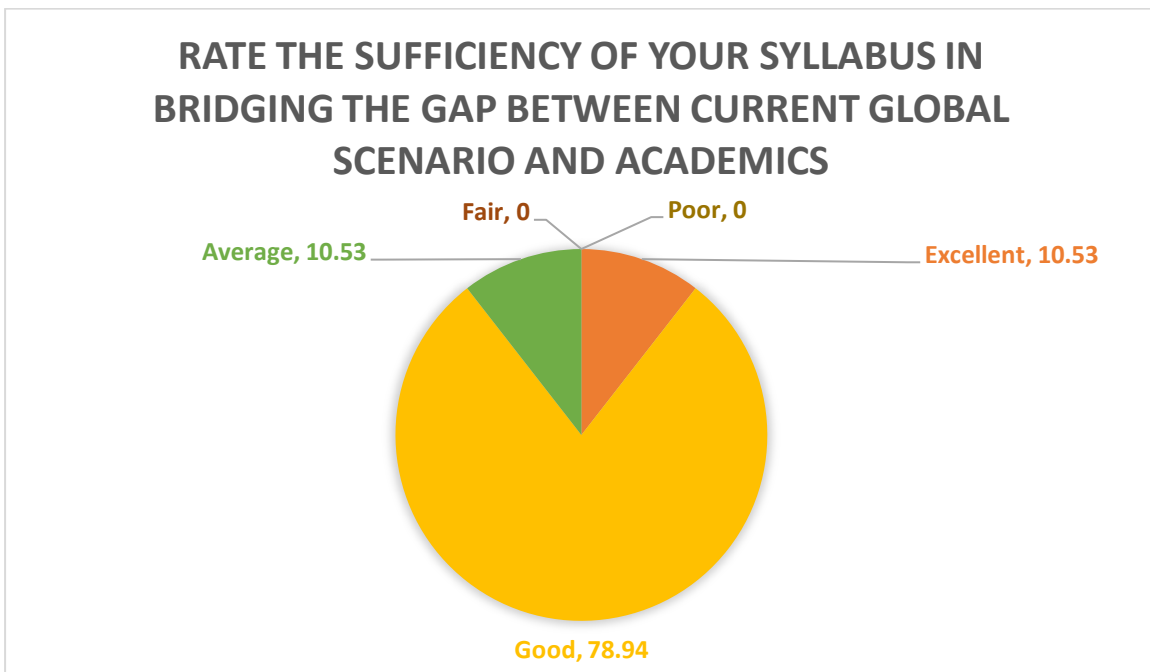



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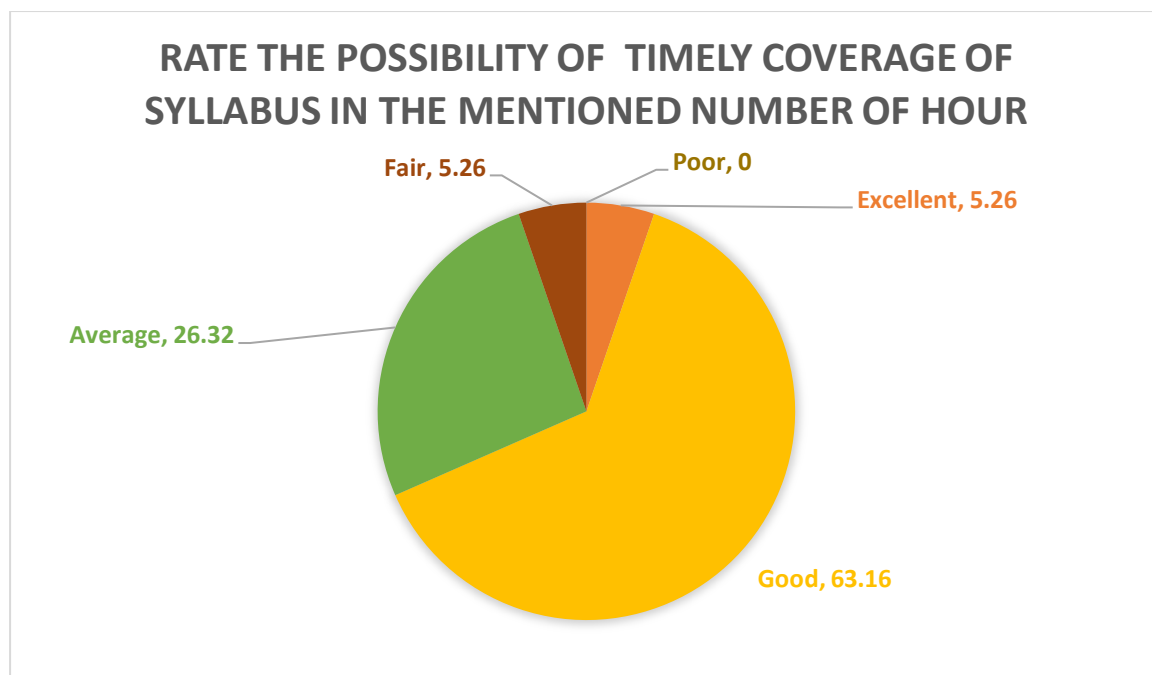

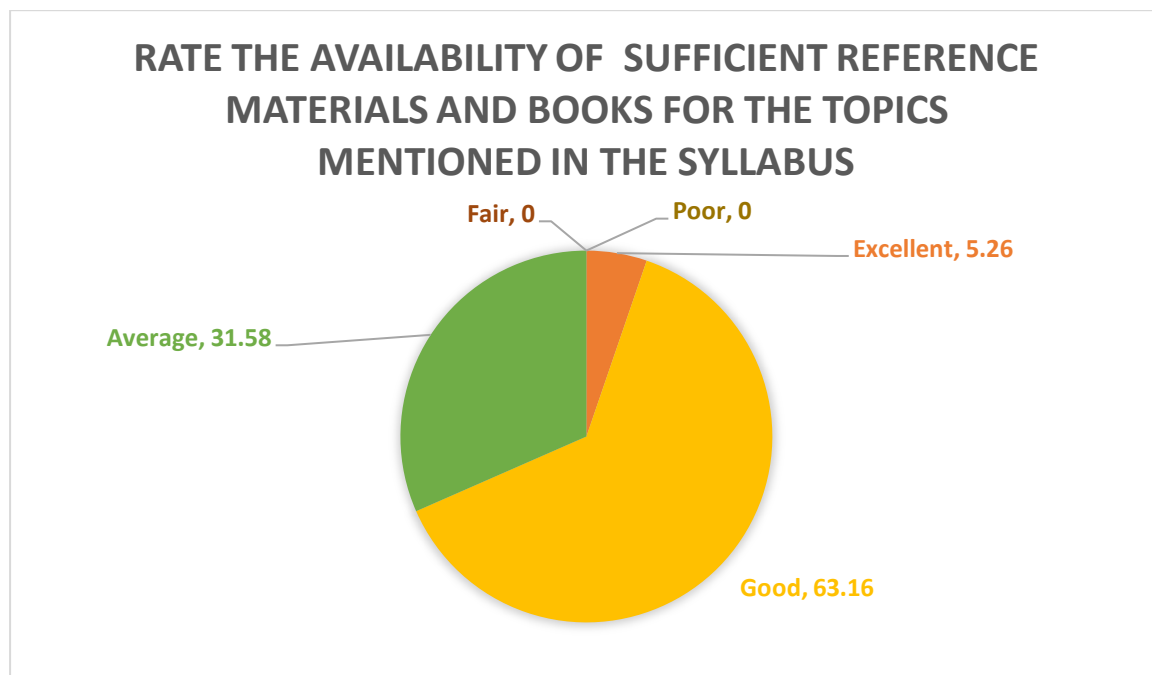

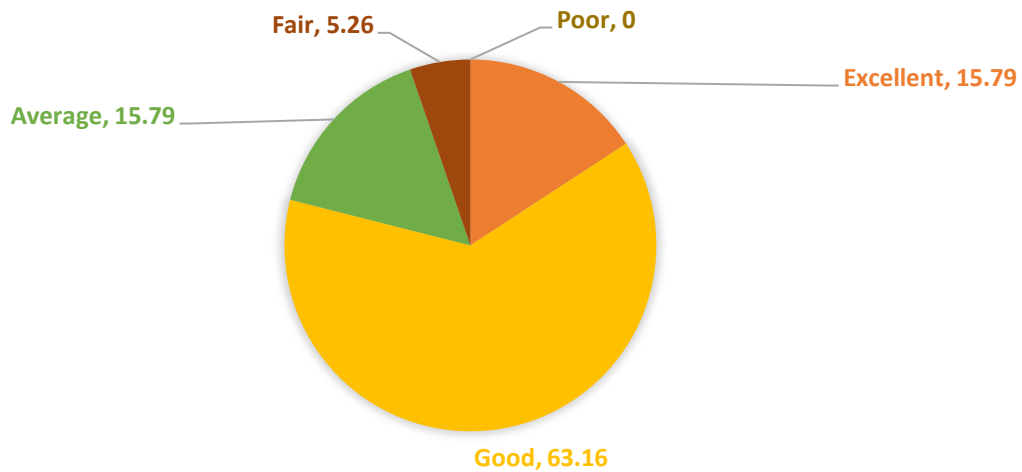


The pie chart represents ratings for the possibility of timely coverage of the syllabus within the specified number of hours. Most of the respondents considers it to be good.



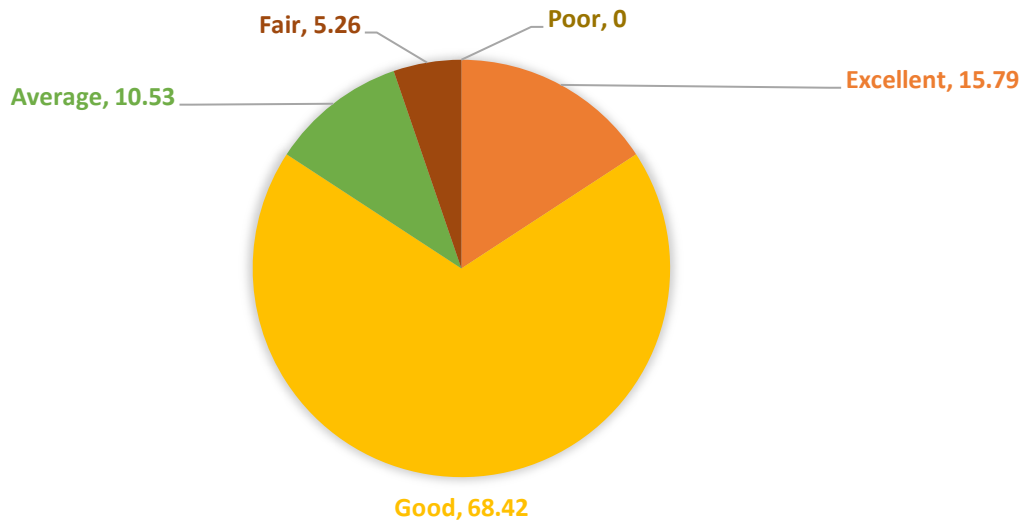
The pie chart displays ratings for the availability of sufficient reference materials and books for the topics mentioned in the syllabus. A majority, perceives the availability as good.

Relevance to the current world: Most respondents consider the syllabus effectively bridges the gap between academics and the global scenario.


Timely coverage: Most teachers believe the syllabus can be covered within the allocated time.

Applicability to real-life: Over 60% view the syllabus as relevant to real-life situations.

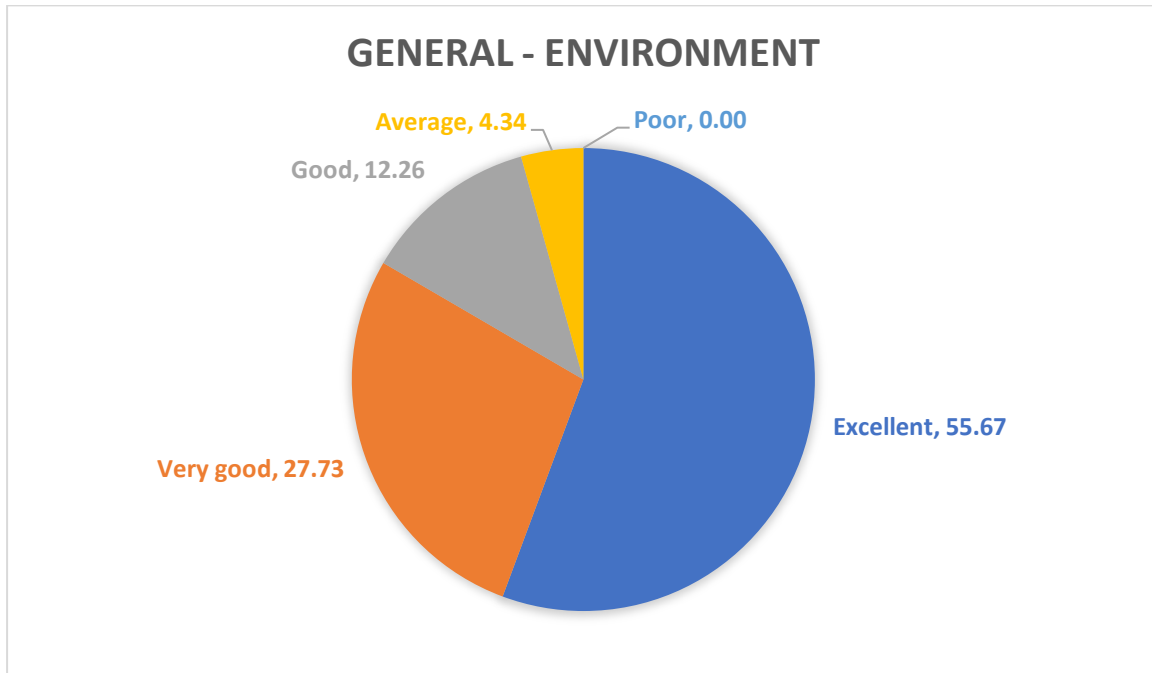

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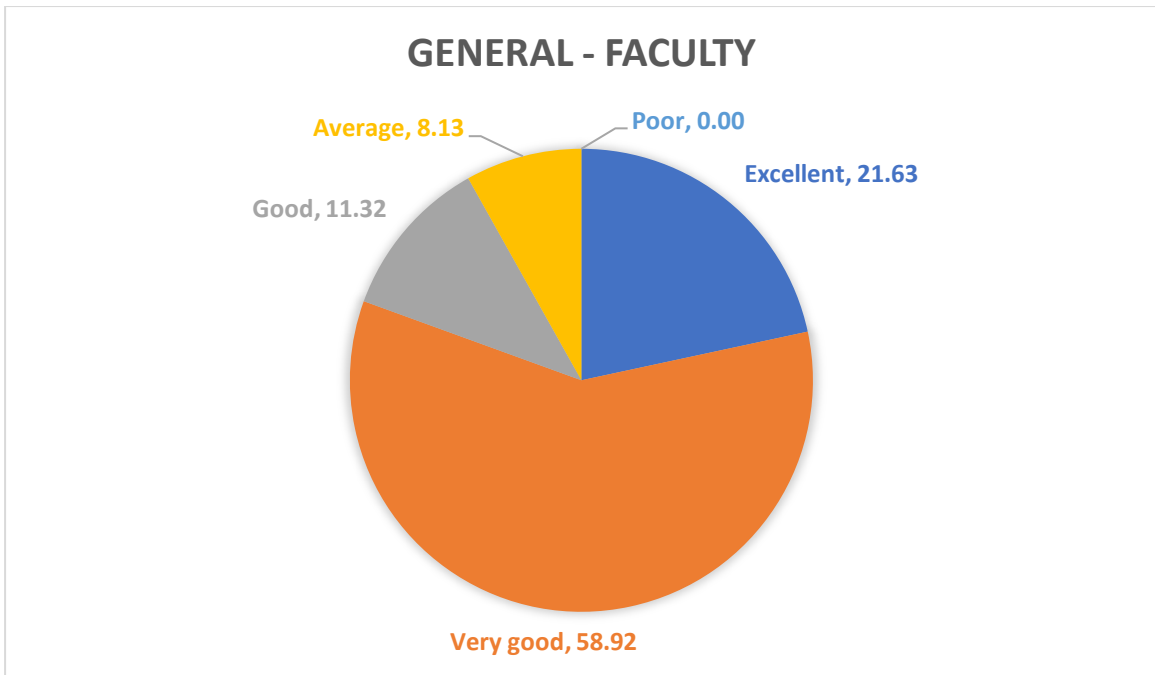

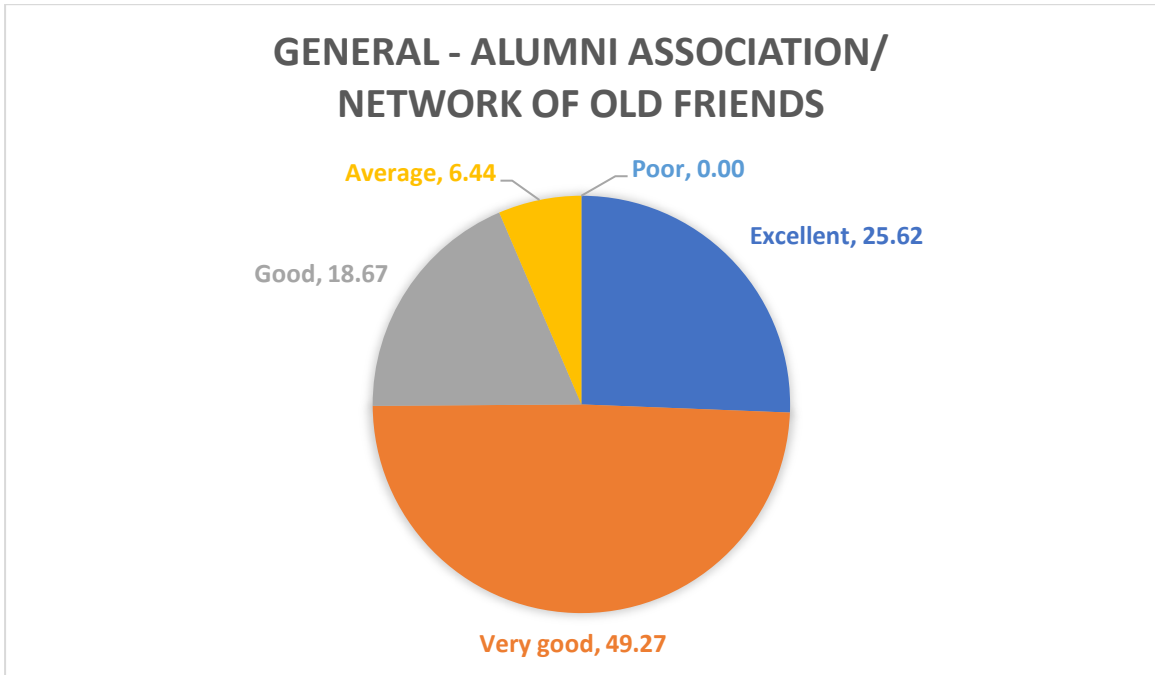
The data represents rating distribution for general environment. The majority rated it as excellent.



The data indicates ratings for the infrastructure. The largest portion, 58.92% rates it as very good.



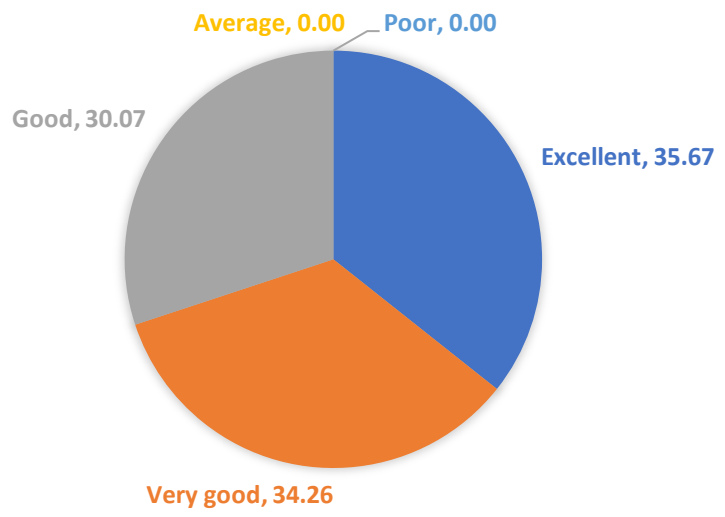
The pie chart represents ratings for the faculty. The highest percentage rates the faculty as very good.



The data depicts ratings for the alumni association or network of old friends. The majority rates it as very good.

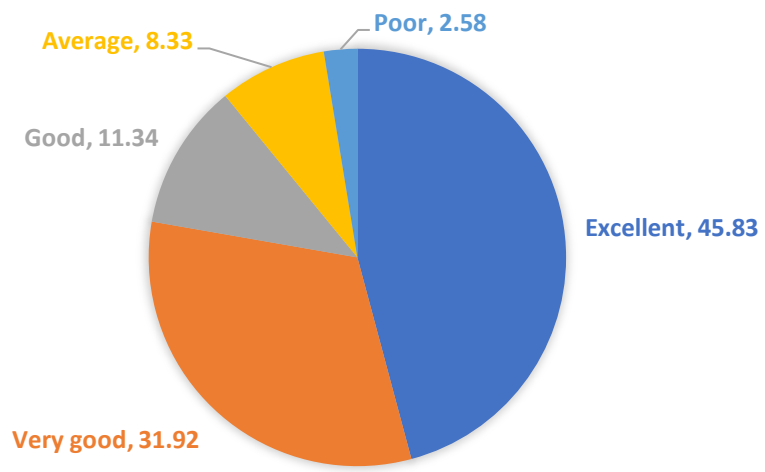


GENERAL - LEARNING EXPERIENCE IN TERMS OF THEIR RELEVANCE TO THE REAL LIFE APPLICATION



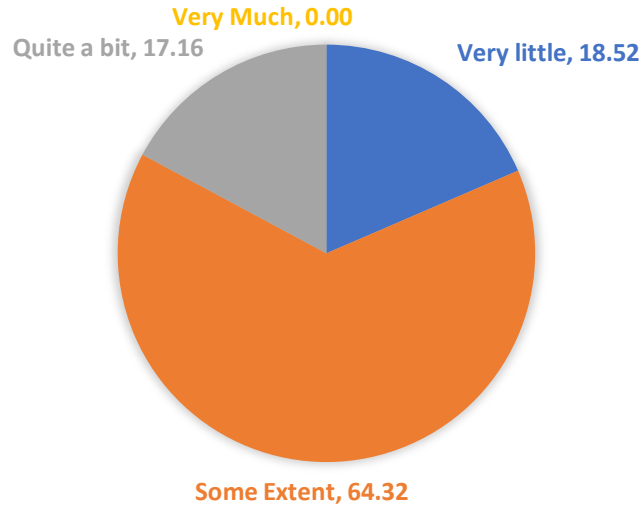
The data represents the relevance of learning experiences to real-life applications. Most of the respondents rates it as excellent.

GENERAL - THE COURSE THAT YOU HAVE LEARNT IN RELATION TO YOUR CURRENT JOB



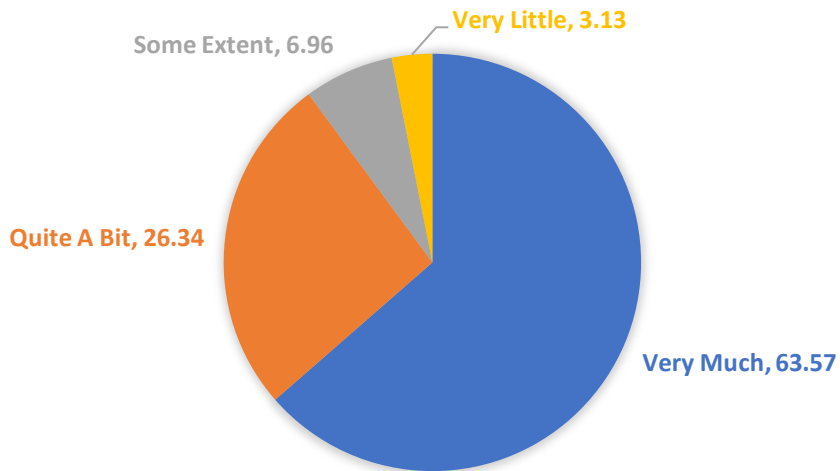
The data represents how well the courses learned relate to current job. Most of the respondents rated it as excellent.

The pie chart indicates the perception of the development activities organized by the college for overall development. Most of the respondents rated it as good to some extent.

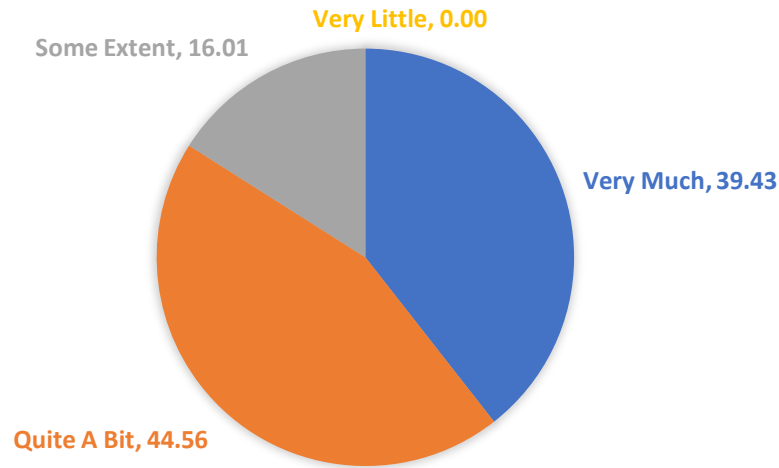
YOUR GRIEVANCES PROPERLY HANDLED AT THE COLLEGE - AS A STUDENT



The data represents the handling of grievances as a student at the college. Most of the respondents feel that their grievances were handled very much by the college.

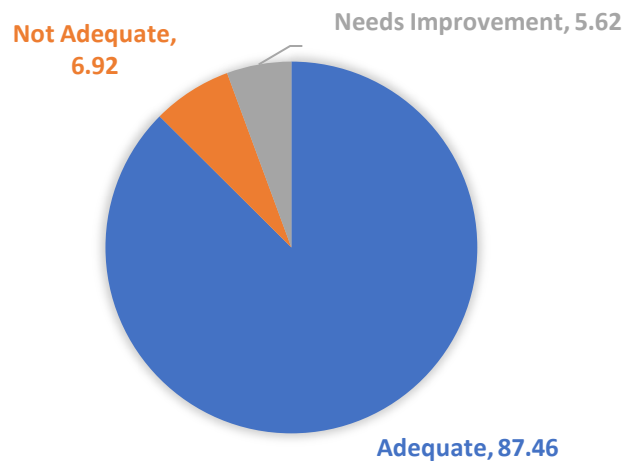


YOUR GRIEVANCES PROPERLY HANDLED AT THE COLLEGE - AS AN ALUMNI



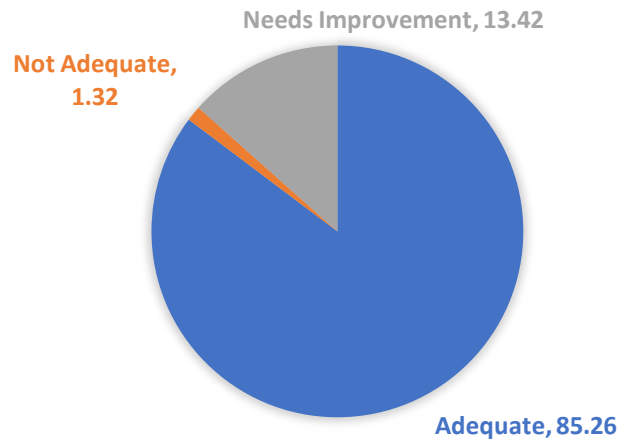
The pie chart reflects the perception of grievance handling by the college from the perspective of an alumni. A significant portion perceives their grievances were handled quite a bit.

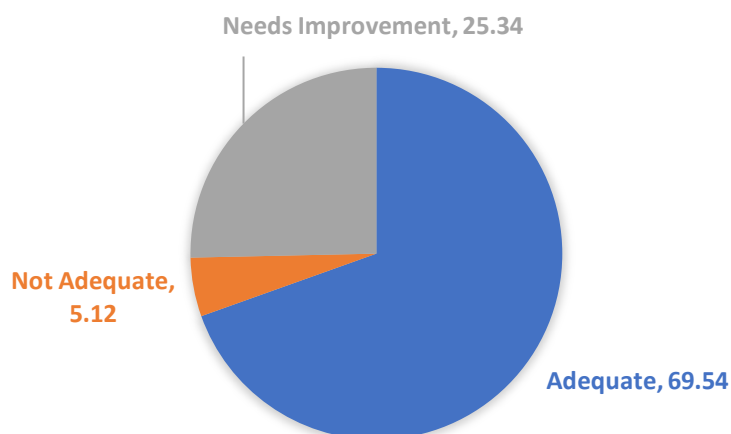
The data represents the perception of the adequacy of laboratories and equipment during the respondent's tenure as a student. The majority perceives the laboratories and equipment as adequate.

The data reflects the perception of the adequacy of the library, seminar hall, and reading room during the respondent's tenure as a student. The majority perceives these facilities as adequate.

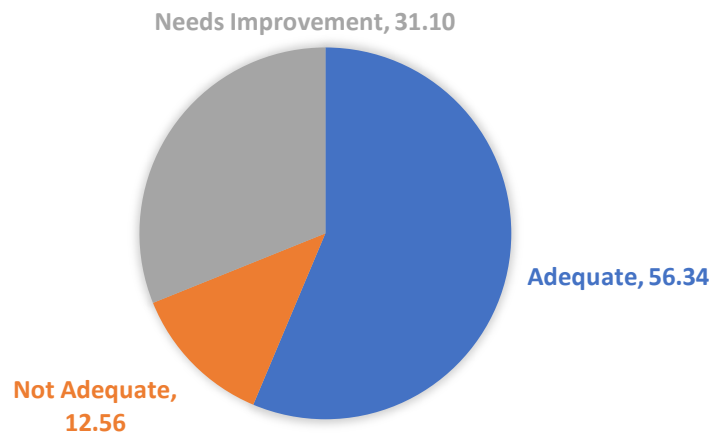
ADEQUACY OF THE FOLLOWING AS THEY WERE DURING YOUR TENURE AS A STUDENT - COMPUTER FACILITIES



The pie chart represents the perception of the adequacy of computer facilities during the respondent's tenure as a student. The majority perceives the computer facilities as adequate.

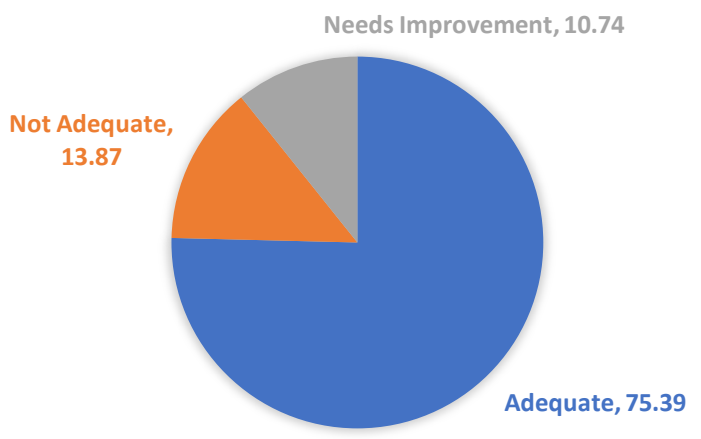


ADEQUACY OF THE FOLLOWING AS THEY WERE DURING YOUR TENURE AS A STUDENT - INTERNET & WI-FI

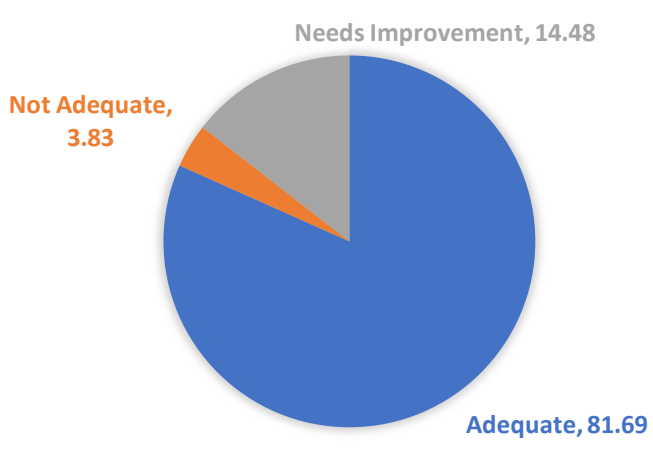

The pie chart represents the perception of the adequacy of sports and cultural facilities during the respondent's tenure as a student. The majority perceives these facilities as adequate.

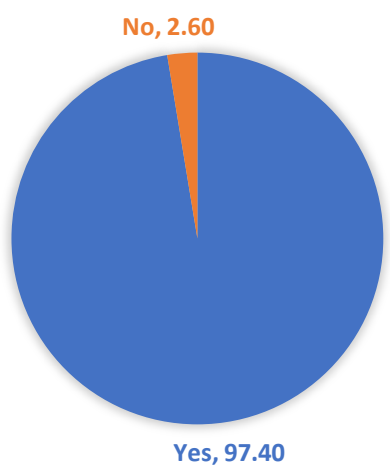


ADEQUACY OF THE FOLLOWING AS THEY WERE DURING YOUR TENURE AS A STUDENT - CLASSROOMS

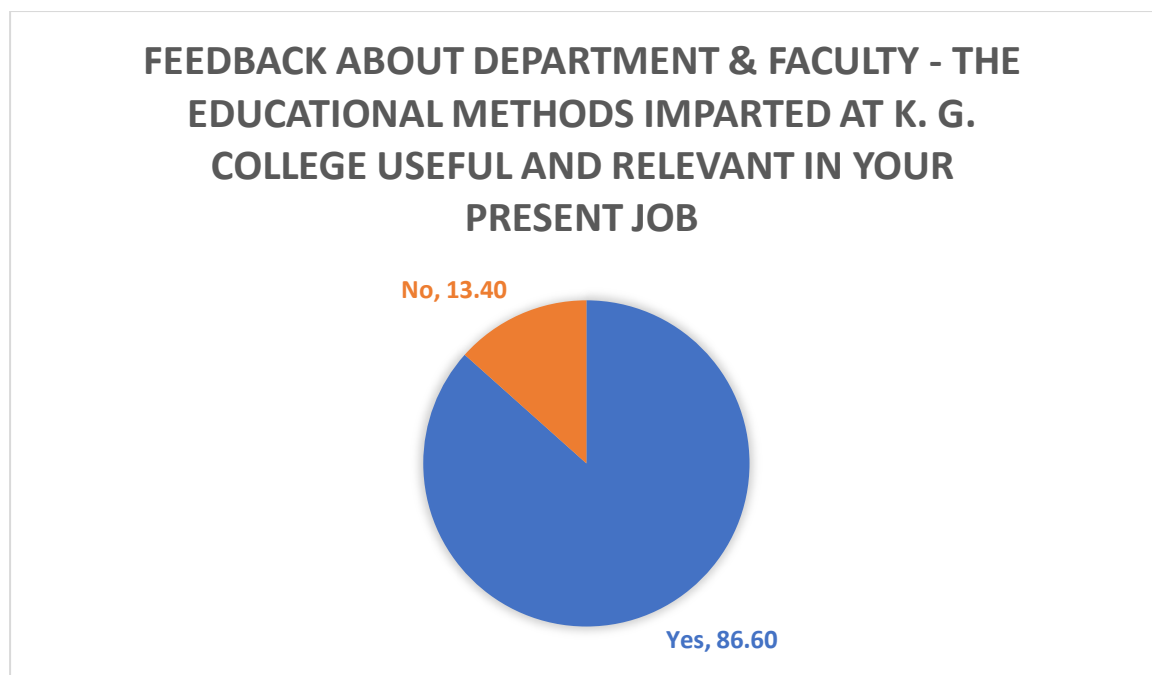


The pie chart reflects the perception of the adequacy of classrooms during the respondent's tenure as a student. The majority perceives the classrooms as adequate.

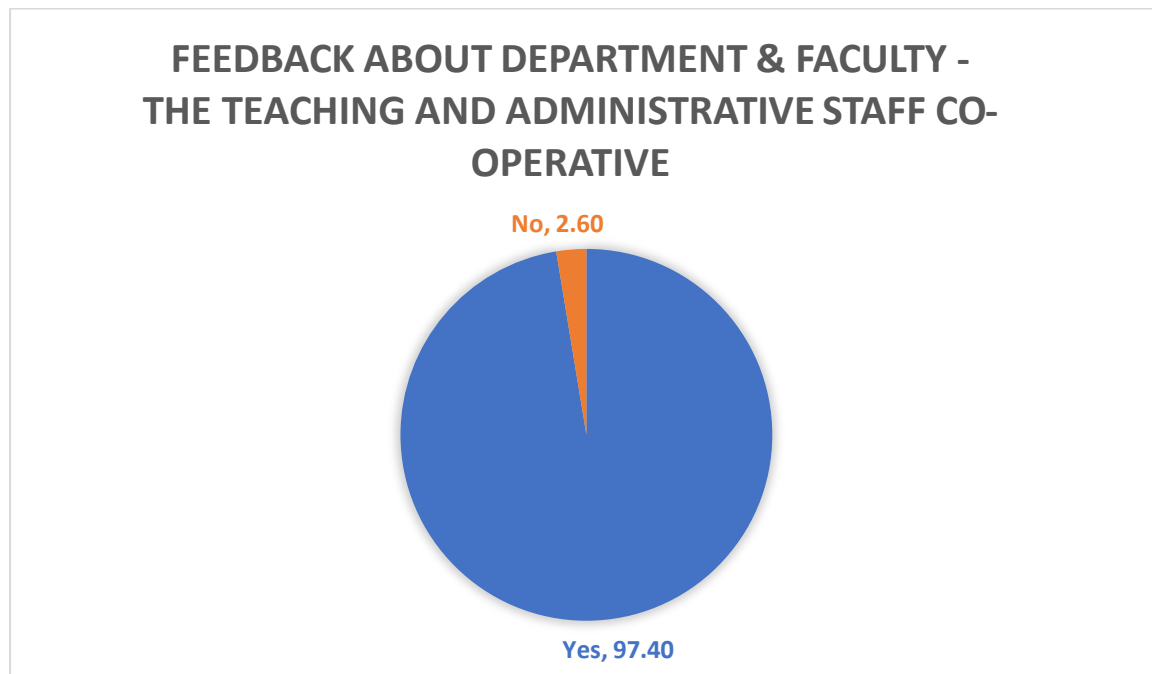

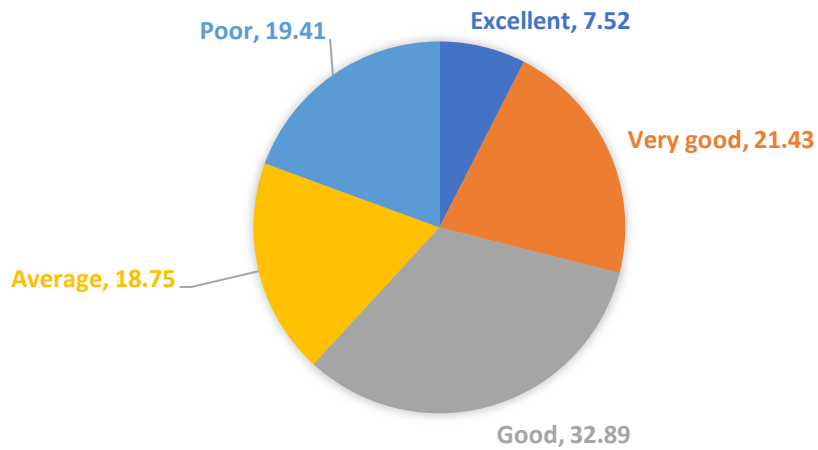

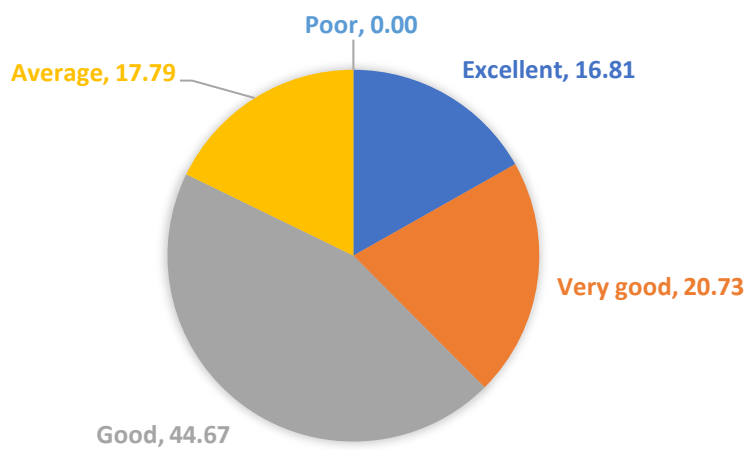

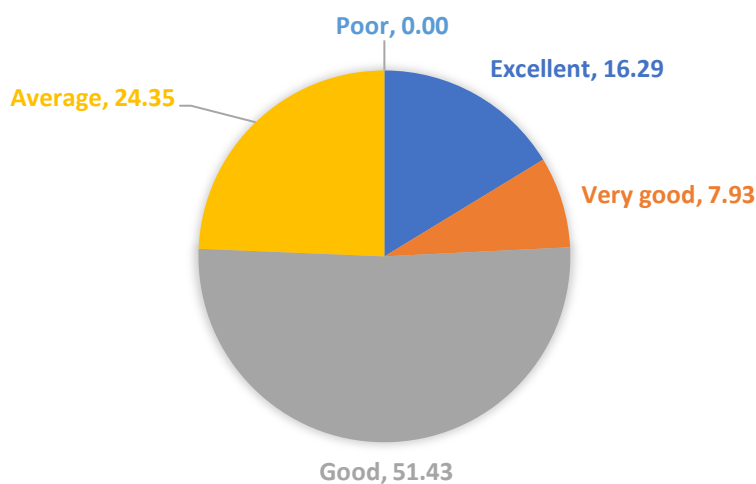

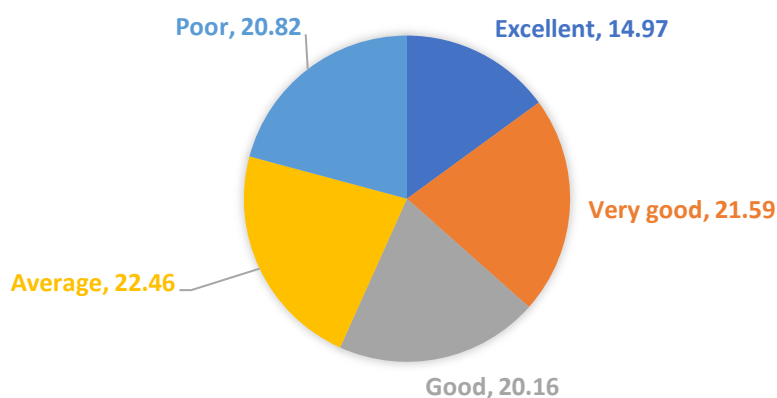

Internet & Wi-Fi: While adequate for most, improvements to internet and Wi-Fi services could be beneficial.

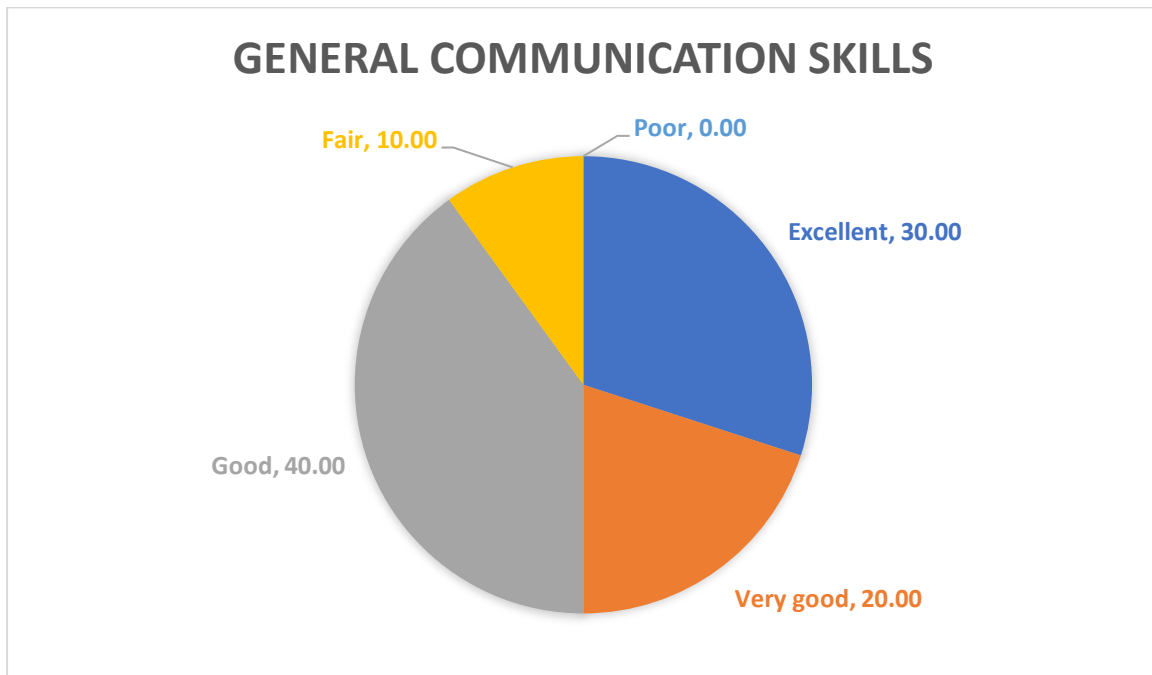
Industry-Academia Gap: While initiatives are appreciated, there's potential to further bridge the gap between industry and academia through special training classes.

Overall: Alumni seem generally satisfied with various aspects of the college, with most responses ranging from "good" to "excellent."

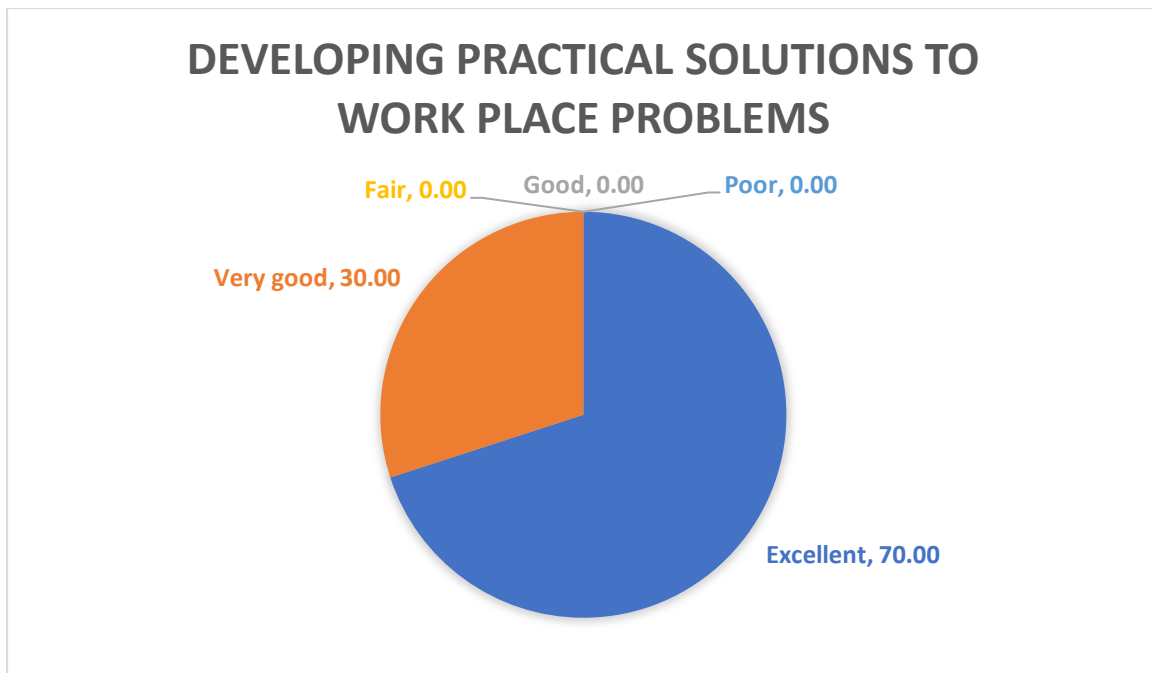

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Employer Feedback Analysis Report 2019-20



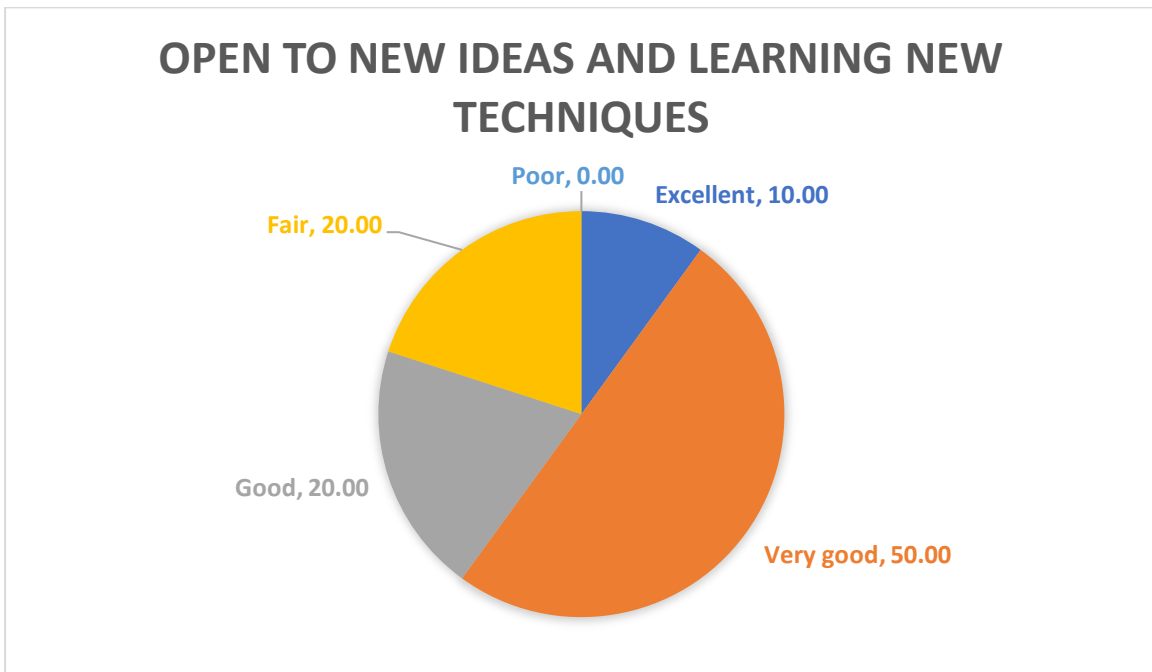

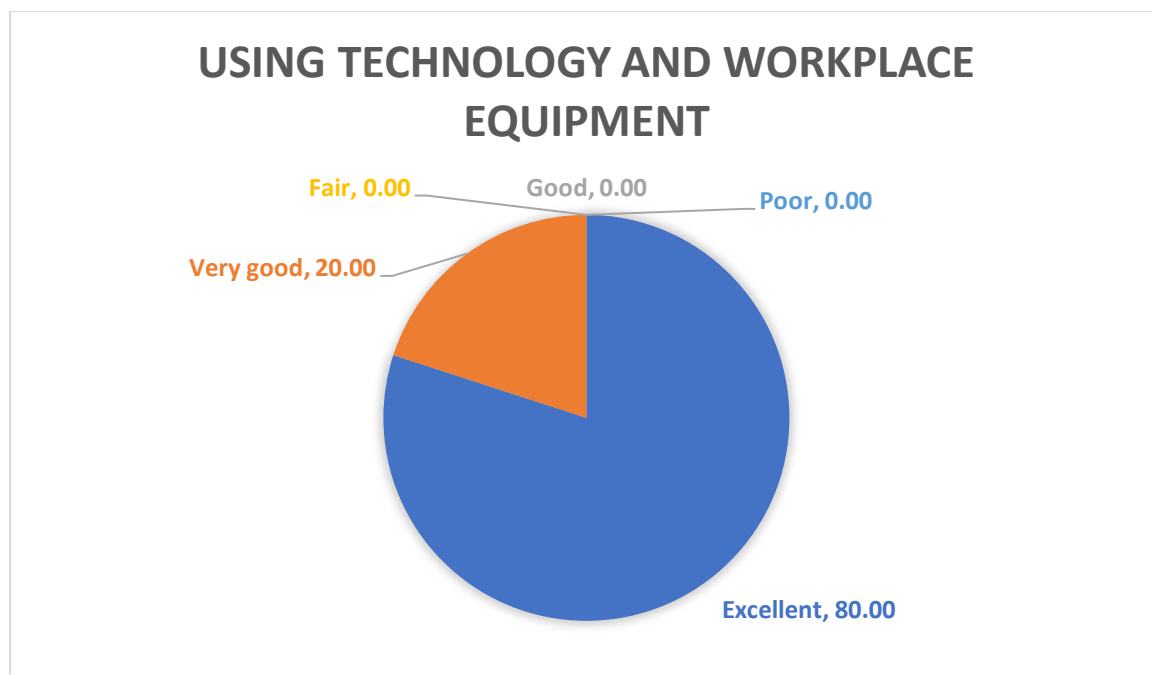
The pie chart illustrates the evaluations for “Developing practical solutions to workplace problems.” 70% of respondents rated this skill as “Excellent”.

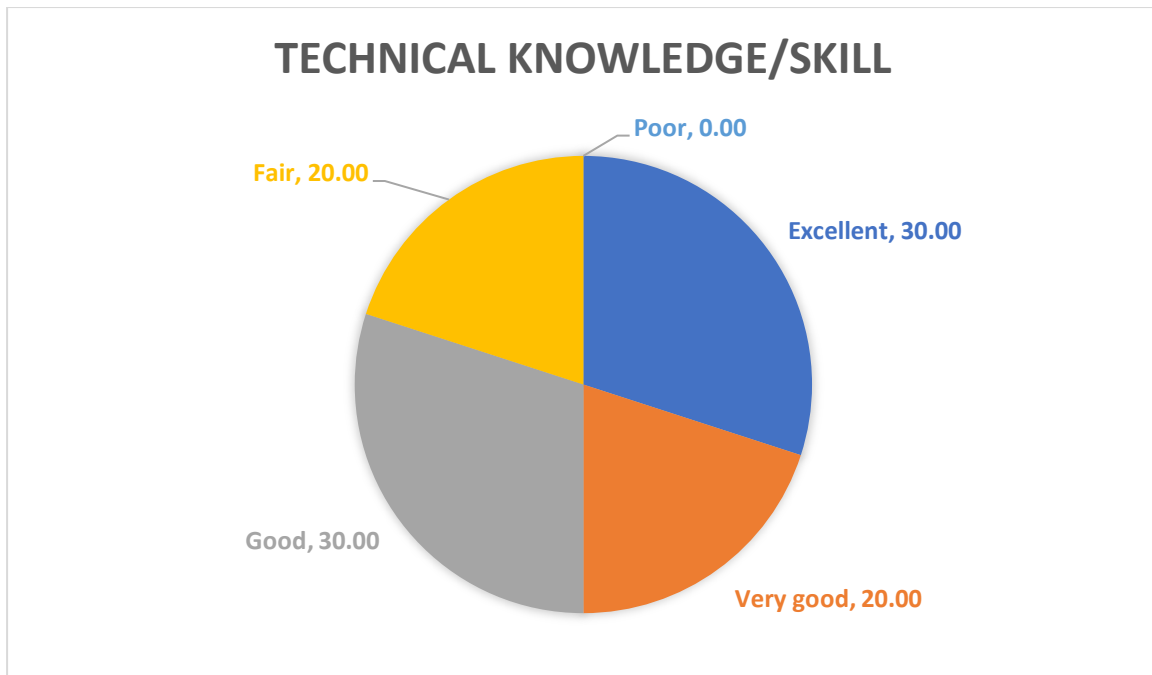

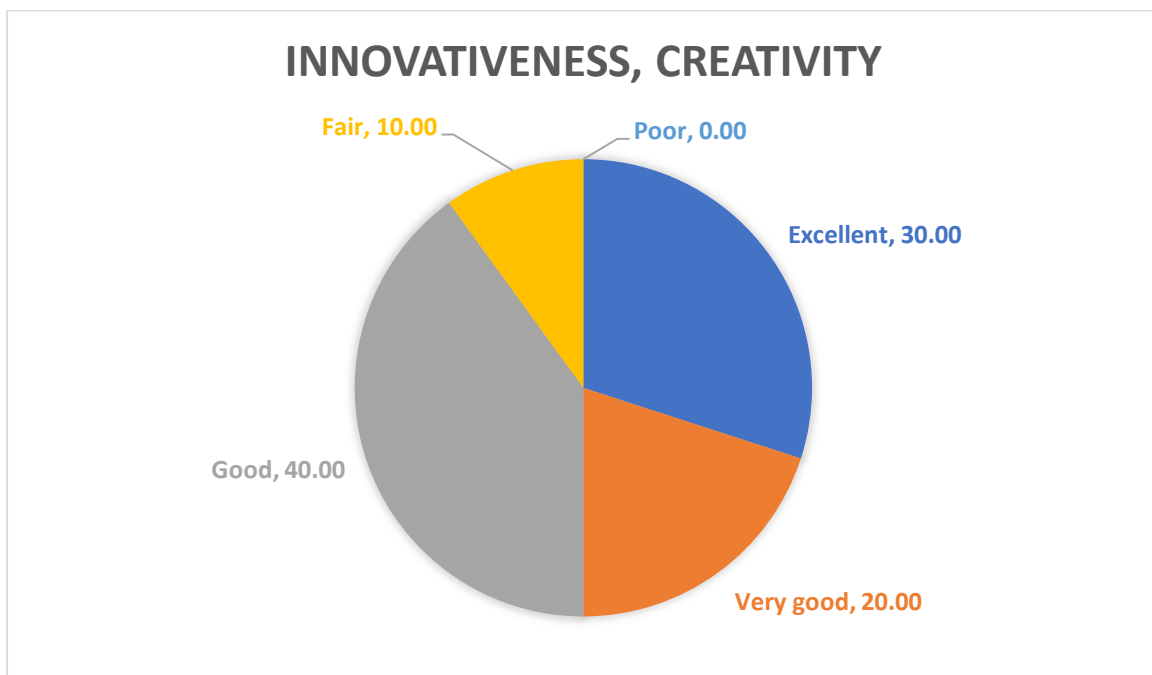

The pie chart illustrates the evaluations for ‘Ability to contribute to the goals of the organization.’ Majority acknowledges a very good level of contribution from the part of employees.

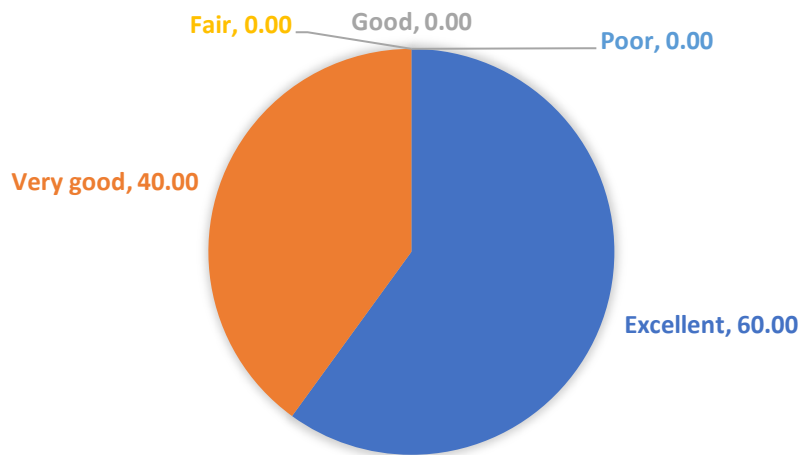

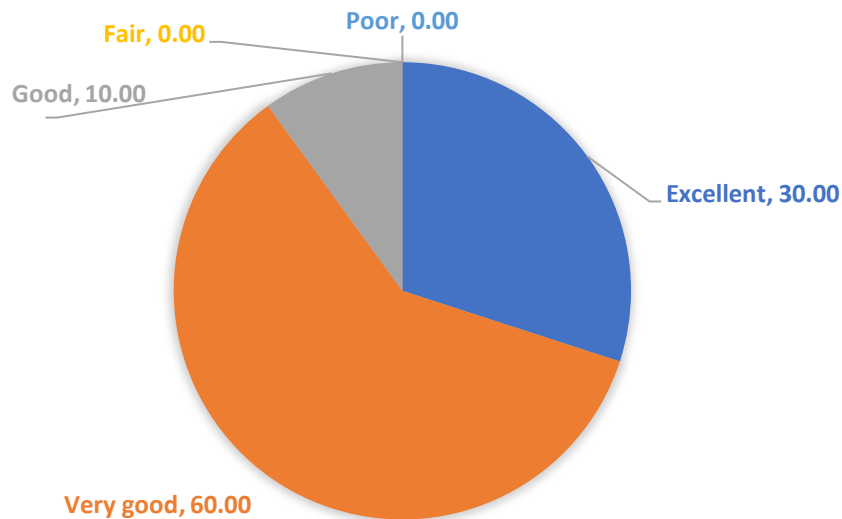
The pie chart depicts evaluations for ‘Innovativeness, creativity.’ 40% of the respondents rated this skill as “Good”.
