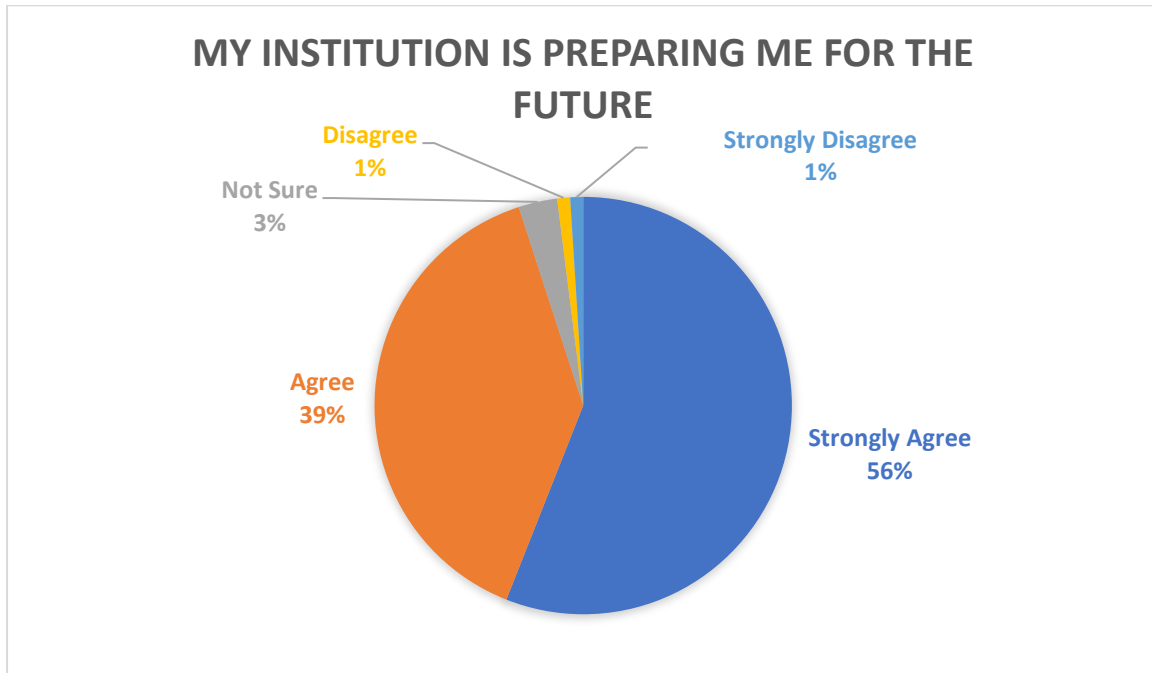

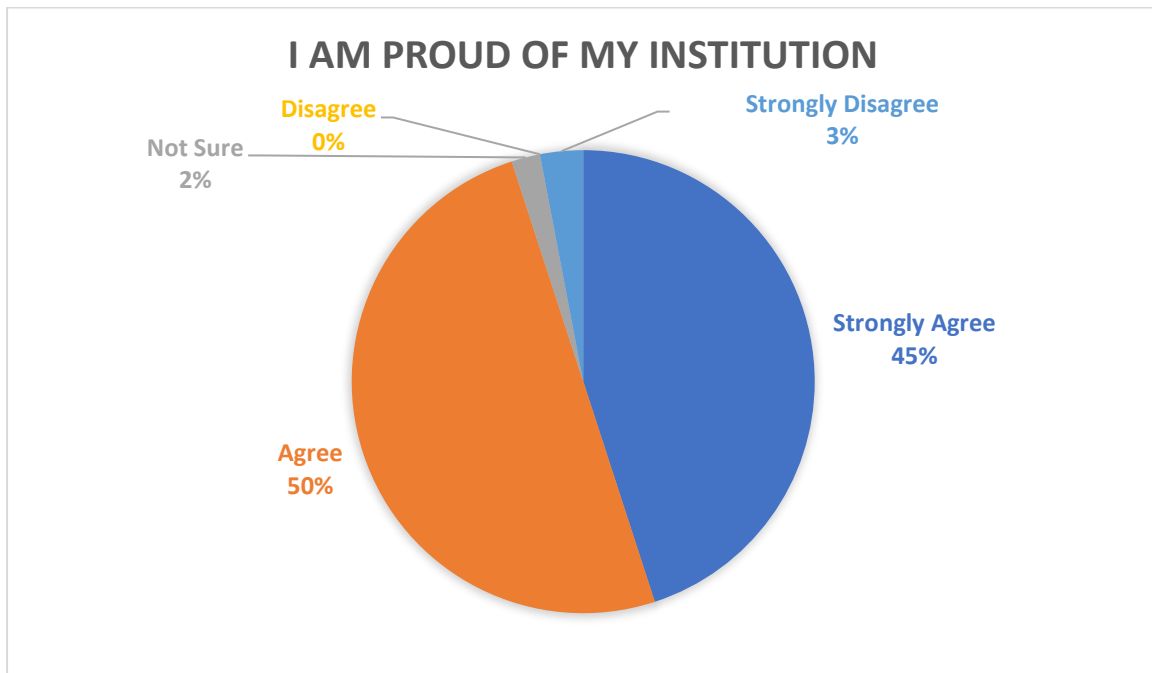

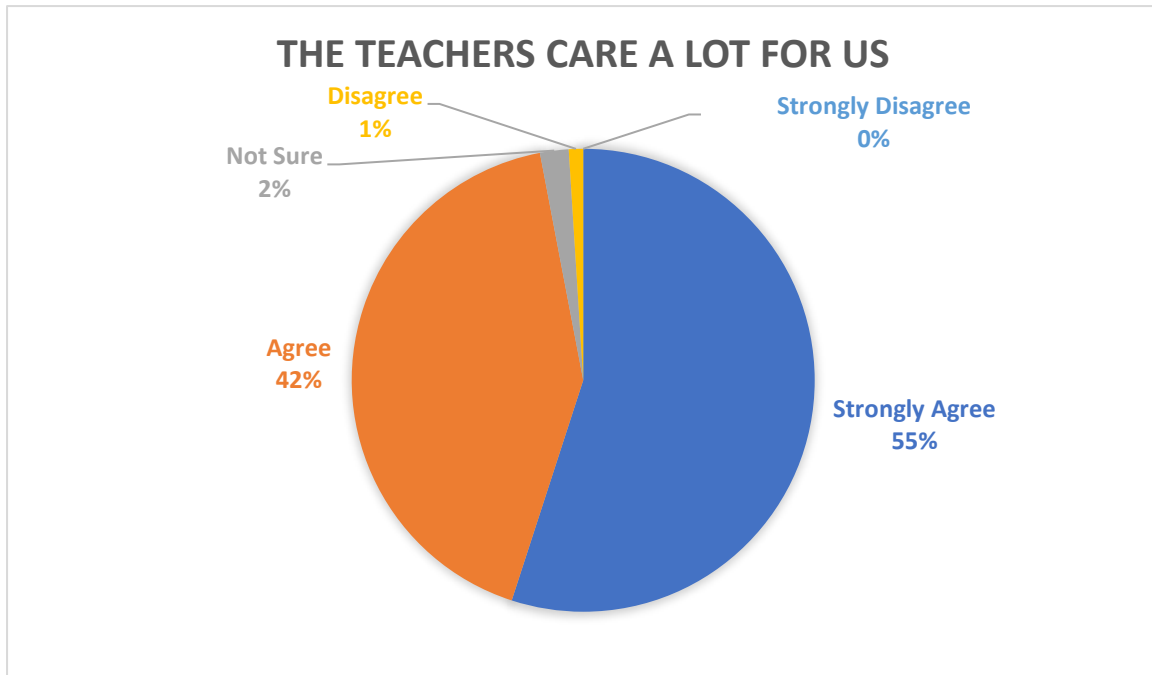
Students' Feedback Analysis Report 2020-21



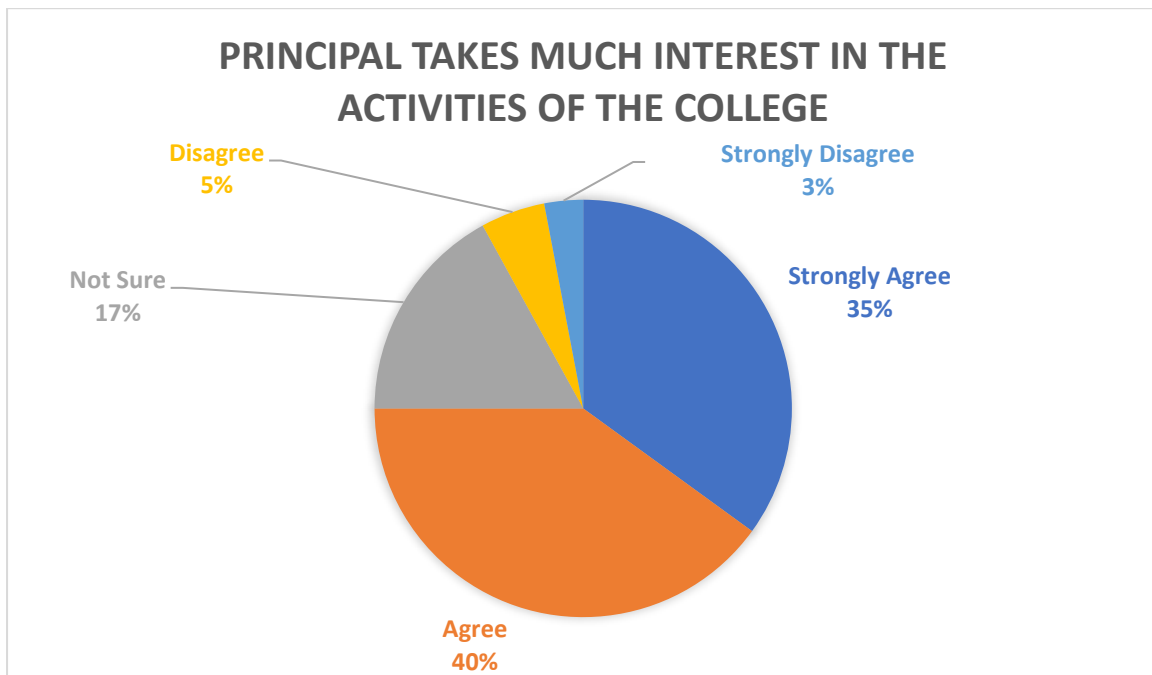
The pie chart illustrates the responses regarding how well the institution prepares students for the future. The majority strongly agree that the institution prepares its students for the future.



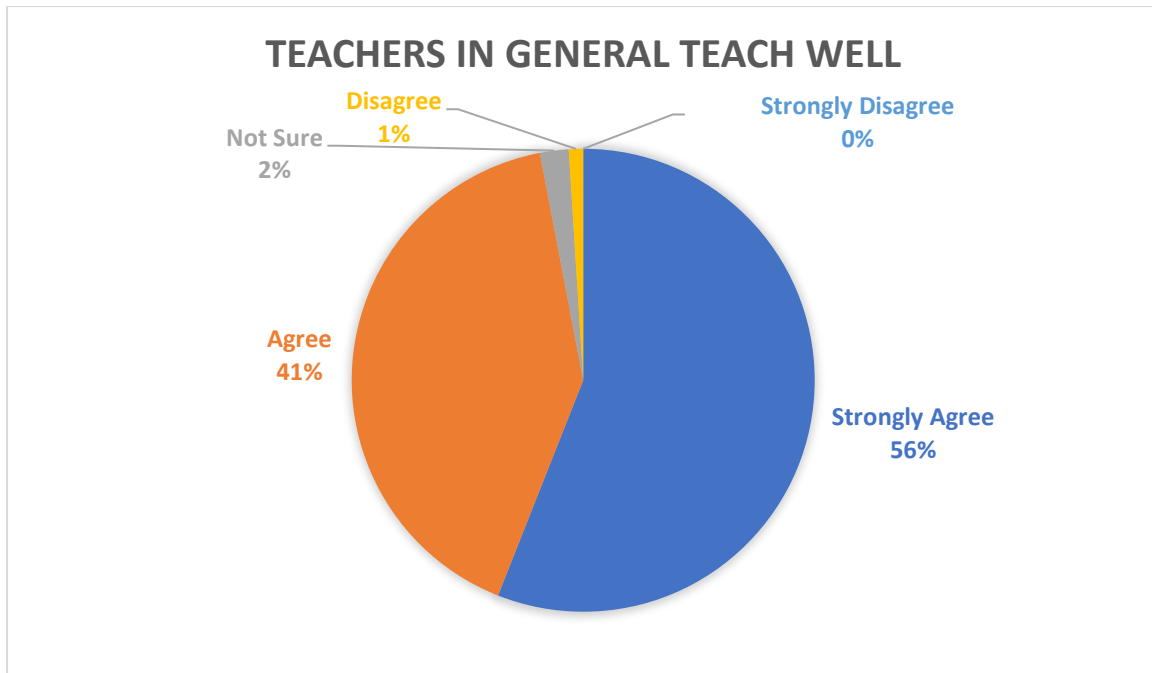
The pie chart represents the sentiments regarding pride in one's institution. A significant portion of respondents strongly agree that they are proud of their institution.



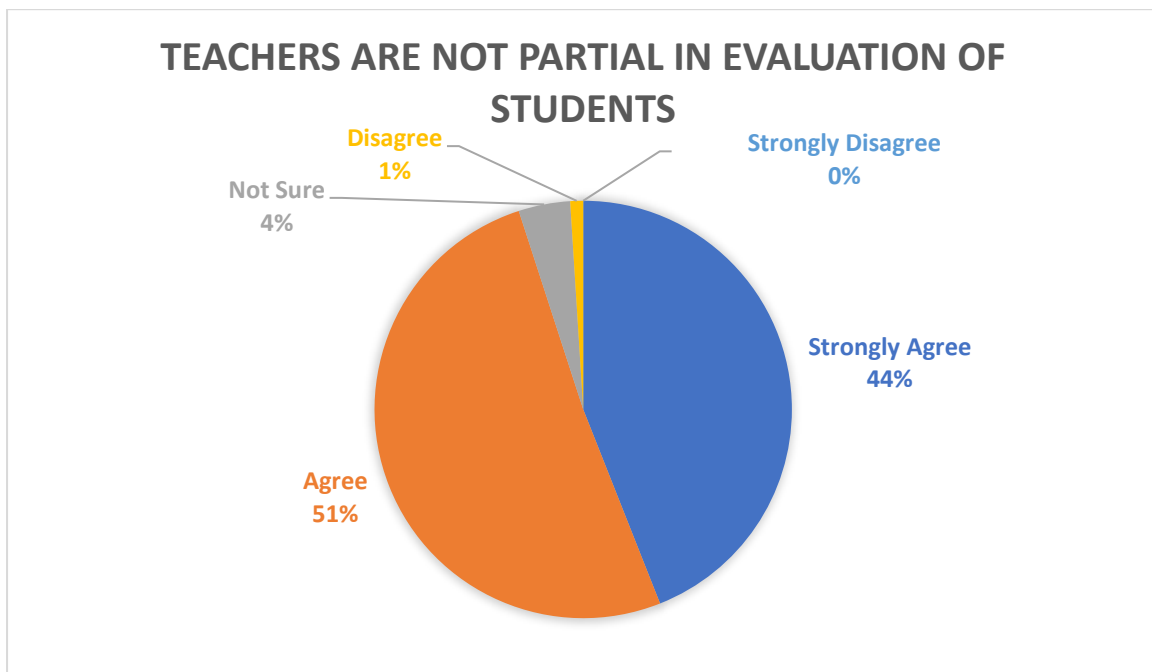
The pie chart demonstrates a high level of care from teachers as perceived by the respondents.



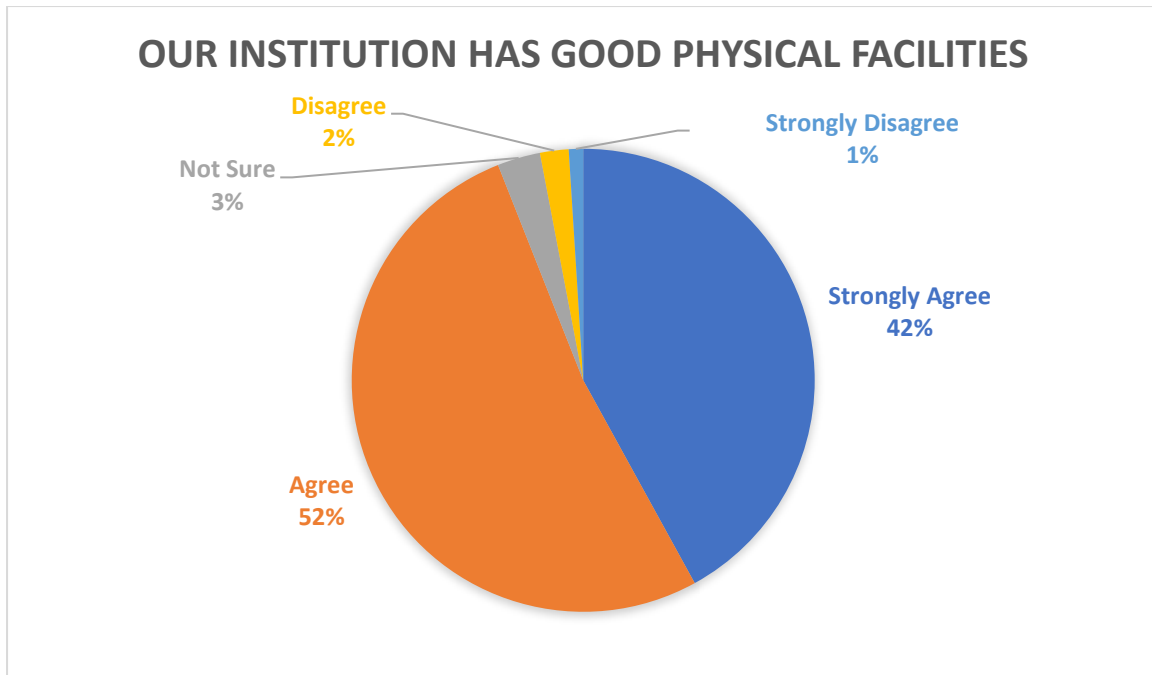
The pie chart illustrates perceptions about the principal's involvement in the college's activities. The majority agree that the principal takes much interest in the college's activities.



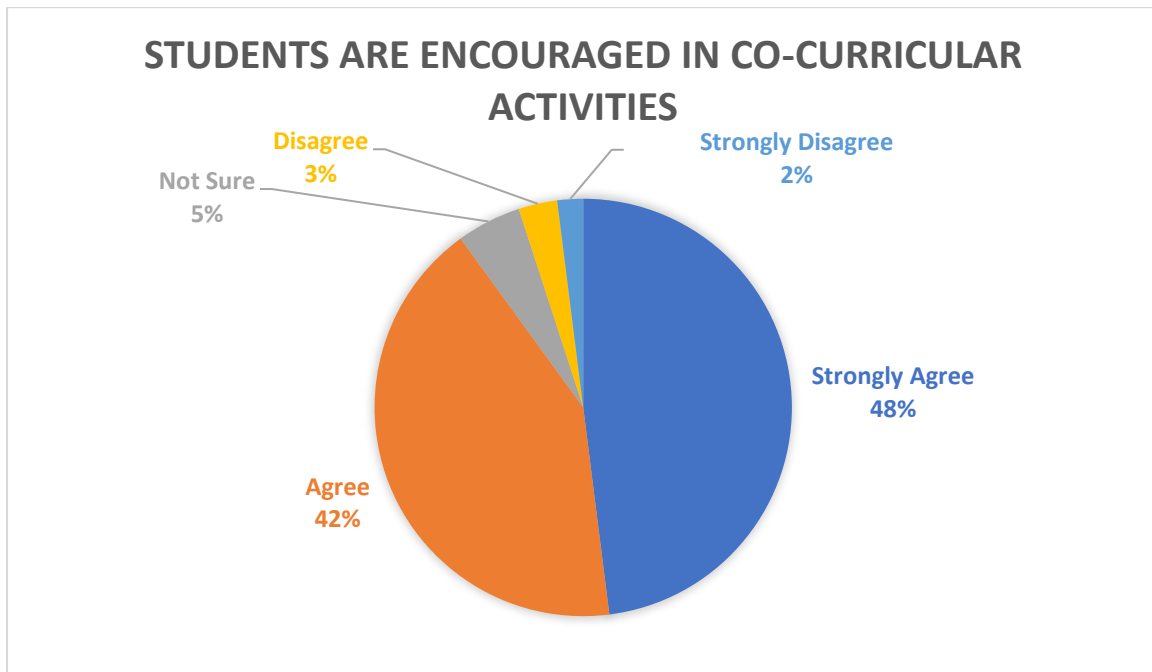
The pie chart indicates a strong positive perception among respondents, with 56% strongly agree that teachers in general teach well.



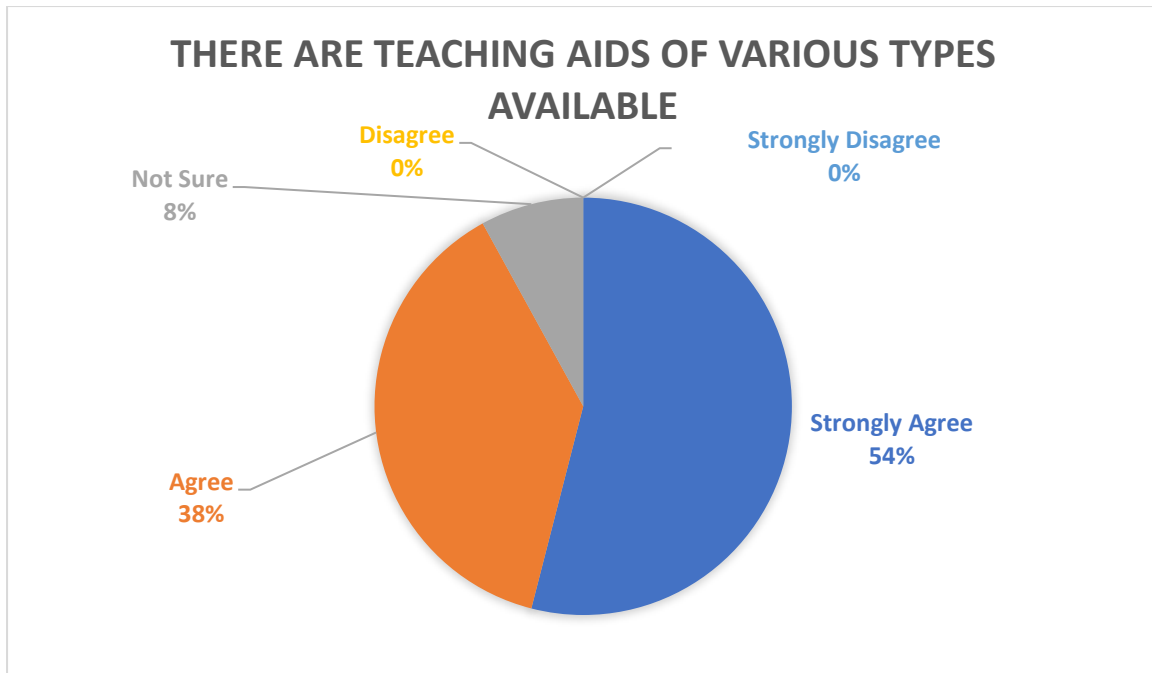

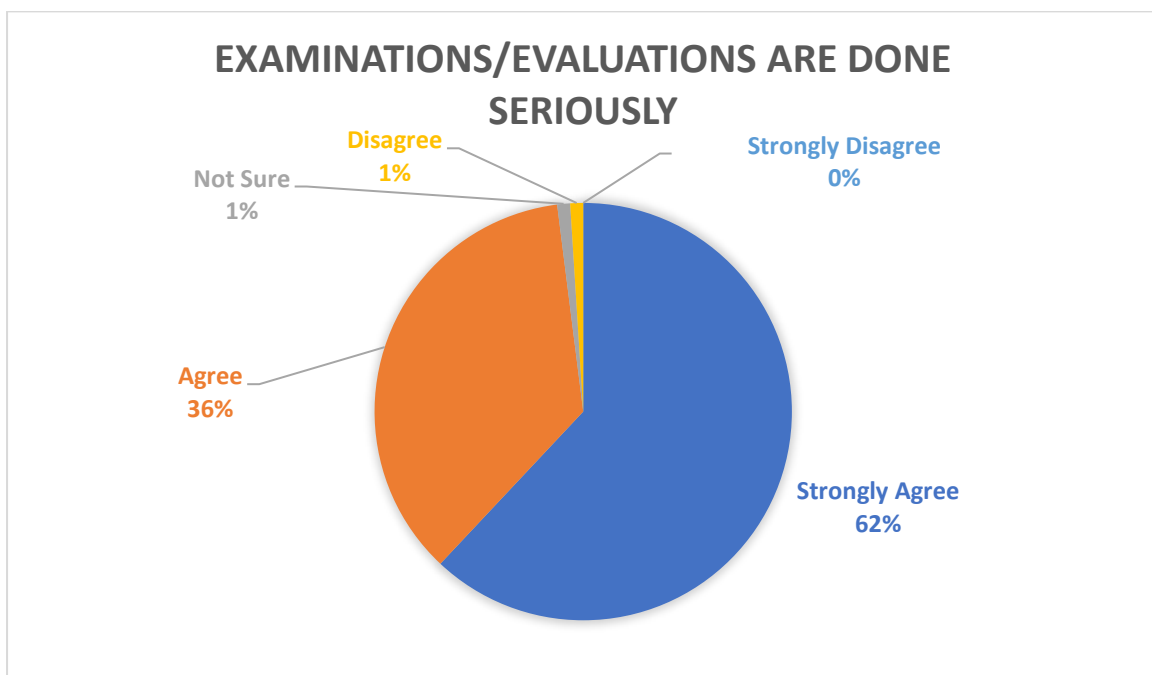
The pie chart indicates a positive perception about the institution’s physical facilities. Most of the respondents agree or strongly agree that the facilities are good.



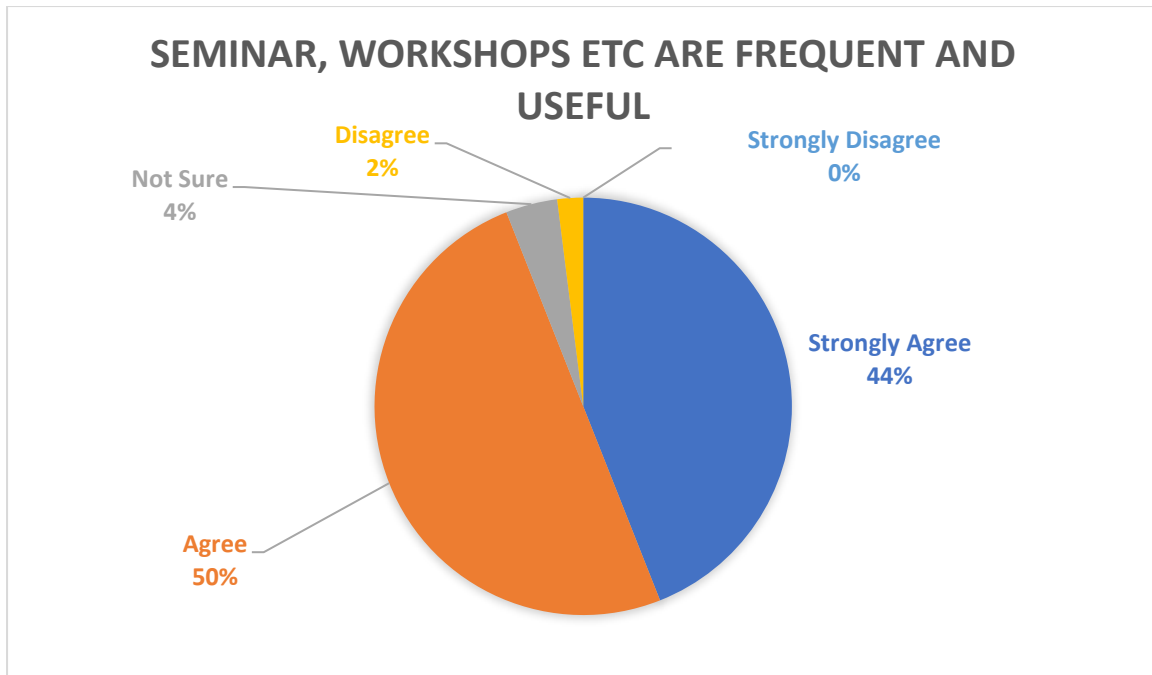
The pie chart suggests a favorable environment for co-curricular activities. Almost half of the respondents strongly agree that students are encouraged in co-curricular activities.



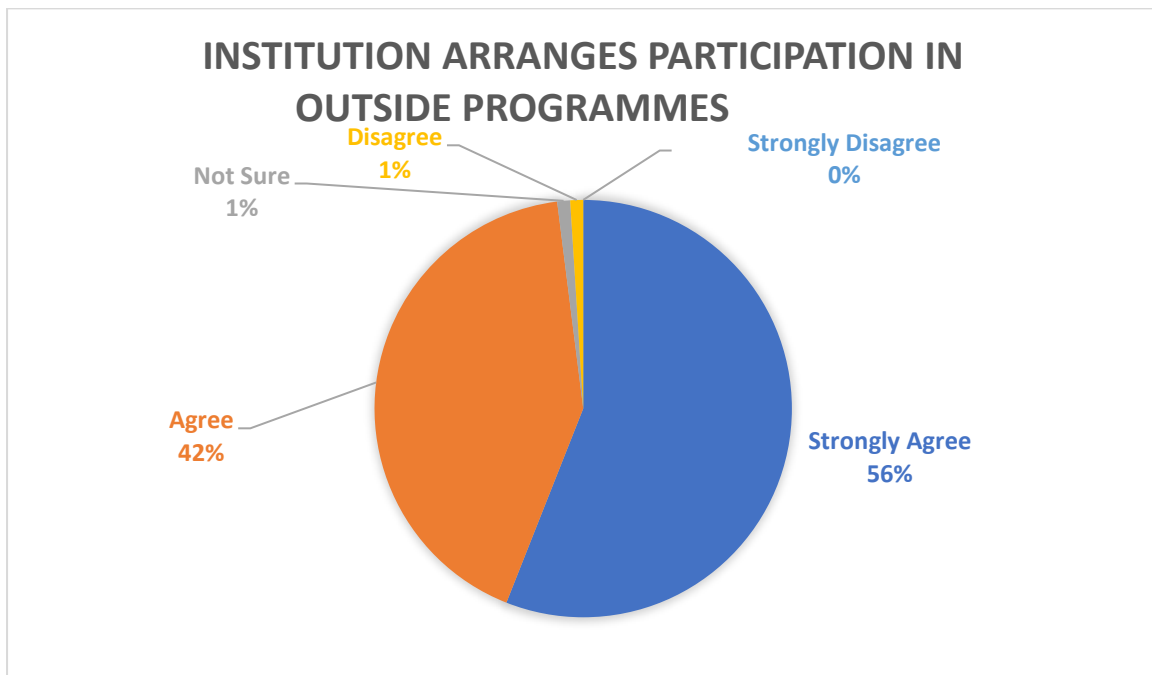
The pie chart represents the distribution of responses as to the availability of various types of teaching aids. Most of the respondents strongly agree that there are different teaching aids available in the institution.



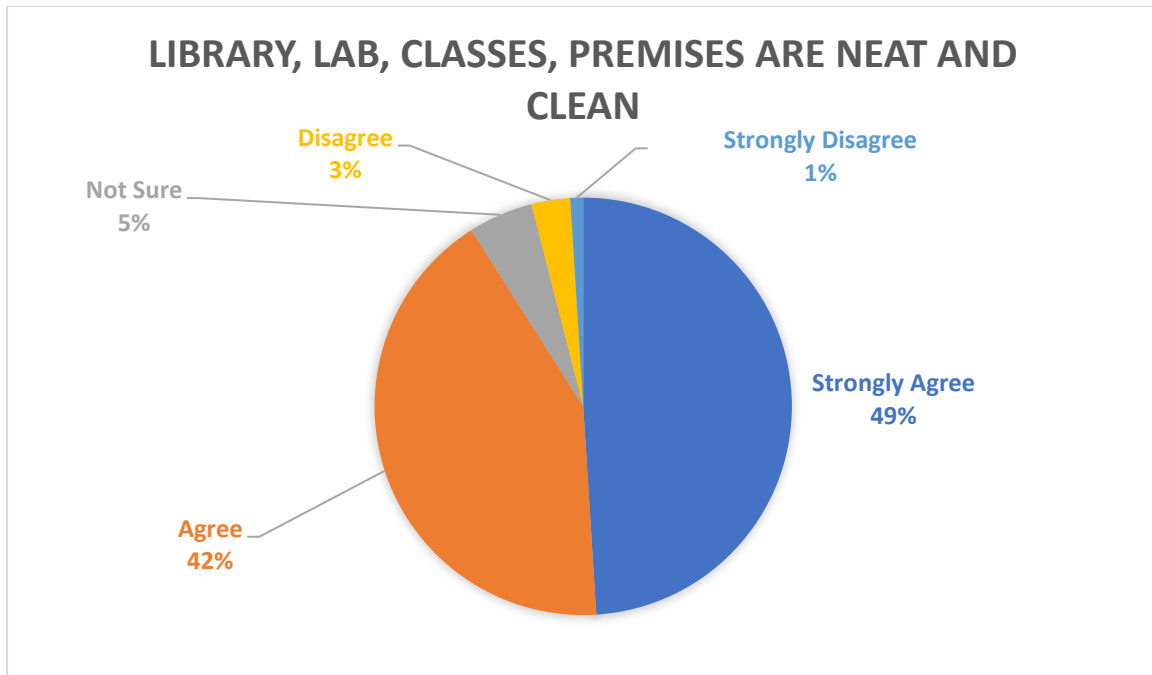

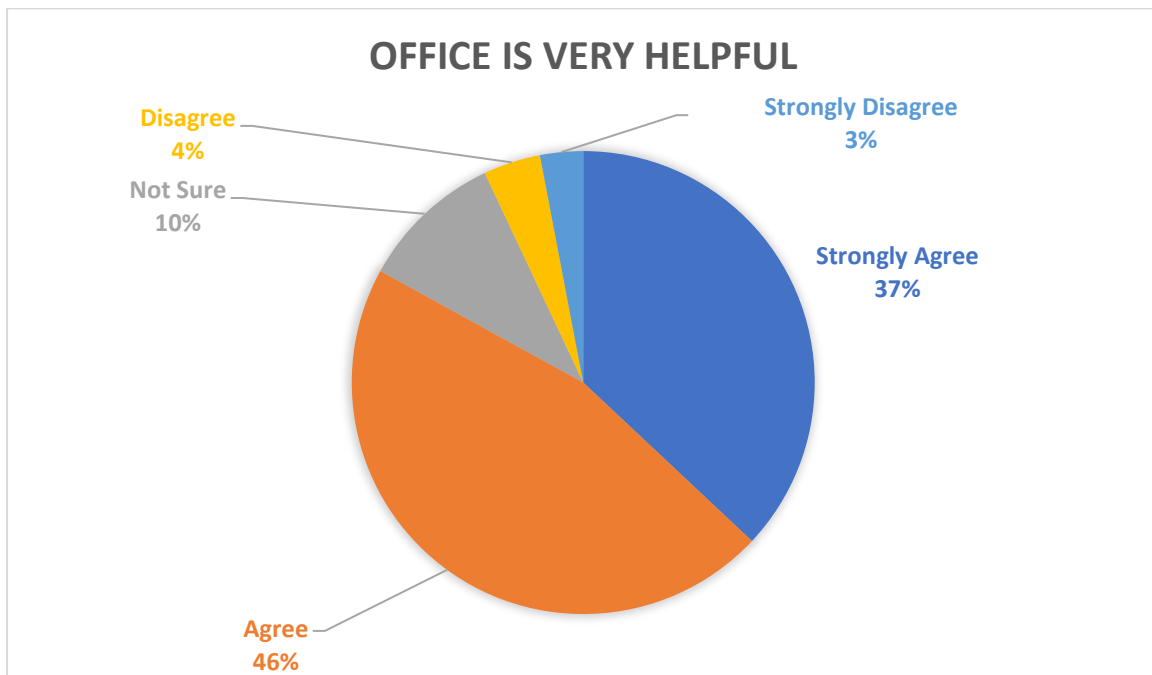
This pie chart depicts perceptions about the frequency and usefulness of seminars, workshops, and similar events. Most respondents agree that these events are frequent and useful.



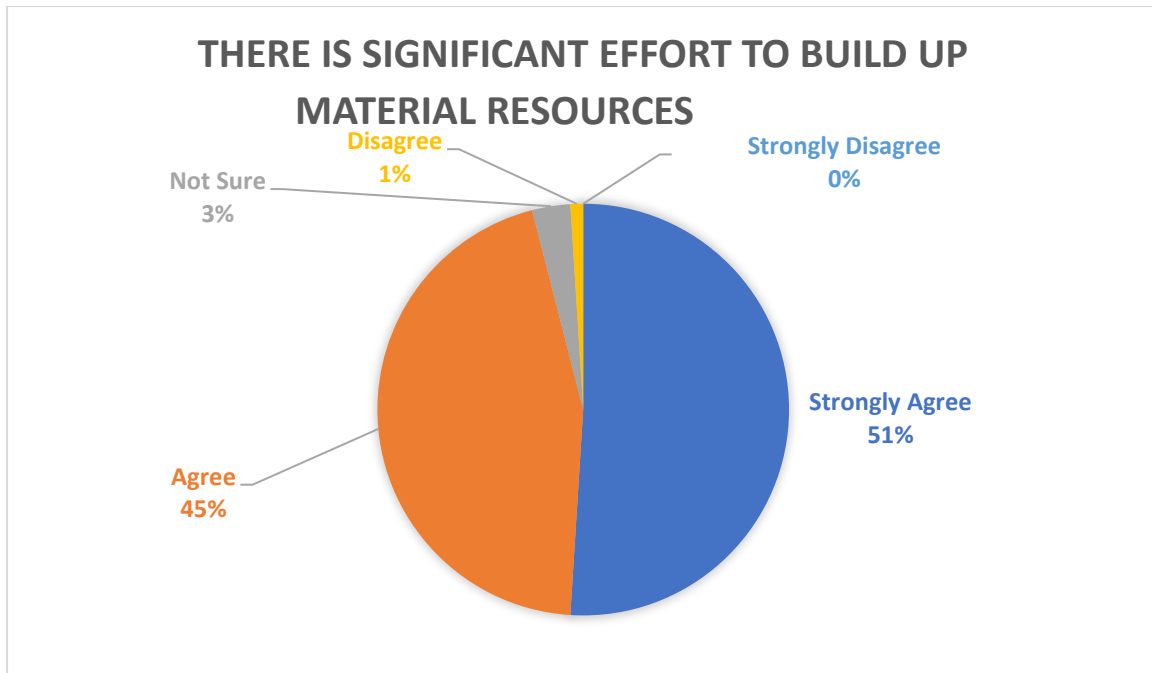
The pie chart showcases opinions regarding an institution's initiative in arranging participation in outside programs. Majority strongly agree that the institution facilitates participation in outside programs.



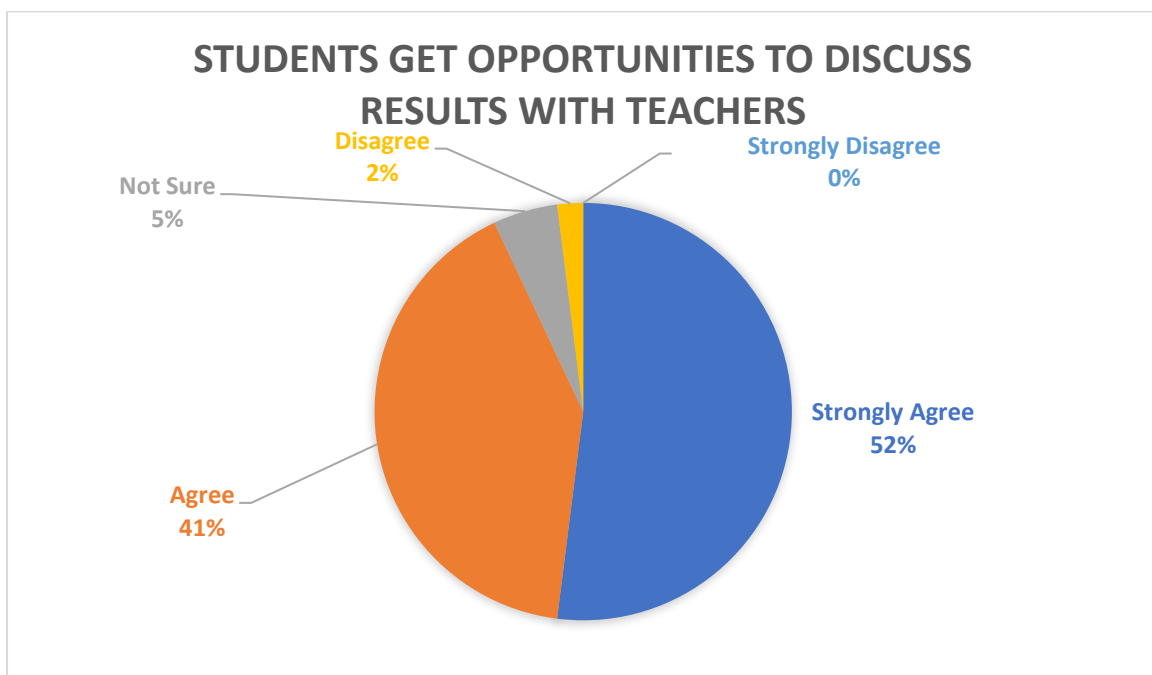

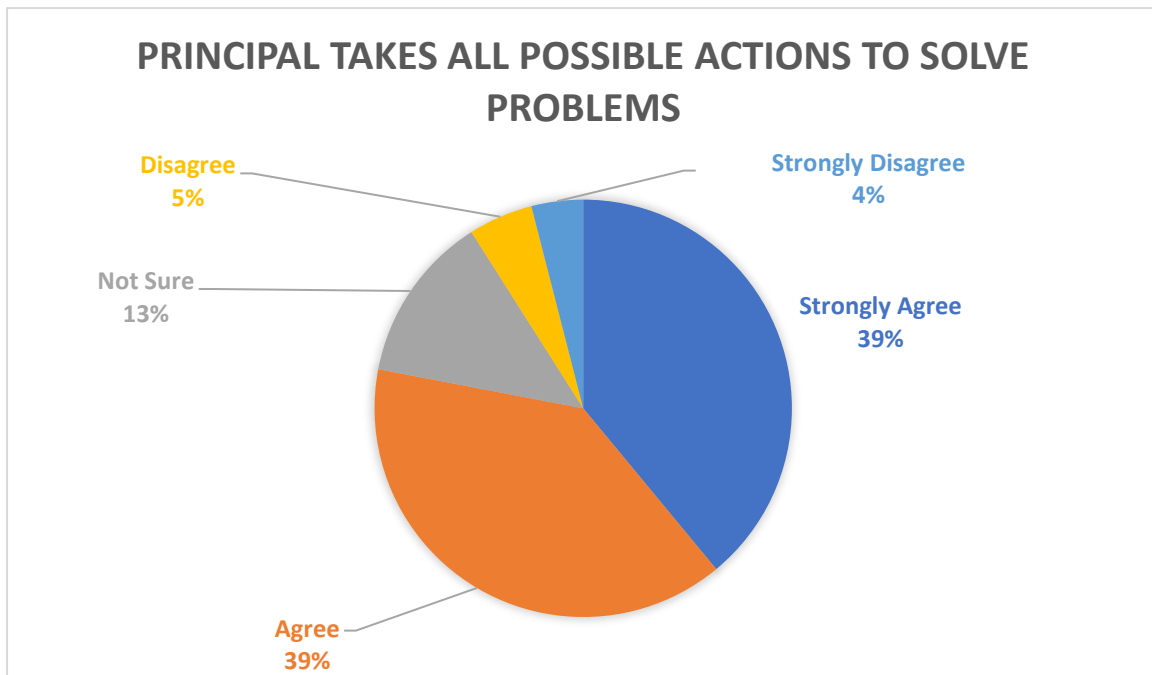
The pie chart represents opinions about the helpfulness of the office. It shows that most respondents agree that the office is very helpful.



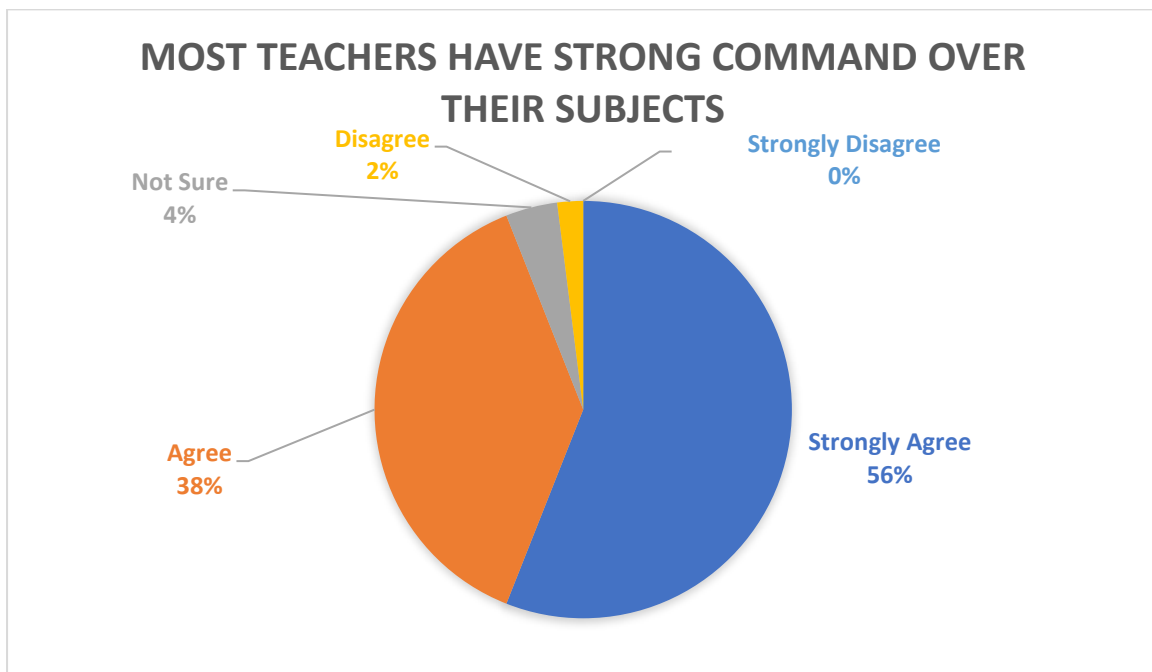

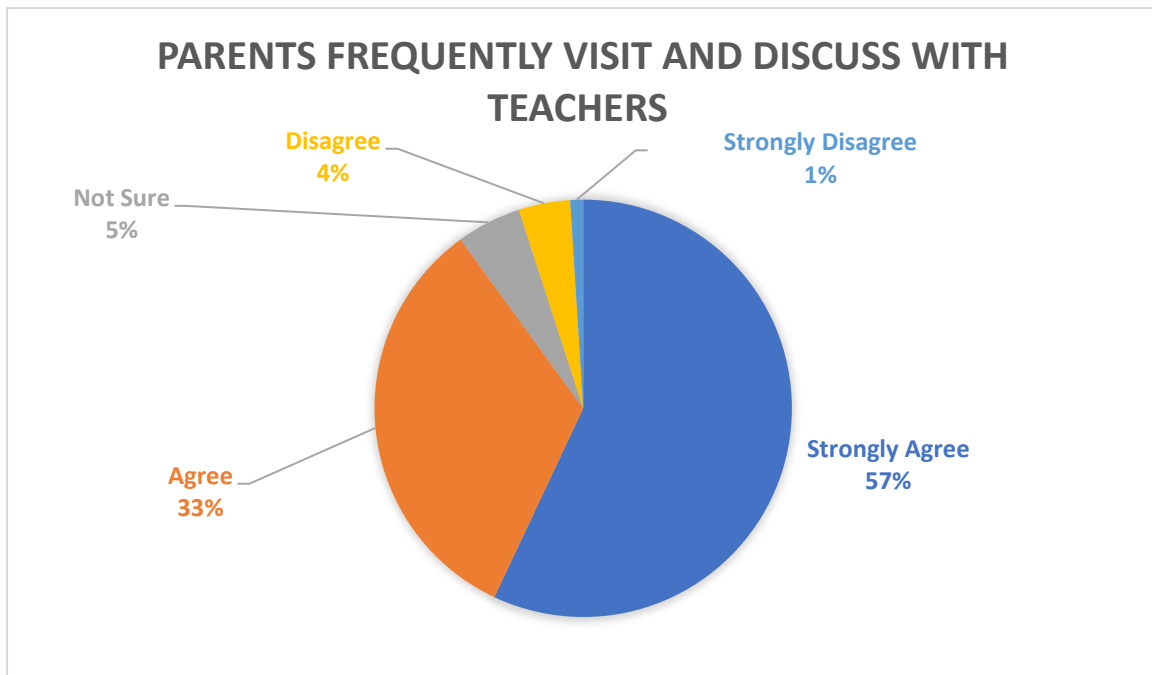
This data suggests that most students strongly agree that they do get opportunities to discuss results with their teachers.



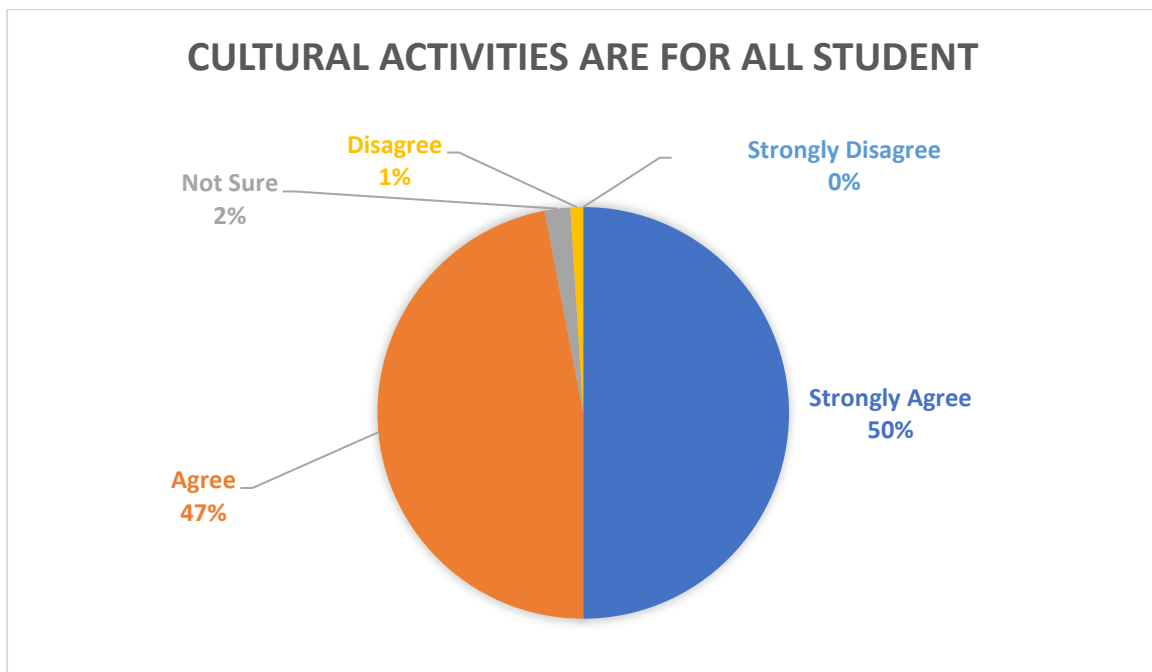

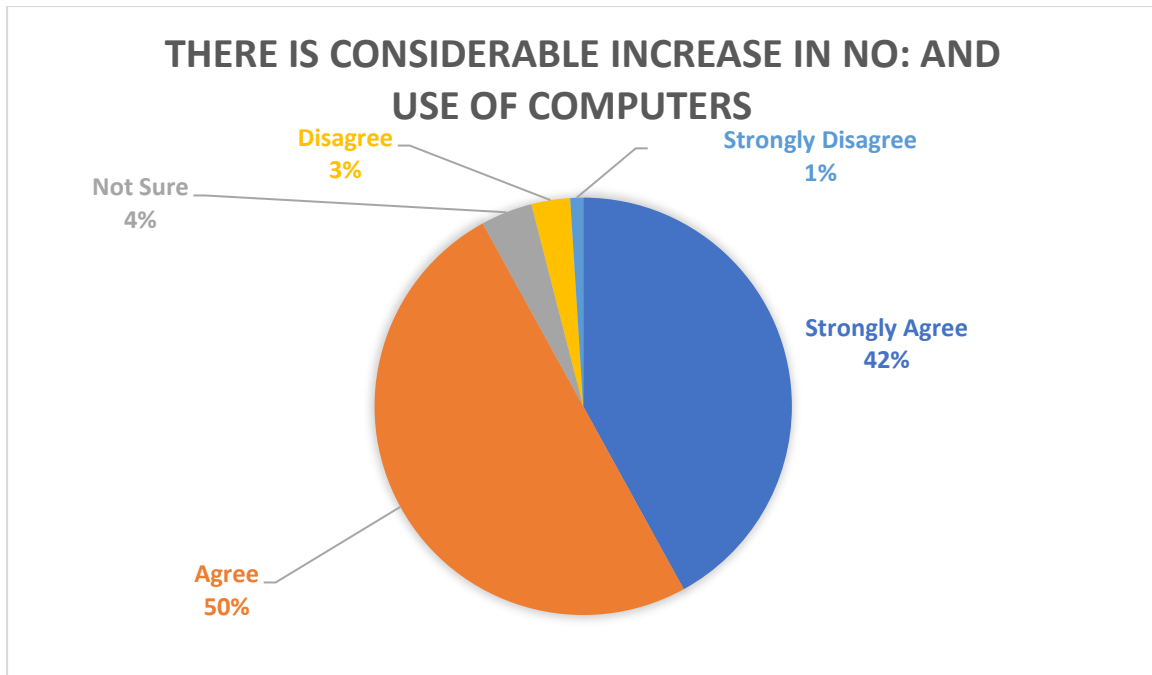
The pie chart indicates a high level of confidence in the teaching staff's expertise. A majority 56% strongly agree that most teachers possess a strong command over their subjects.



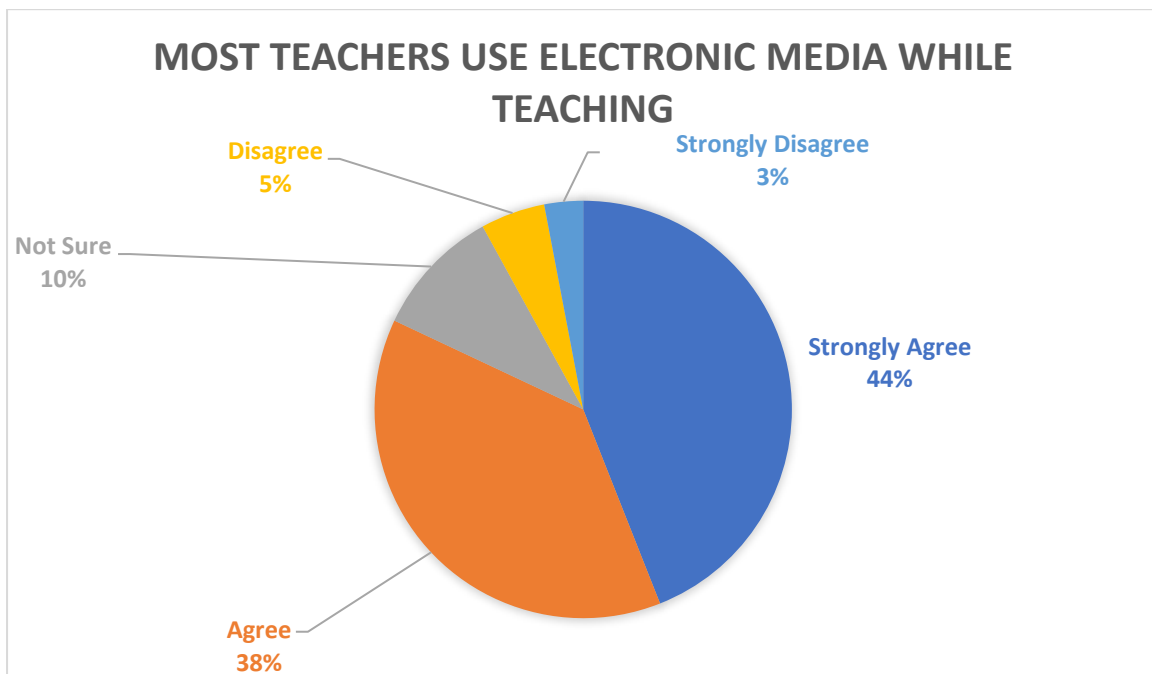
The pie chart illustrates the frequency of parental visits and discussions with teachers. A significant majority agree that parents frequently engage in visits and discussions with teachers.



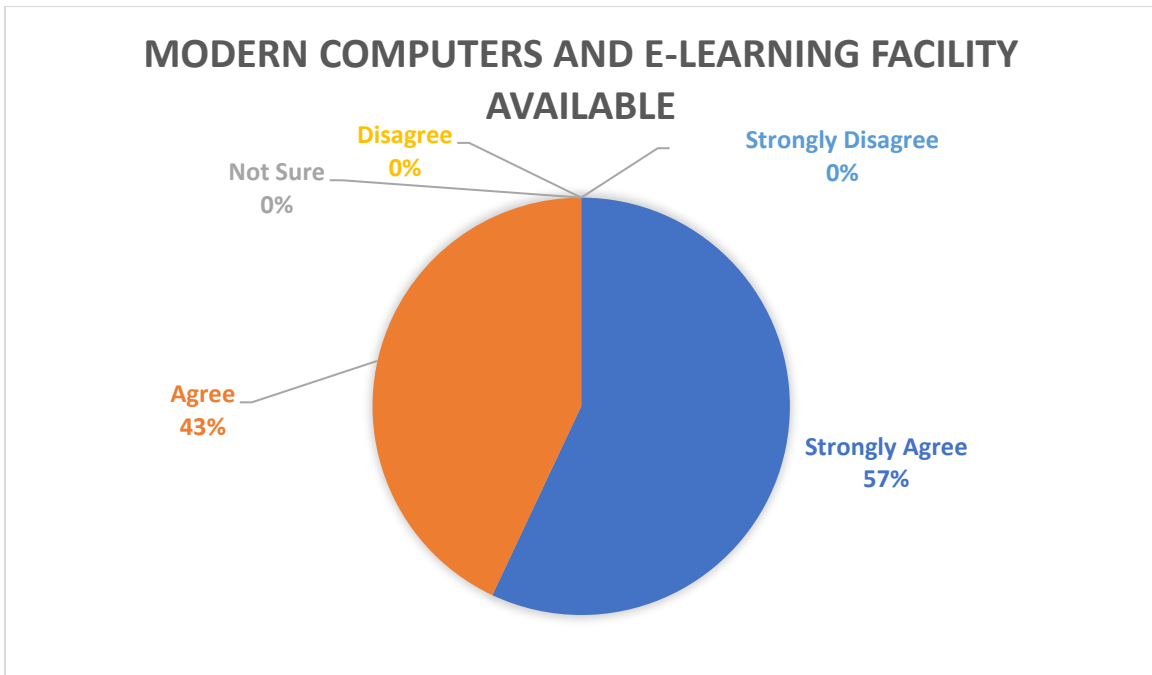
The pie chart indicates whether cultural activities are inclusive of all students. A significant portion strongly believes that cultural activities are indeed meant for all students.



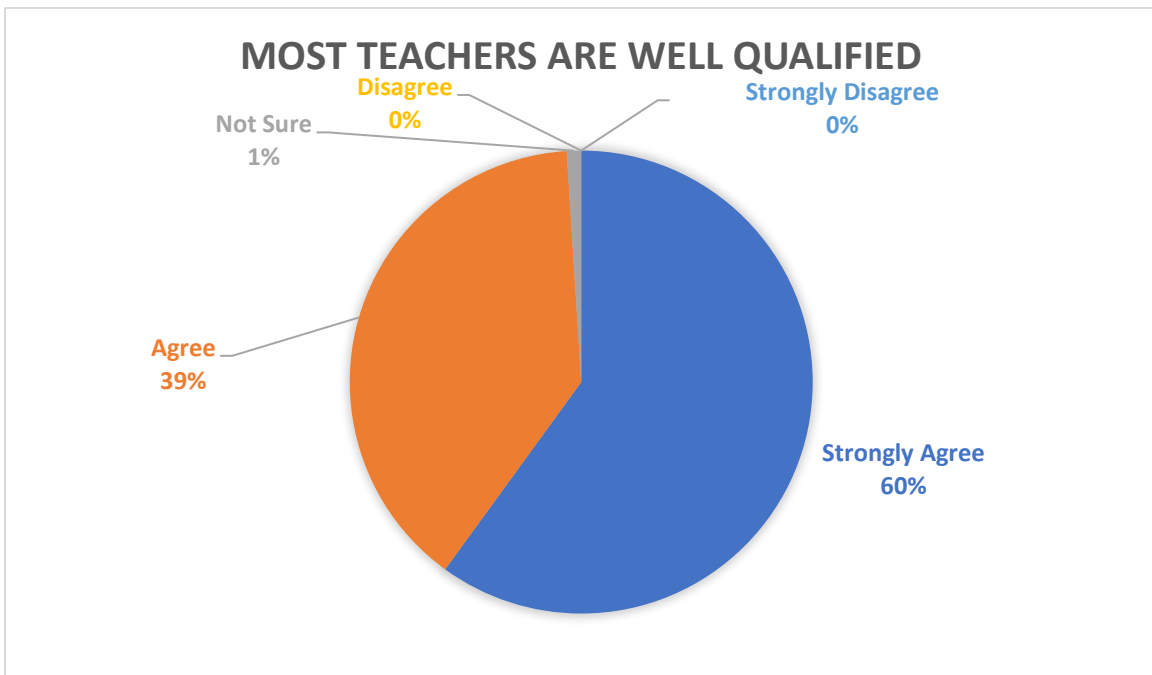
The pie chart suggests that a substantial percentage of respondents agree that there has been a considerable rise in the quantity and utilization of computers.



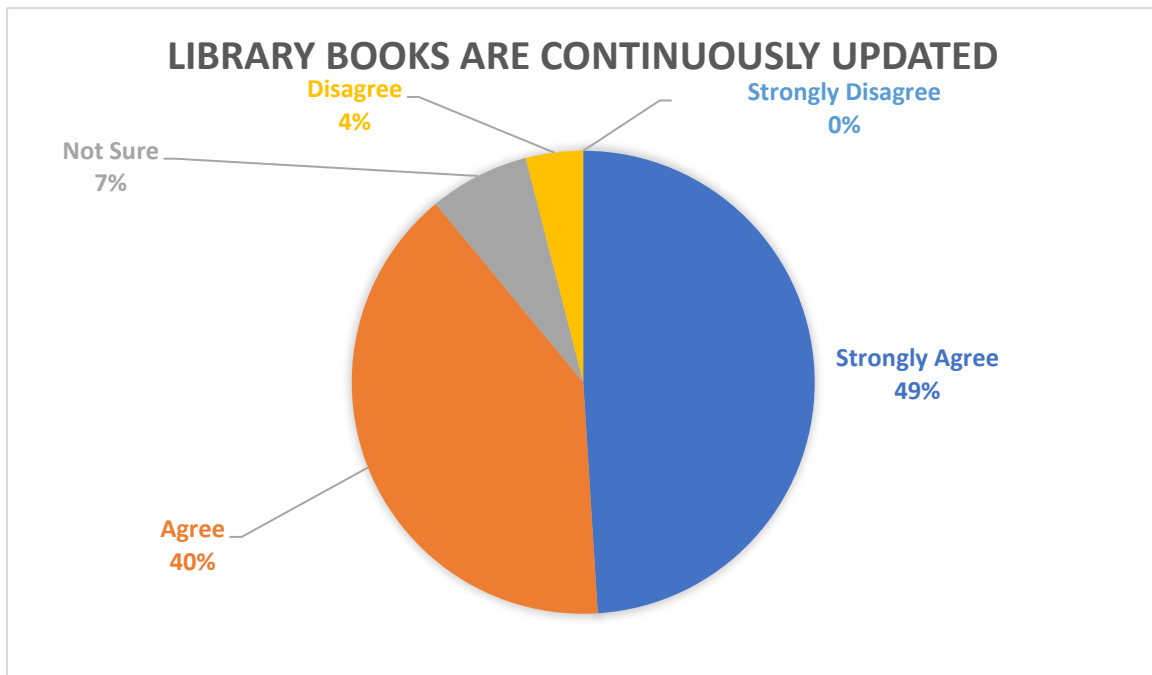

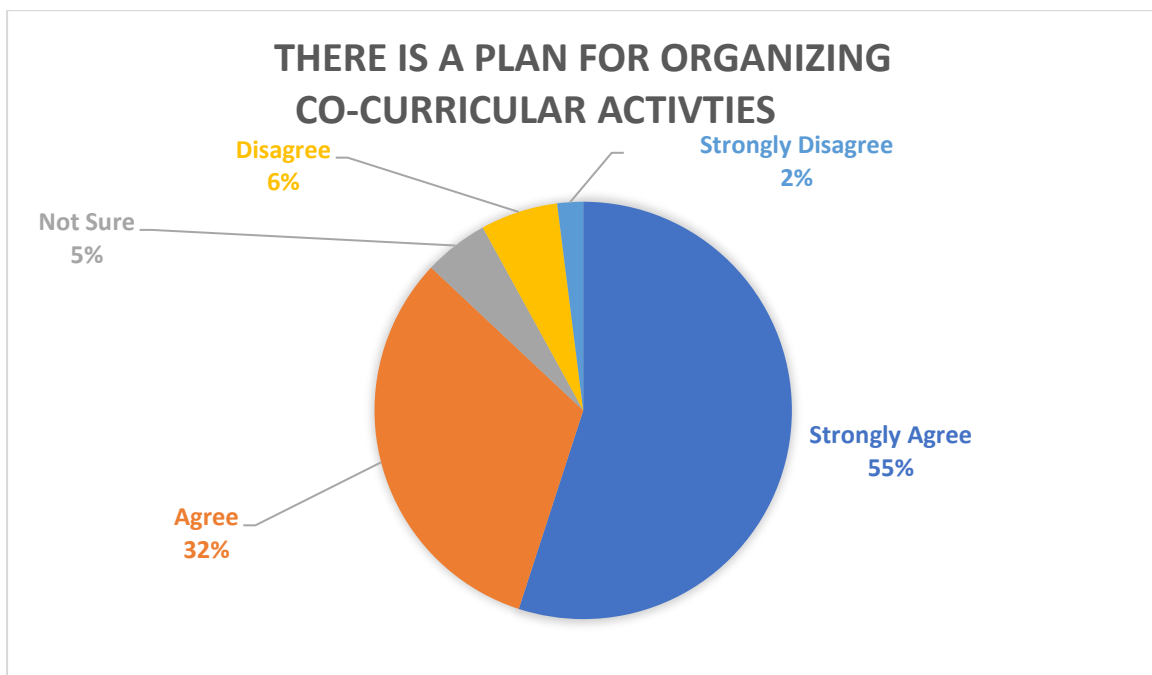
The pie chart illustrates a strong consensus regarding the availability of modern computers and e-learning facilities. A significant majority affirms the presence of modern computers and e-learning resources.



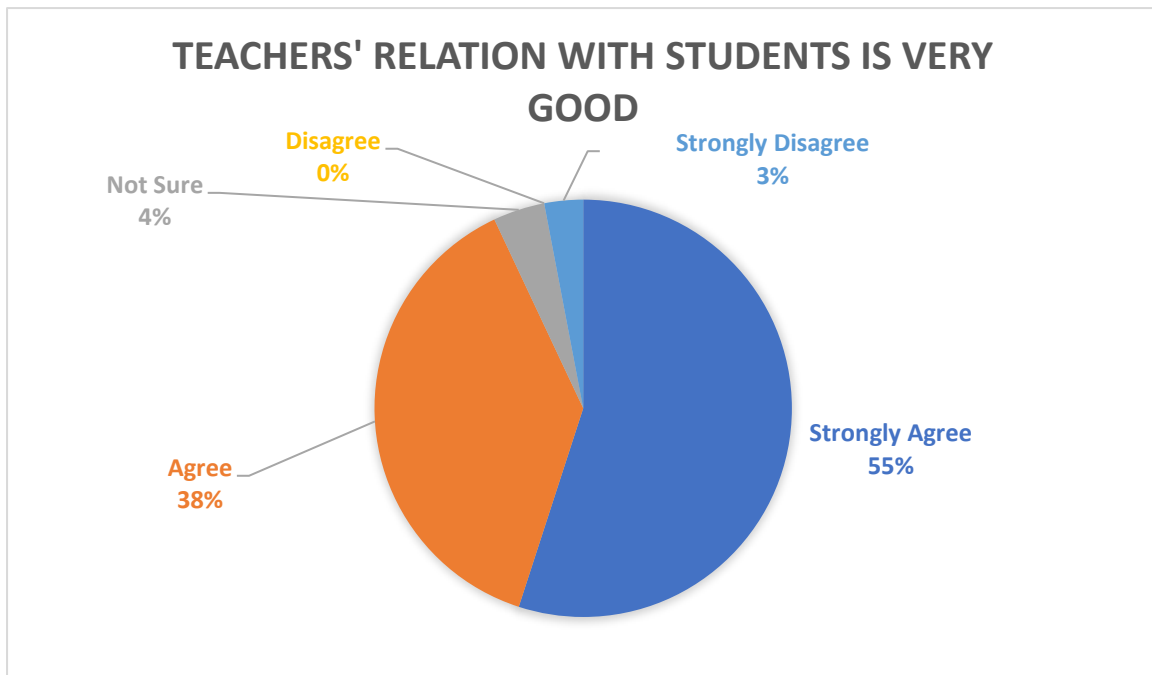
The pie chart indicates an overwhelming positive perception regarding the qualification of teachers.



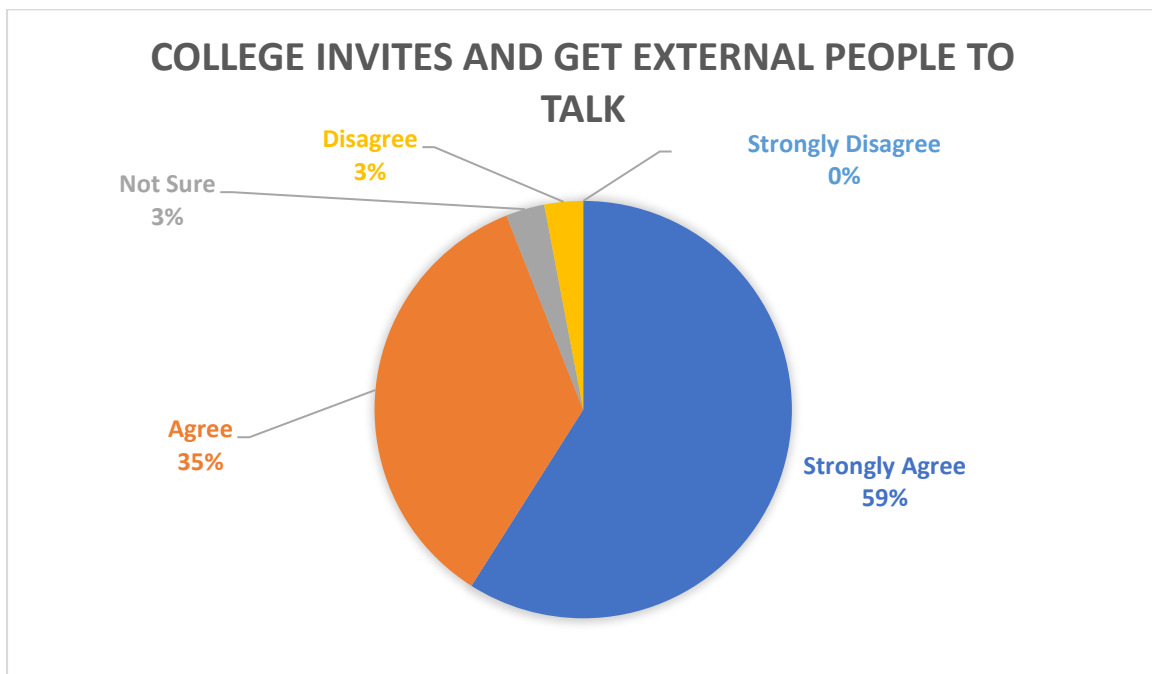
The pie chart reflects a positive sentiment regarding the continuous update of library books. A significant portion strongly believes that library books are consistently updated.



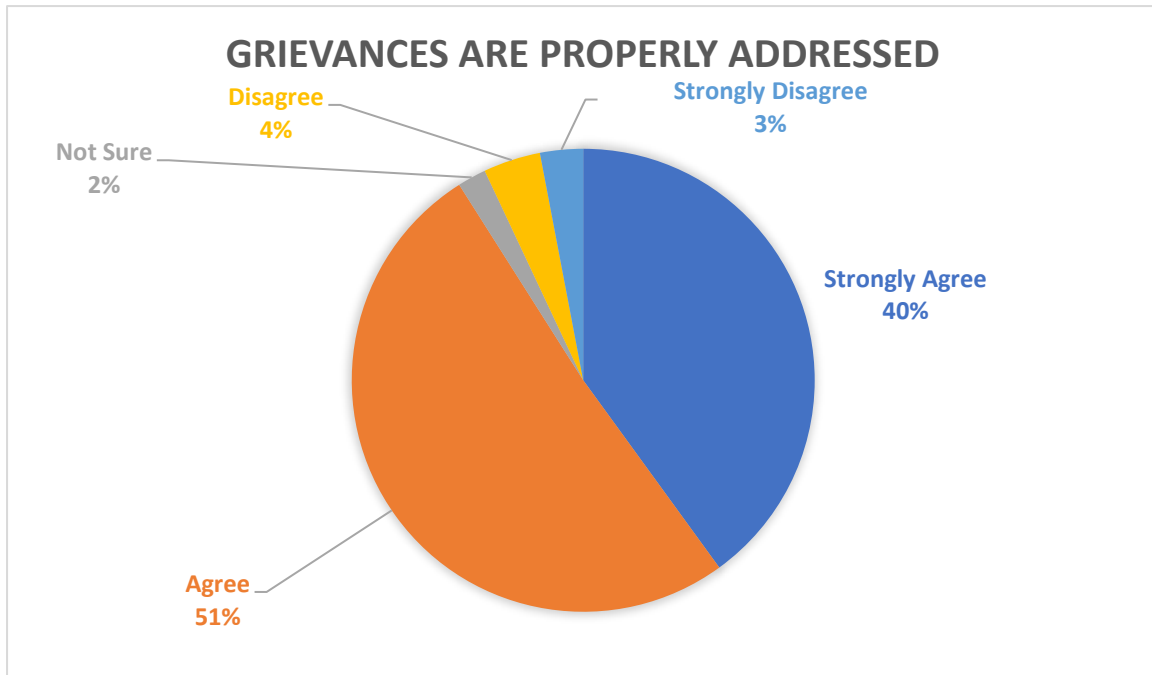

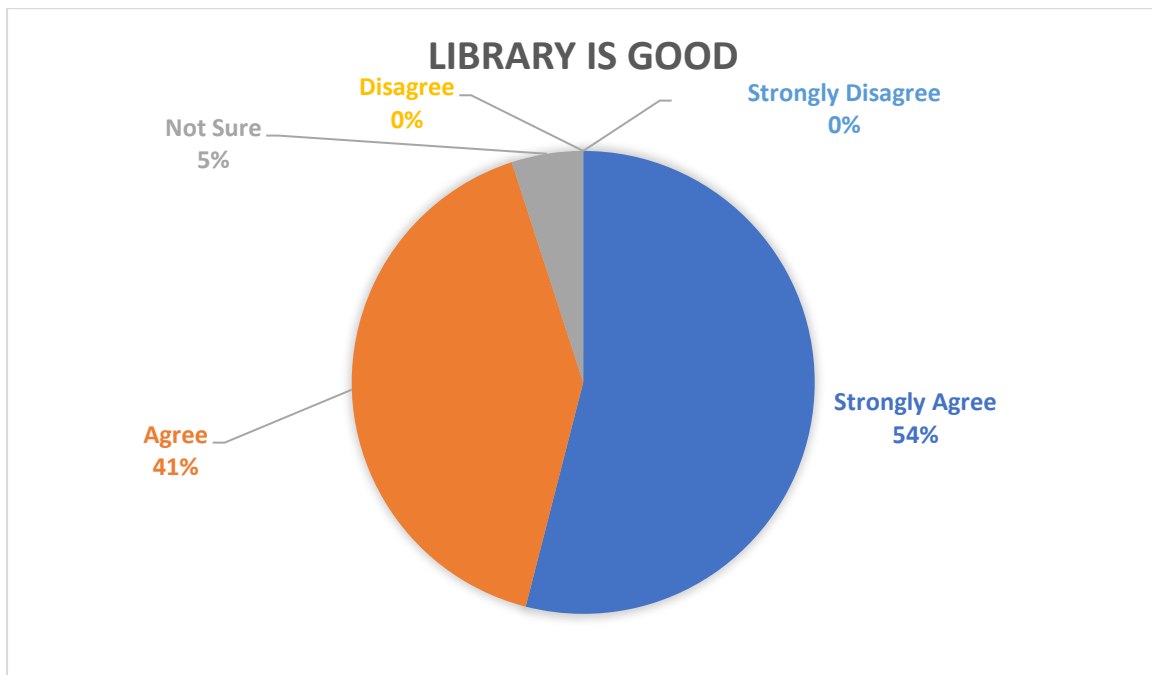
The pie chart demonstrates a highly positive perception of the relationship between teachers and students. A significant majority believes that the relationship between teachers and students is very good.



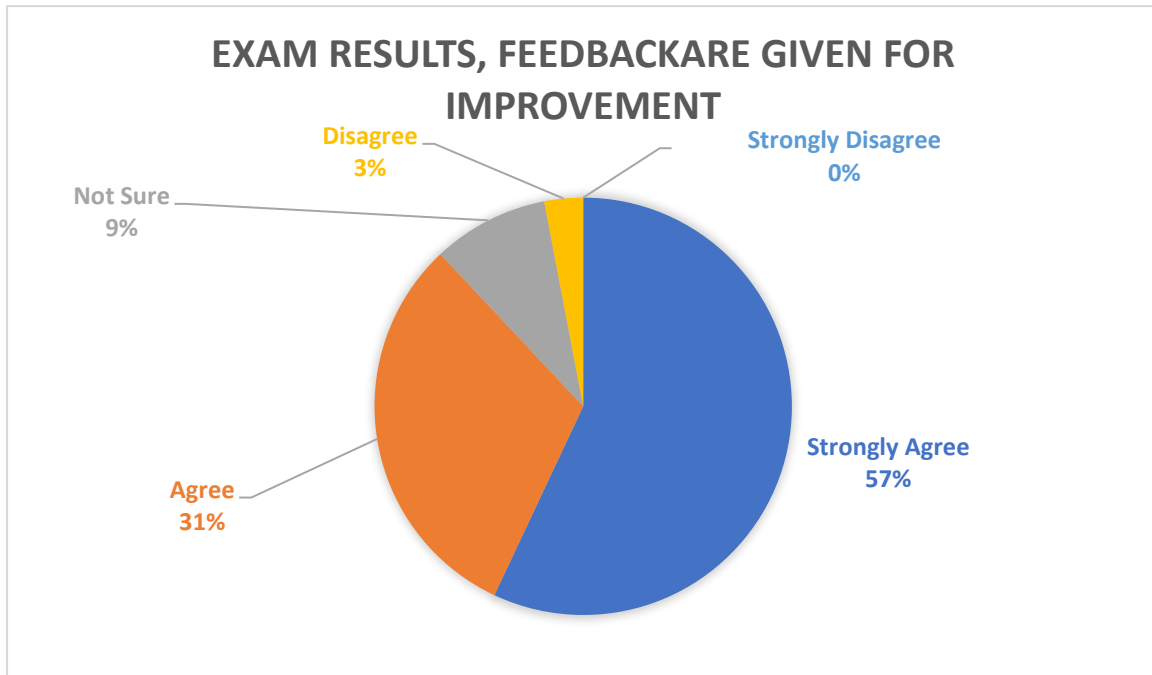

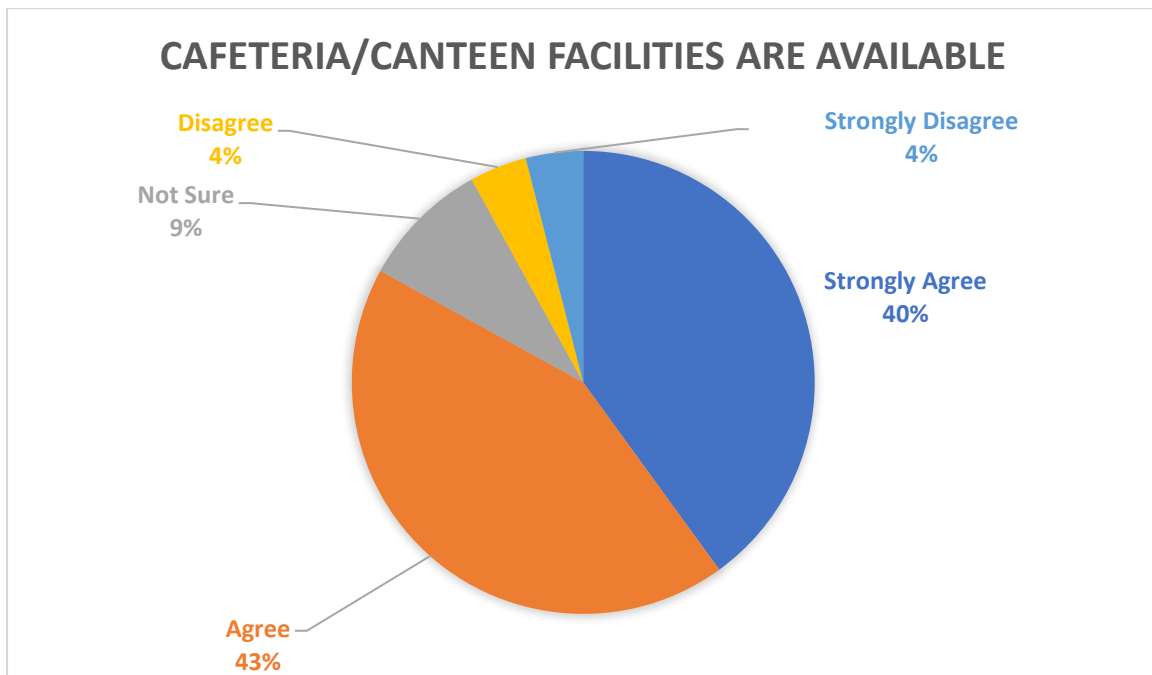
The pie chart indicates a generally positive perception regarding the handling of grievances. Most of the respondents believe that grievances are properly addressed.

Grievance handling and exam feedback processes are perceived positively.

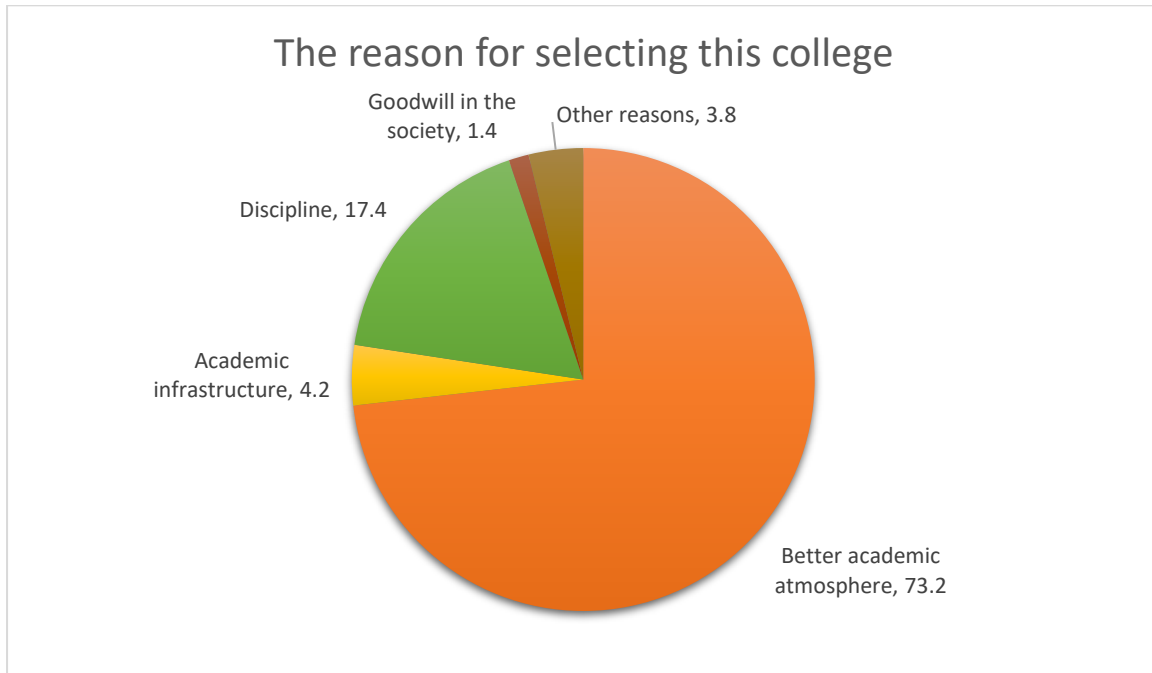

Overall: The feedback paints a very positive picture of the institution, with a strong majority of respondents satisfied with various aspects of their experience.

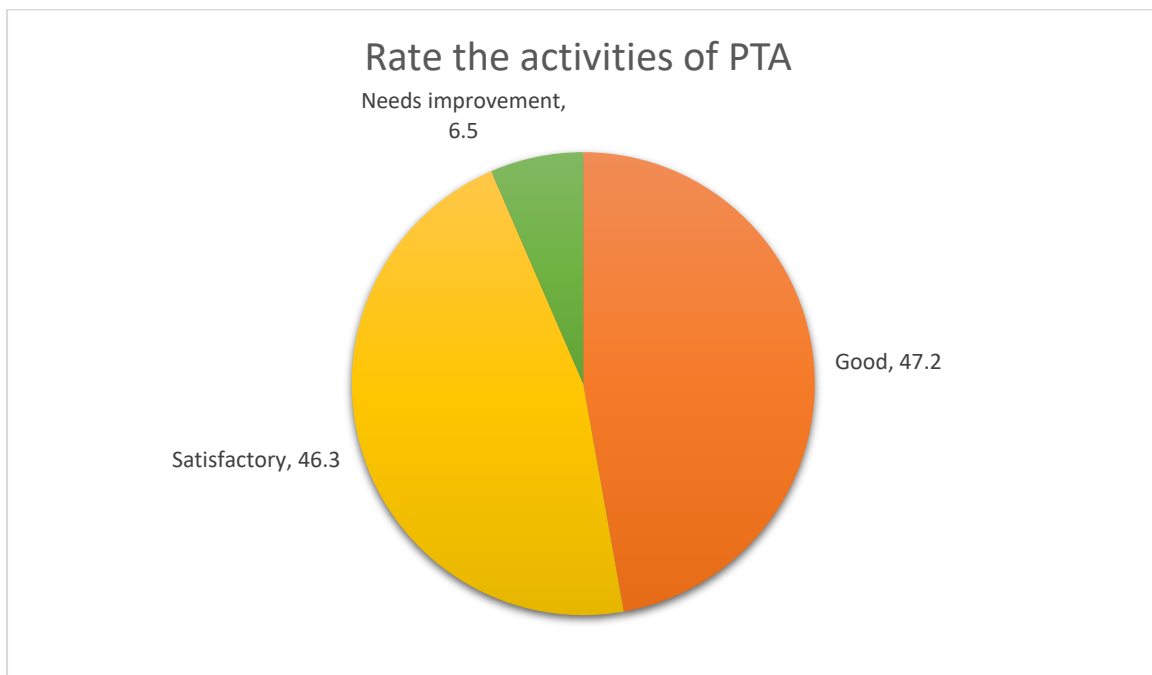



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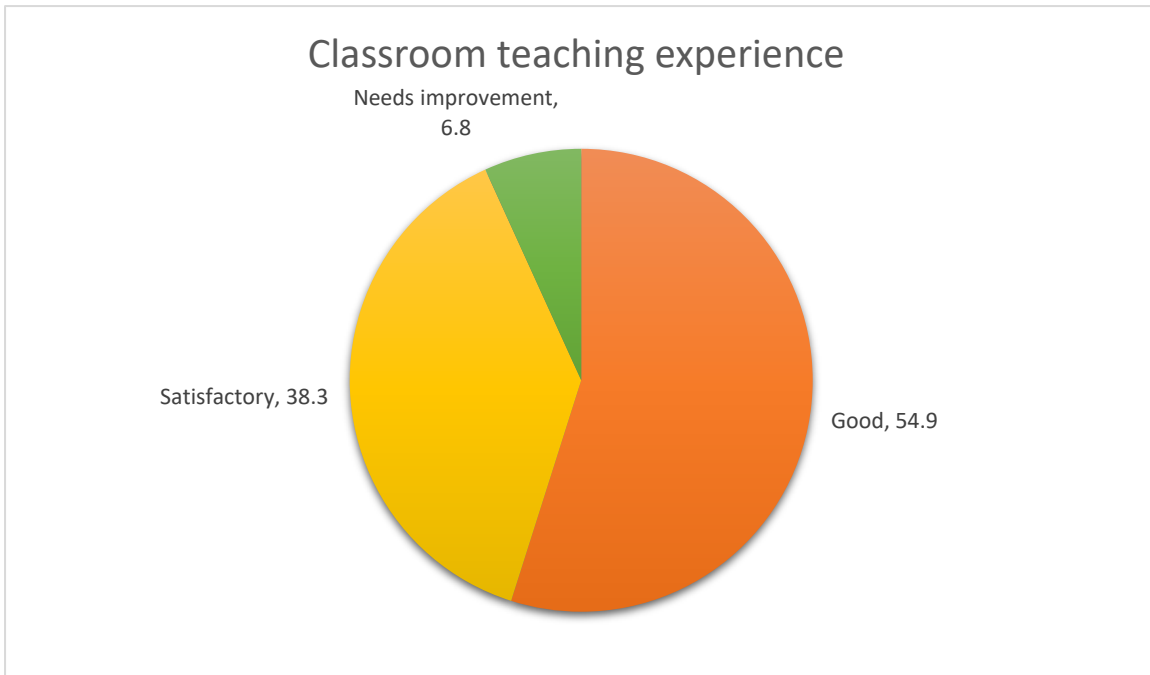

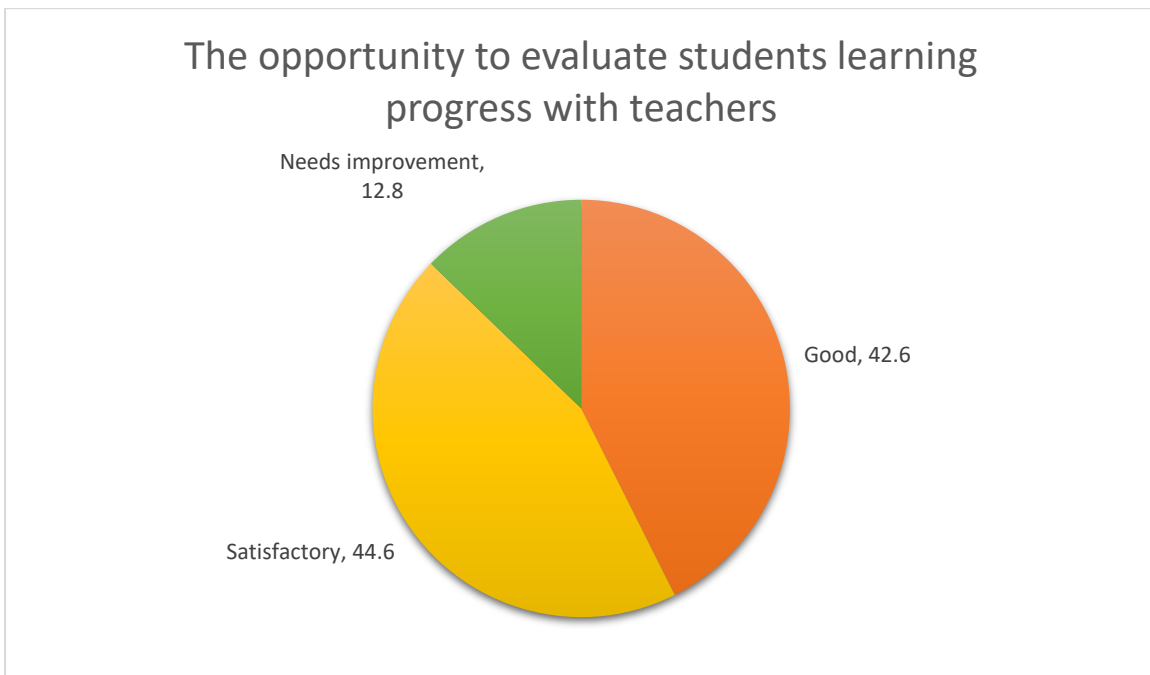
The pie chart shows the reason for selecting the college. The main reason is the presence of a better academic atmosphere.



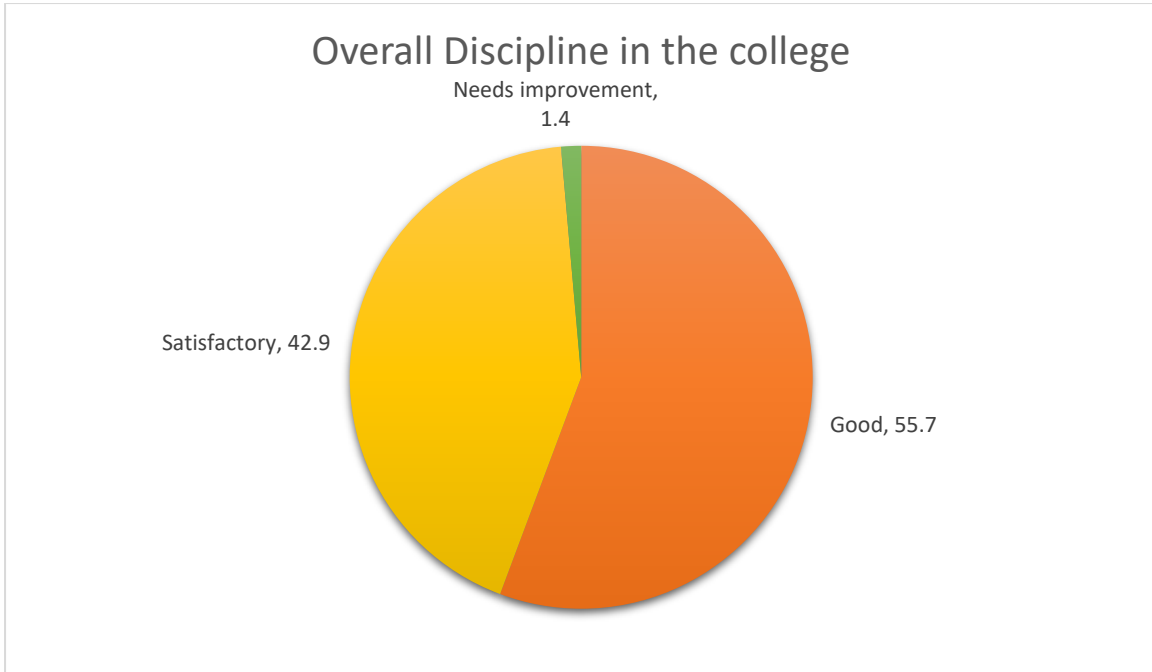
The pie chart indicates the perception of the respondents about the activities of the Parent-Teacher Association. Most of the respondents find the PTA activities to be good.



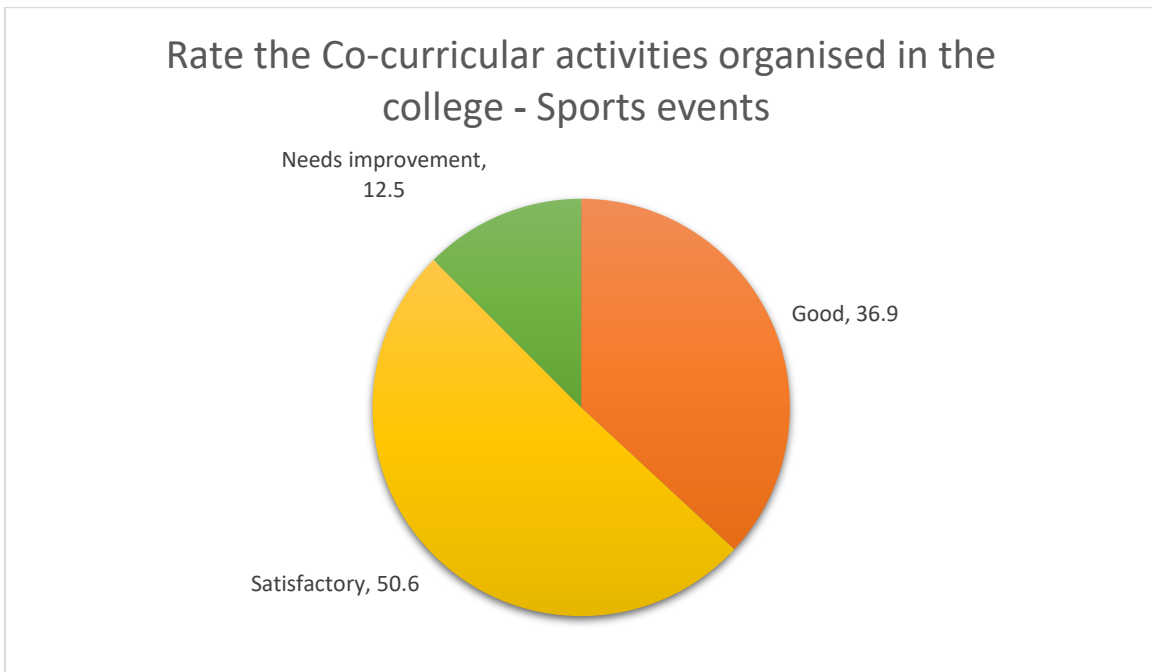
This pie chart outlines the perceptions of the classroom teaching experience. The majority considers the classroom teaching experience to be good.



This pie chart illustrates opinions on the opportunity to evaluate students' learning progress with teachers. Most of the respondents perceive it as satisfactory.

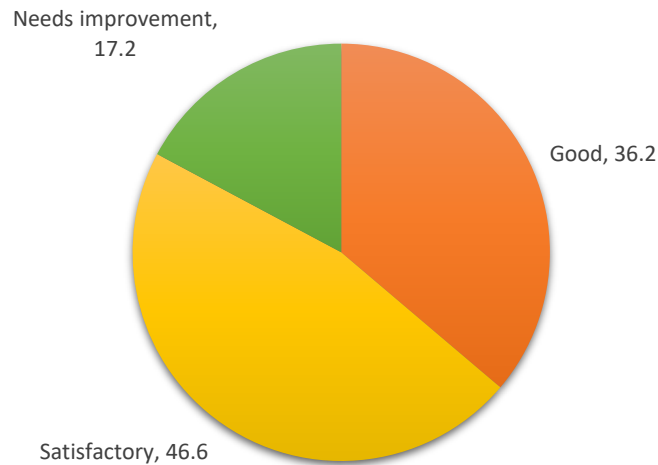


The pie chart depicts perceptions on the overall discipline in the college. The majority perceives the discipline as good.



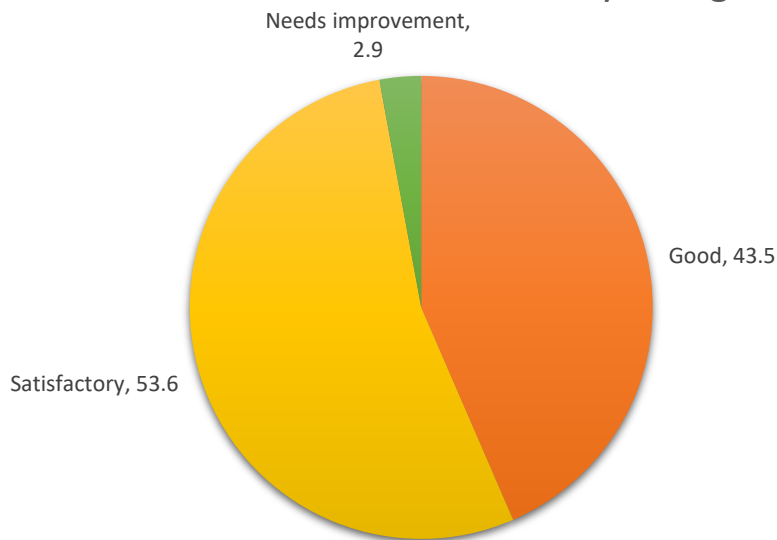
The pie chart illustrates ratings for the co-curricular activities, specifically sports events, organized in the college. Most of the respondents finds them satisfactory.

Rate the Co-curricular activities organised in the college - Arts and cultural events

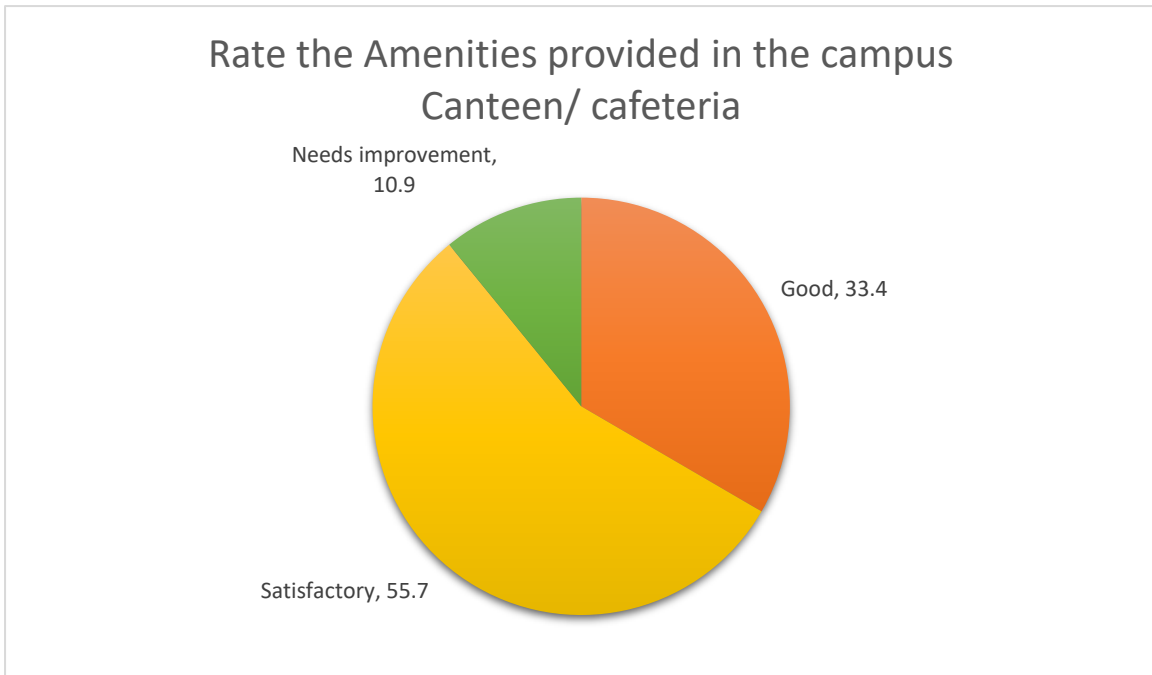


The pie chart demonstrates ratings for the co-curricular activities, particularly arts and cultural events, organized in the college. Most of the respondents find them satisfactory.

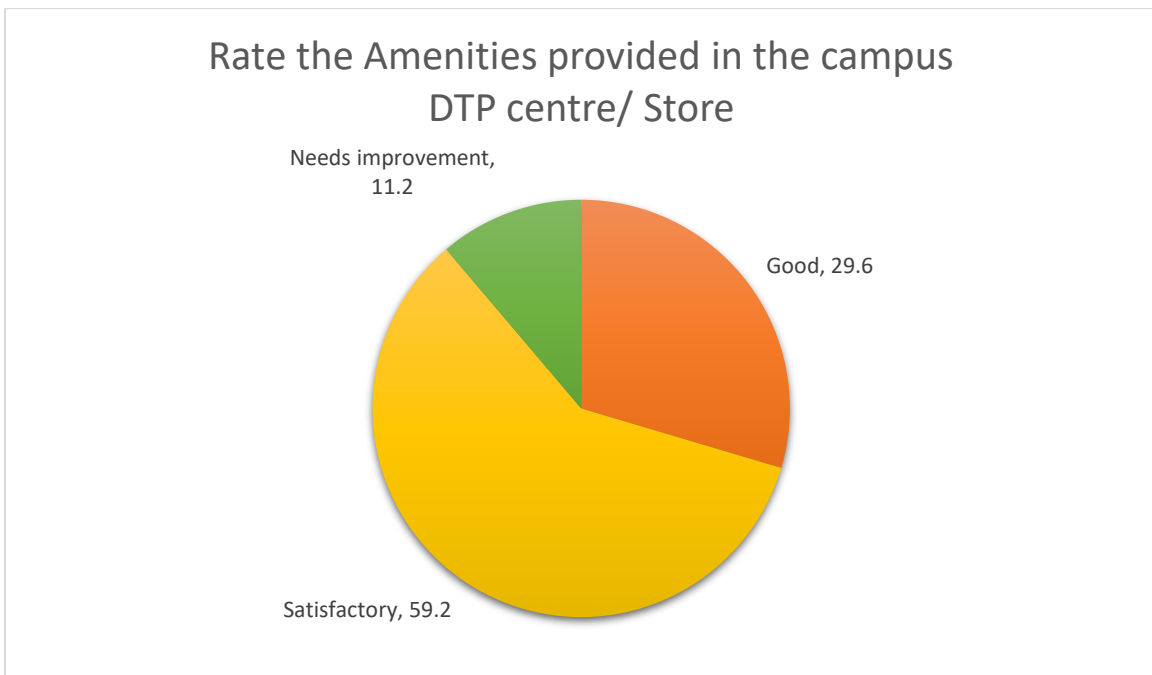

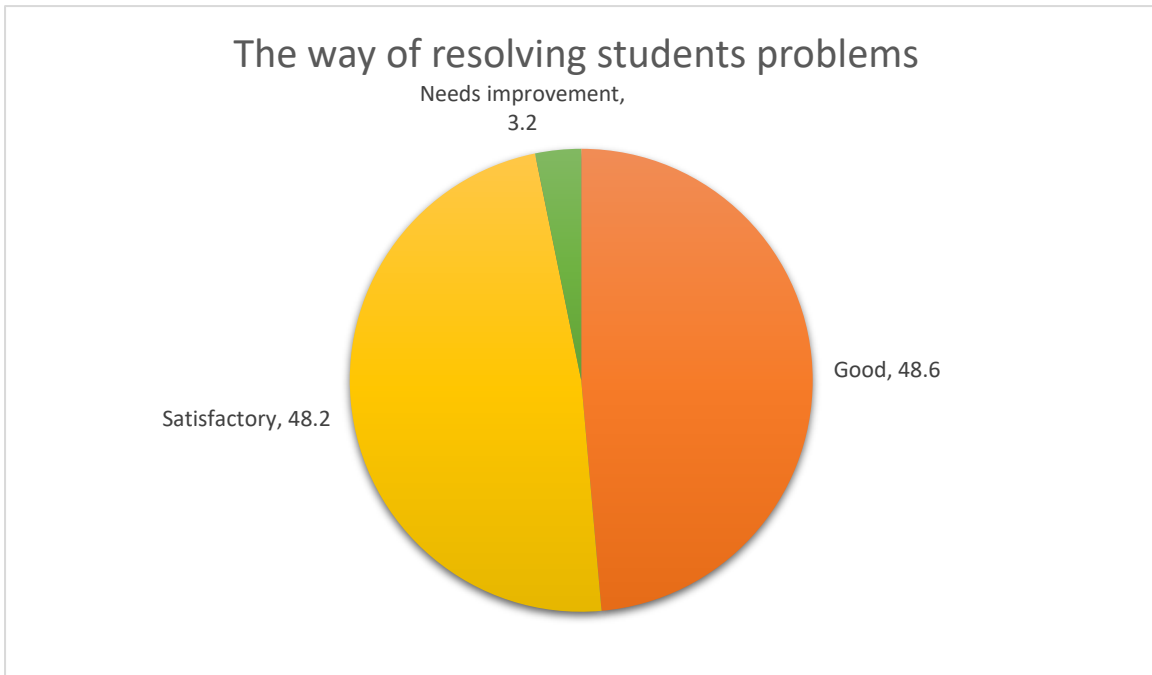
The pie chart outlines feedback regarding the services offered by the college office. Majority finds these services to be satisfactory.



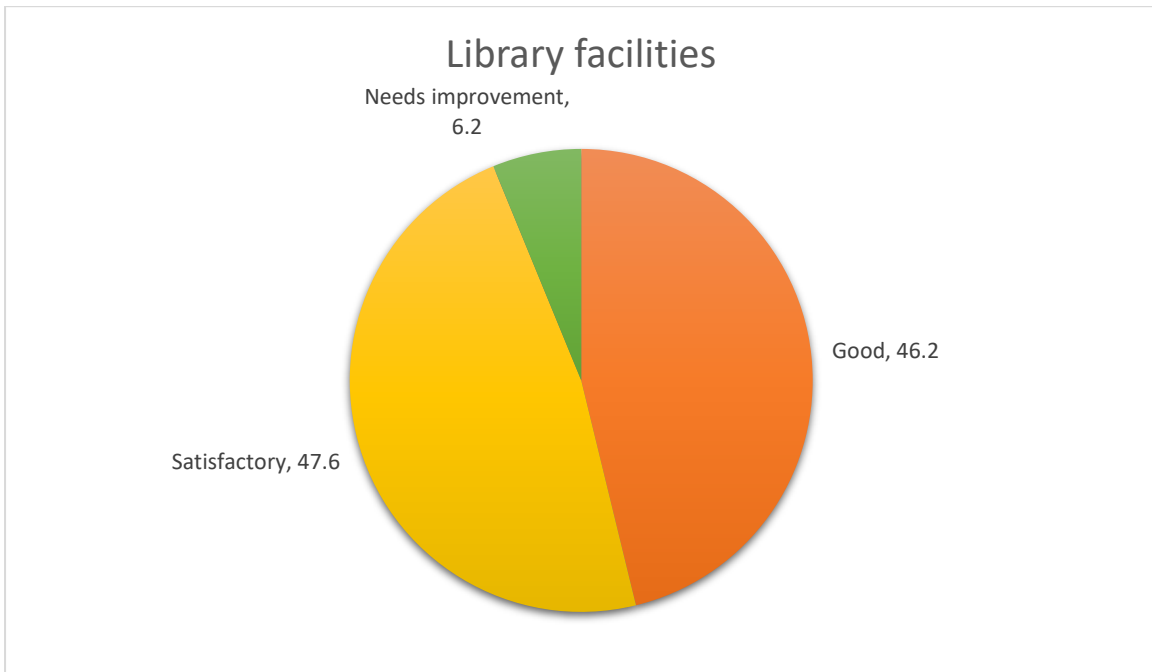
The pie chart illustrates ratings for the amenities provided in the campus, specifically focusing on the canteen or cafeteria. Most of the respondents finds them as satisfactory.



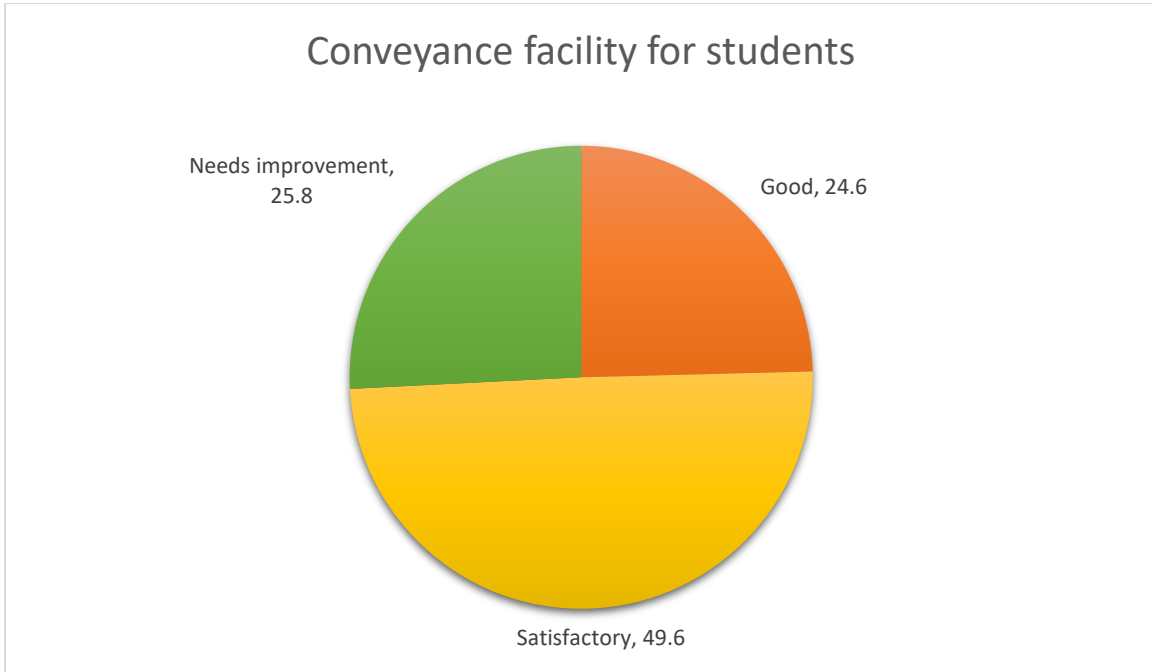
The pie chart illustrates ratings for the amenities provided in the campus, specifically the DTP center or store. Most of the respondents finds them as satisfactory.



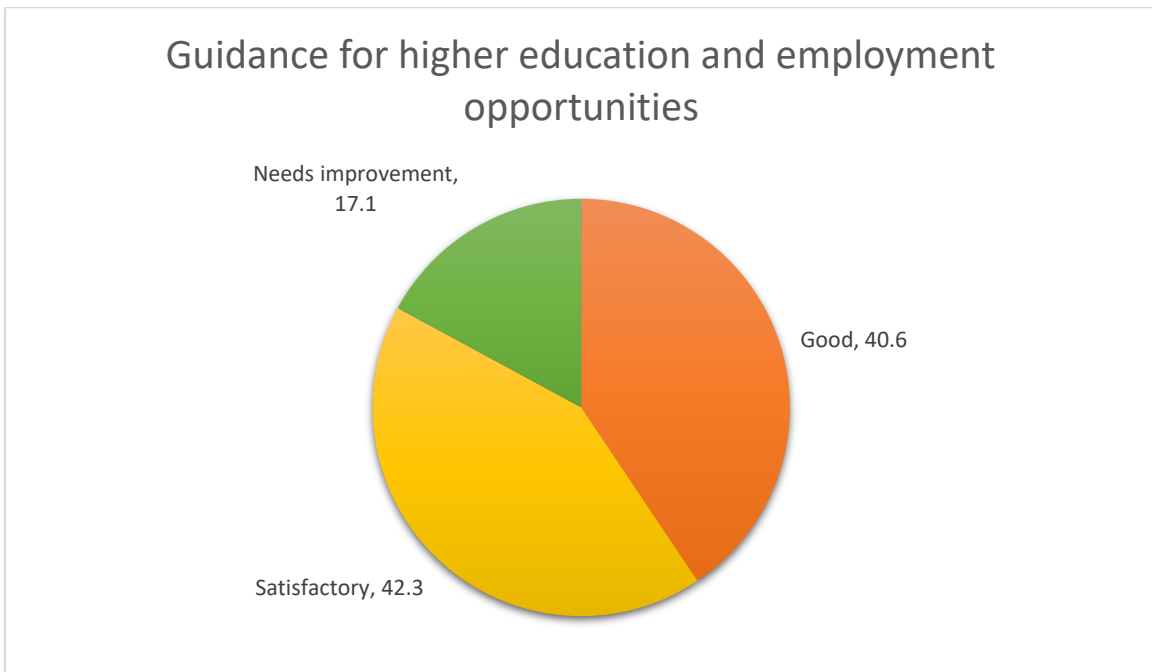
The pie chart outlines perceptions regarding the way student problems are resolved. Most of the respondents views the resolution process as good.



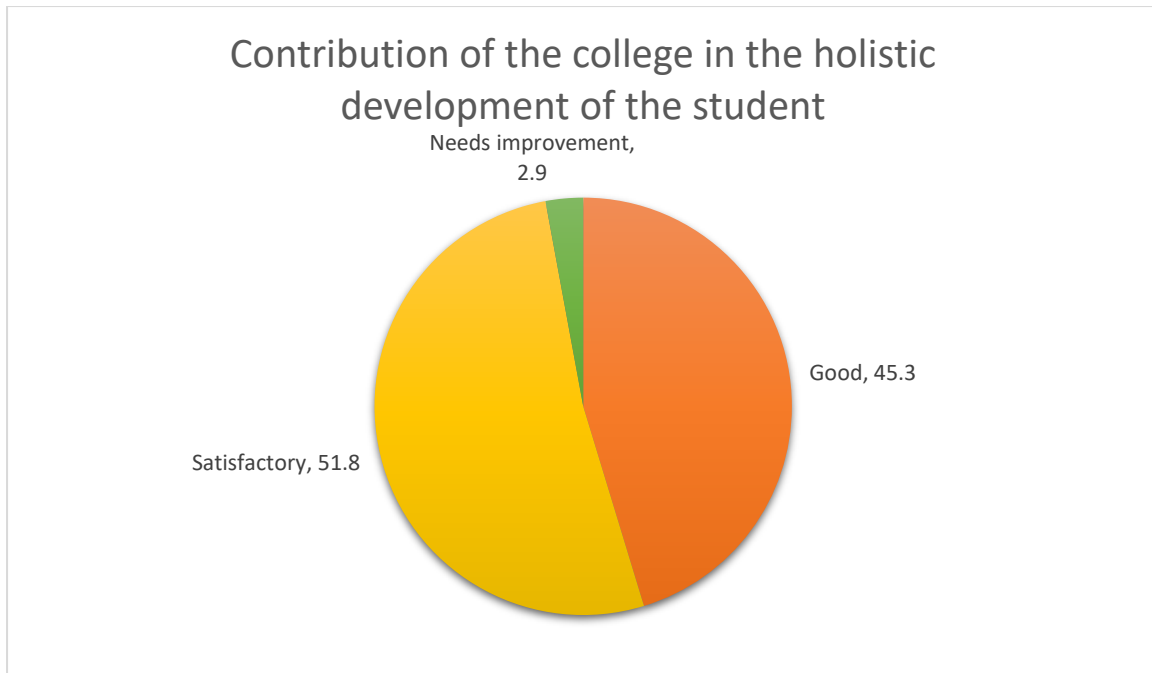
The pie chart represents perceptions of library facilities. Most of the respondents consider the library facilities as satisfactory.

Guidance: Guidance for higher education and employment is seen as satisfactory.

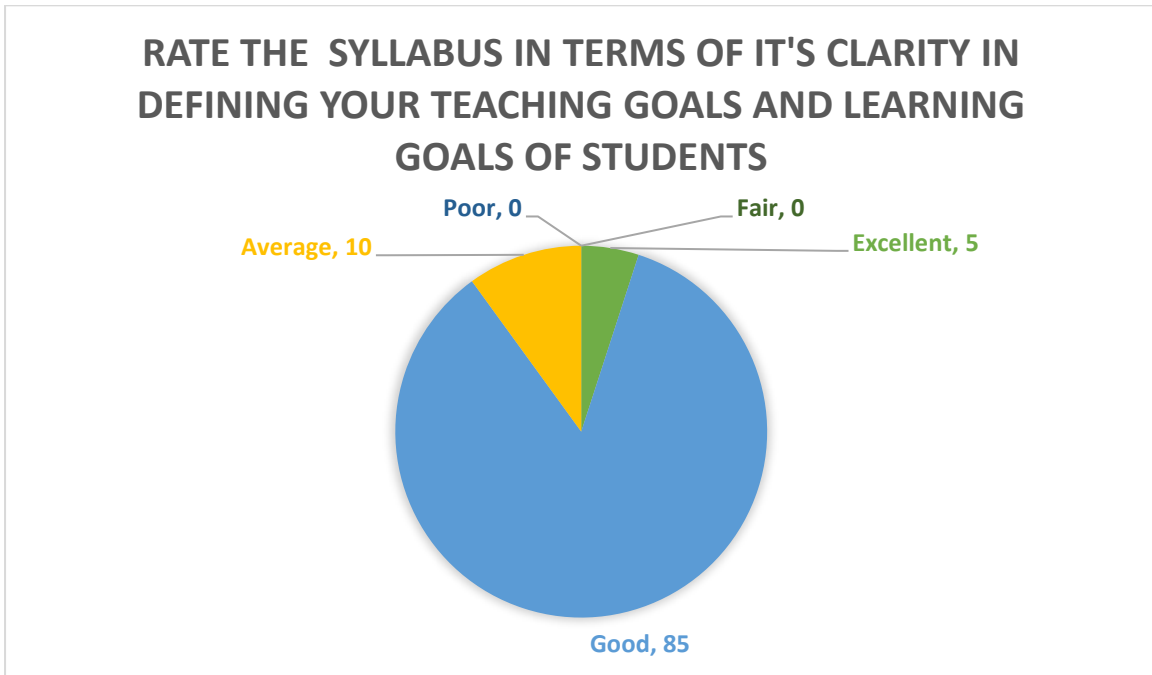
Holistic Development: The college's contribution to students' holistic development receives satisfactory ratings.

Overall, the feedback suggests that parents/guardians are generally satisfied with the college, but there are areas where further improvement is possible.

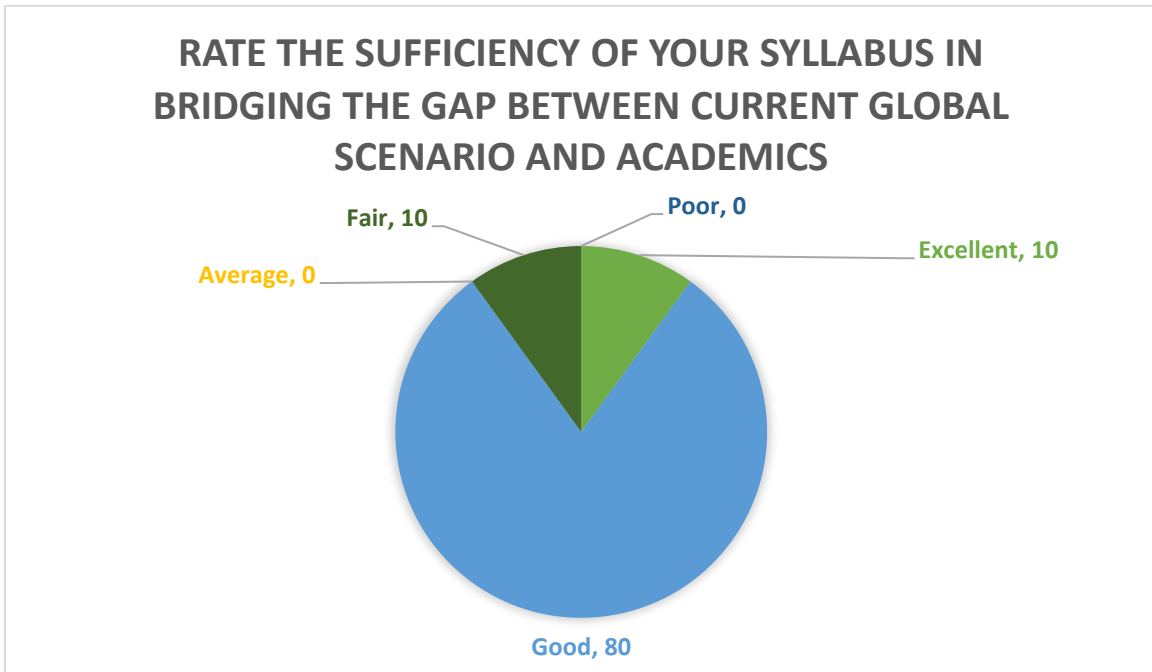



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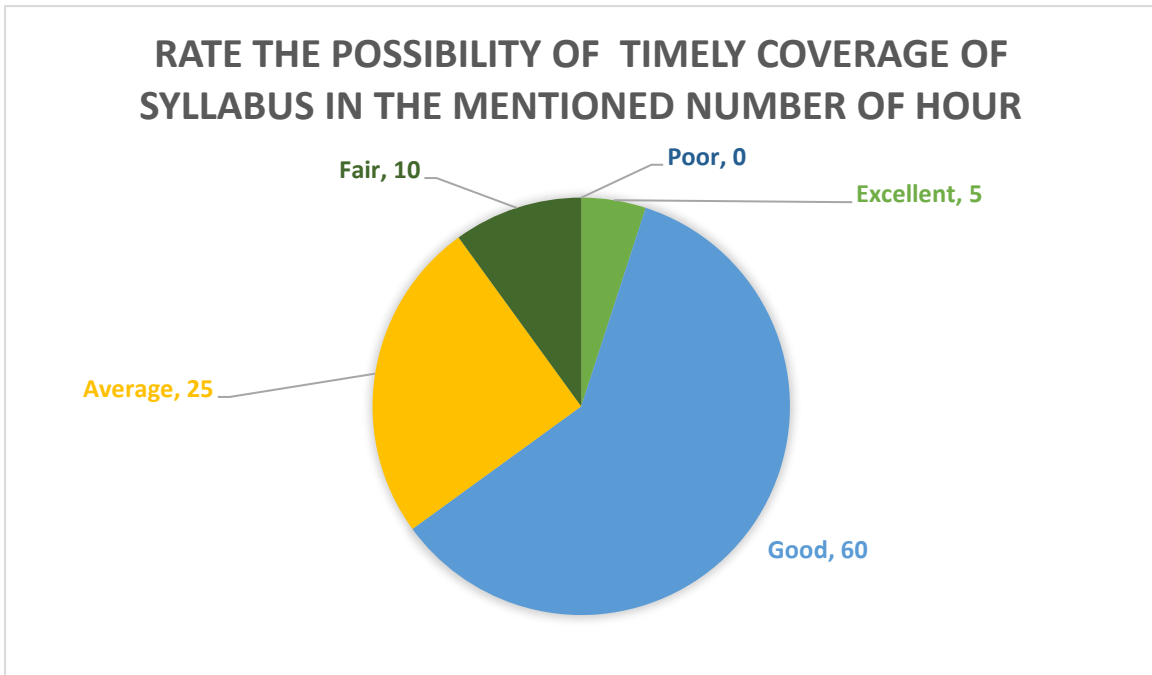

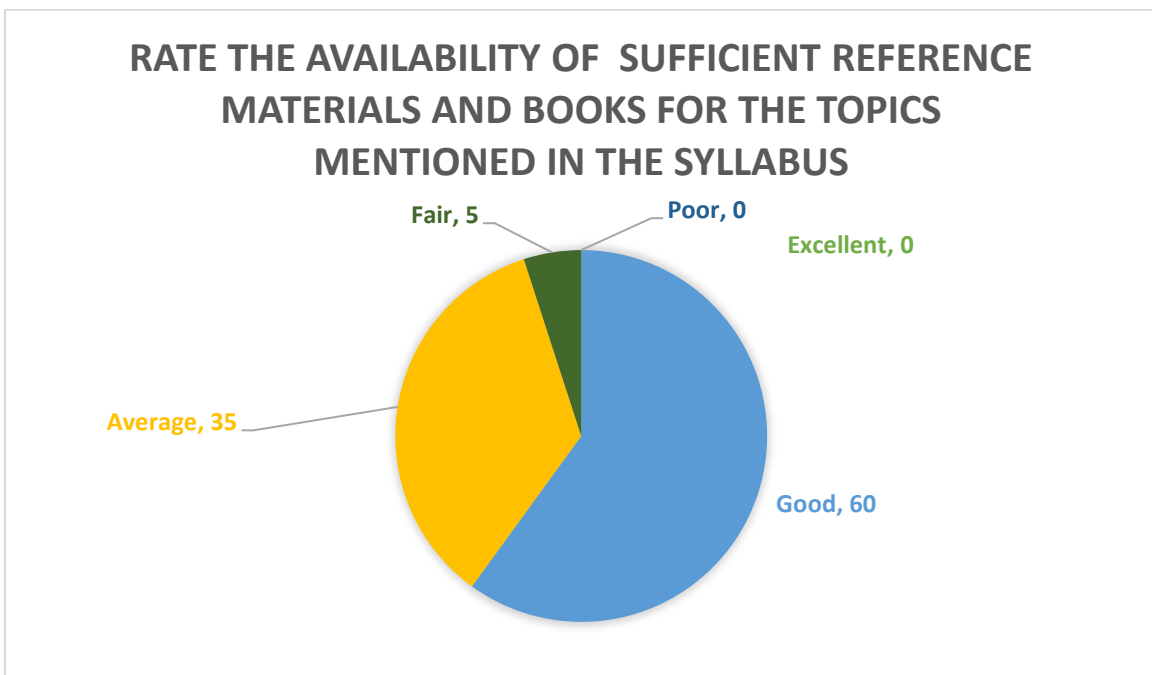

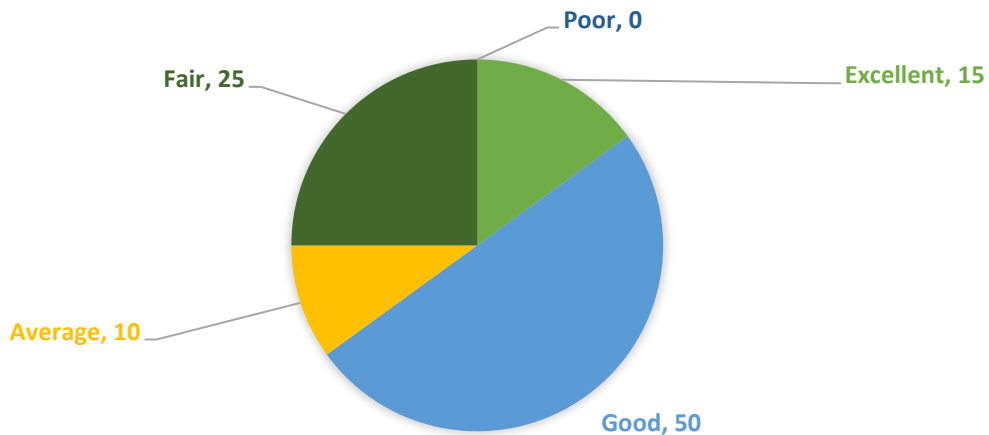


The pie chart represents ratings for the possibility of timely coverage of the syllabus within the specified number of hours. Most of the respondents considers it to be good.



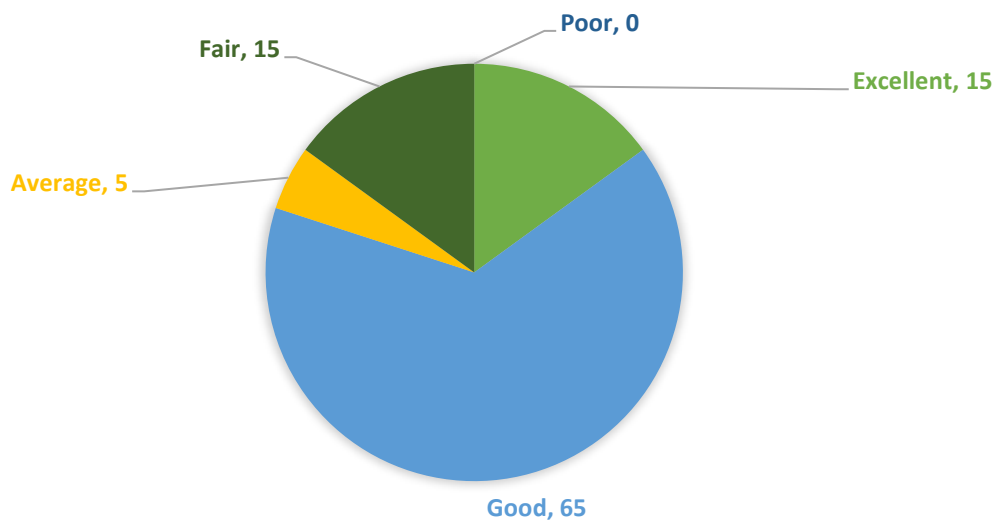

Areas for Potential Improvement

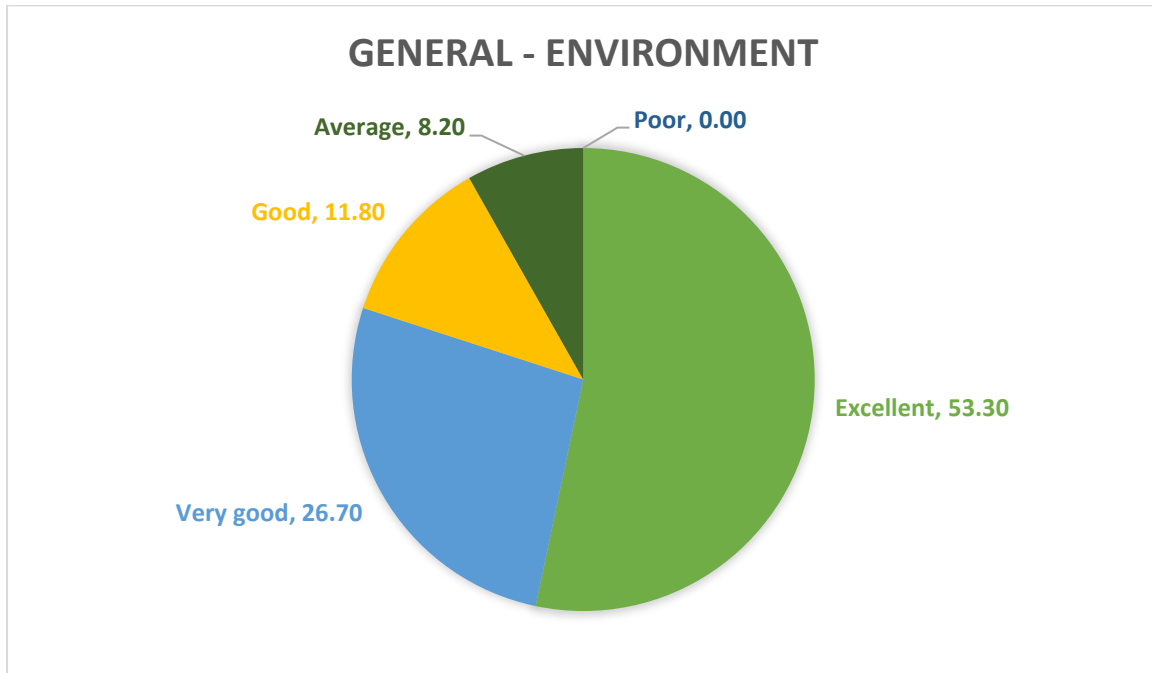

Overall: Teachers appear to have a positive impression of the syllabus, with a majority rating it as "good" across most aspects.

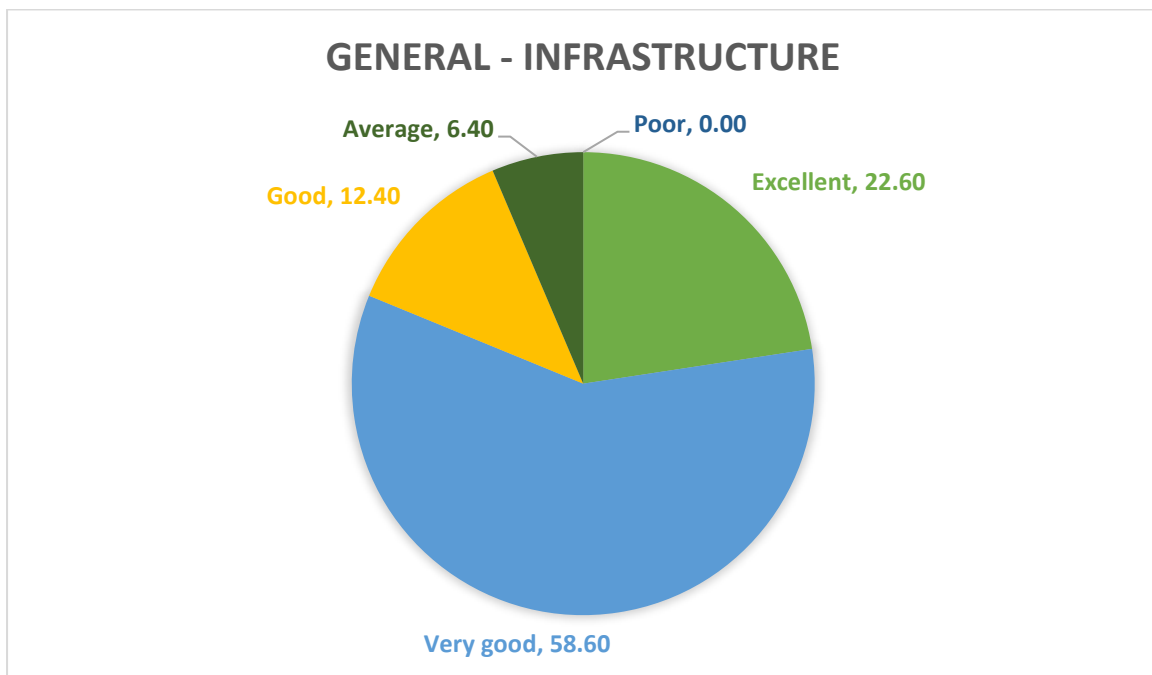

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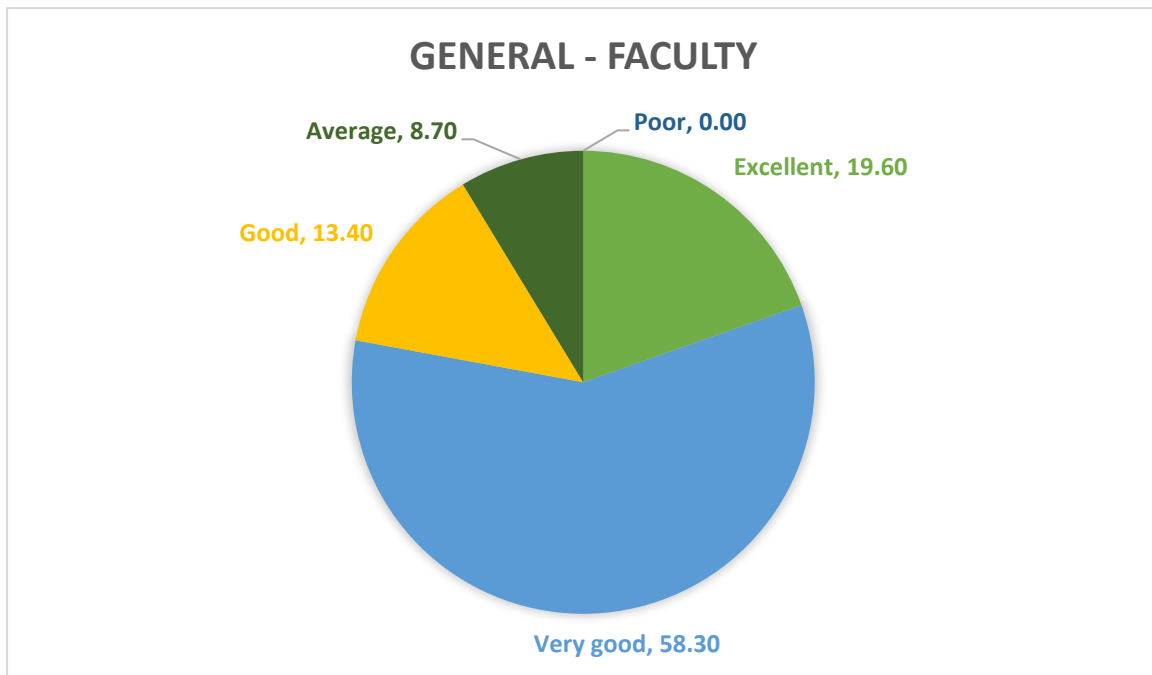

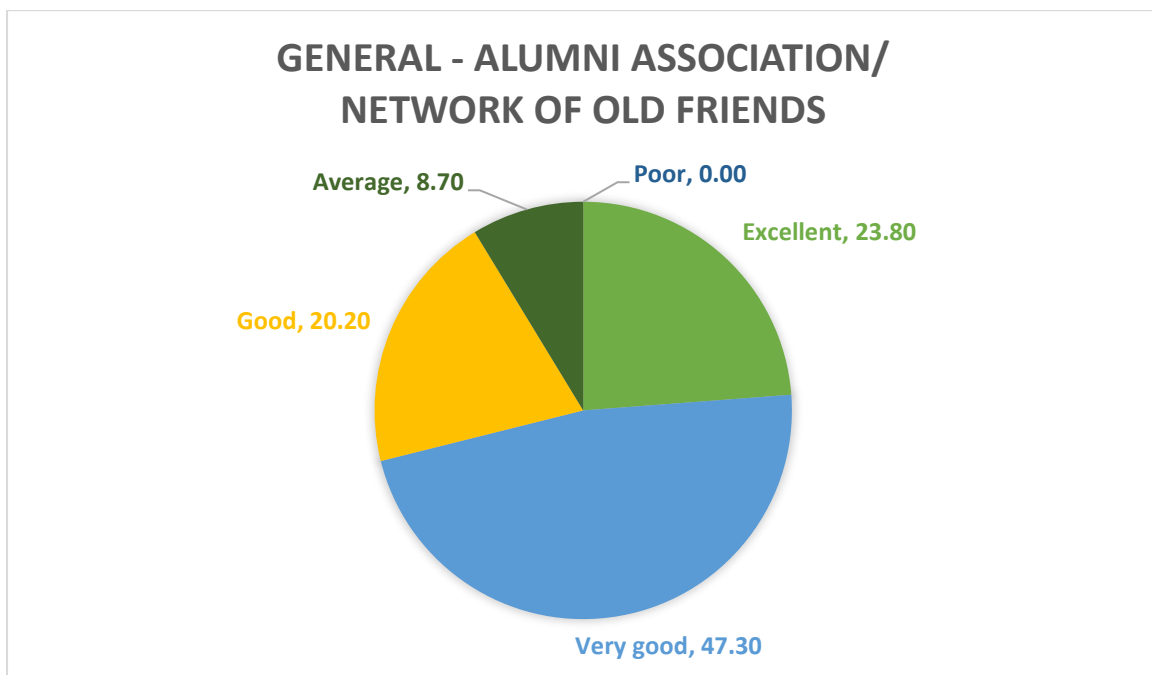
The pie chart represents the distribution of opinions regarding the environment of the college. It shows that majority of respondents believe the environment is excellent.



The pie chart illustrates opinions regarding infrastructure. It indicates that majority of respondents consider the infrastructure to be very good.

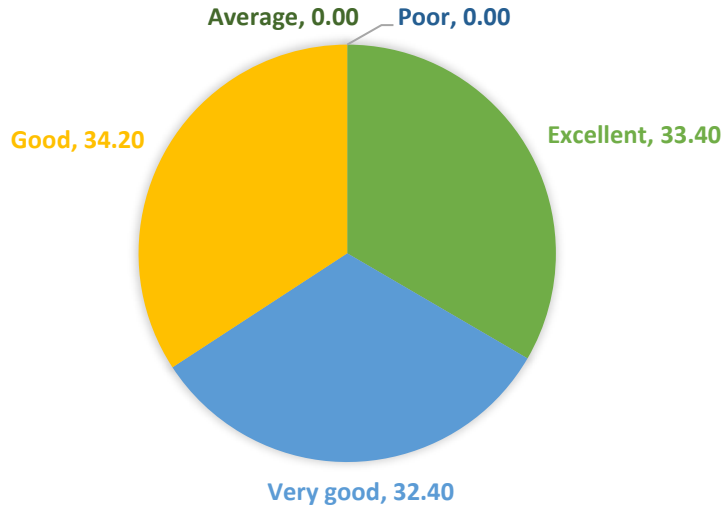


This pie chart represents perceptions related to the faculty. It shows that majority of respondents rate the faculty as very good.



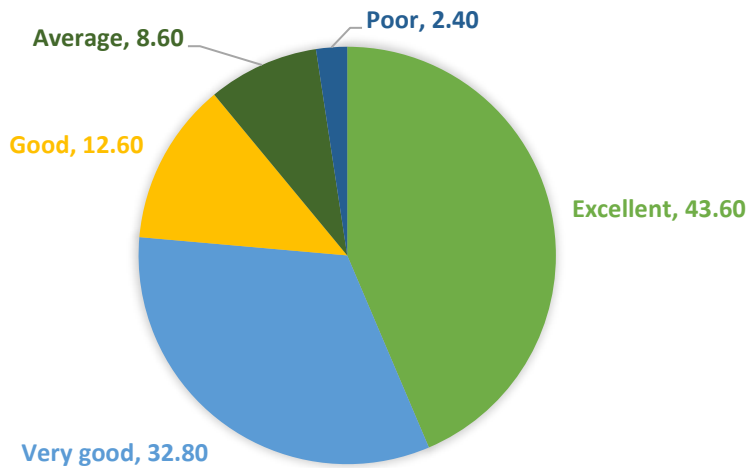
This pie chart outlines opinions regarding alumni association or network of old friends. It reveals that majority of respondents view it as very good.

GENERAL - LEARNING EXPERIENCE IN TERMS OF THEIR RELEVANCE TO THE REAL LIFE APPLICATION



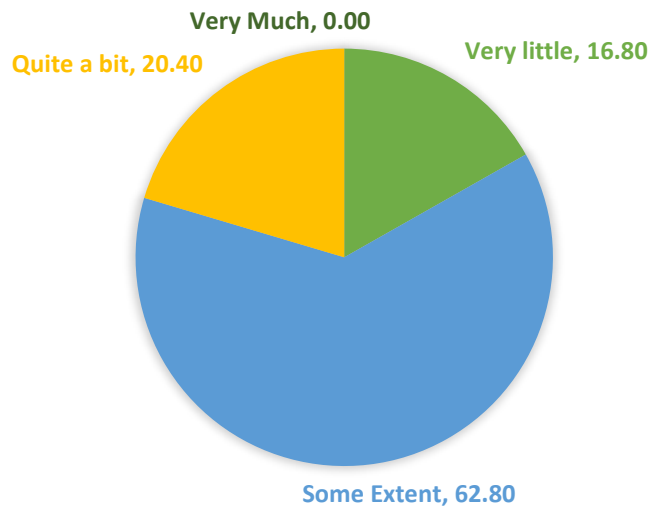
The pie chart depicts perceptions regarding the relevance of learning experience to real-life applications. It shows that majority respondents consider it has good or excellent relevance.

GENERAL - THE COURSE THAT YOU HAVE LEARNT IN RELATION TO YOUR CURRENT JOB



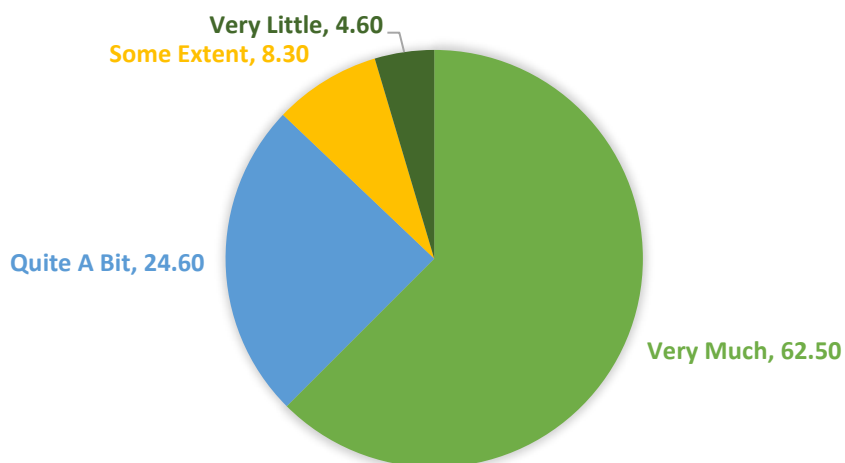

THE DEVELOPMENT ACTIVITIES ORGANIZED BY THE COLLEGE FOR YOUR OVERALL DEVELOPMENT



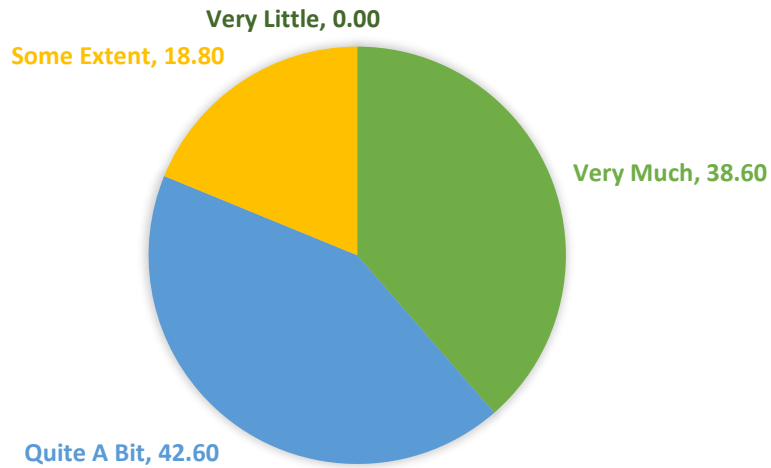
The pie chart shows the extent of development activities organized by the college for overall student development. The majority opine that the developmental activities are initiated by the college to some extent.

YOUR GRIEVANCES PROPERLY HANDLED AT THE COLLEGE - AS A STUDENT



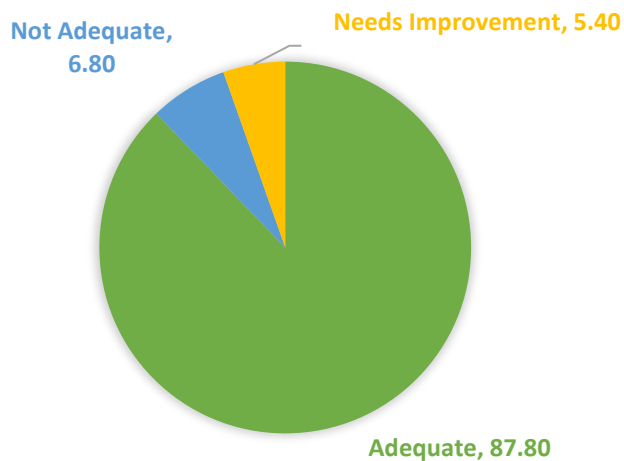
The pie chart represents alumni feedback as to the handling of their grievances at the college as a student. Most of the respondents indicated that their grievances were very much properly handled.

YOUR GRIEVANCES PROPERLY HANDLED AT THE COLLEGE - AS AN ALUMNI



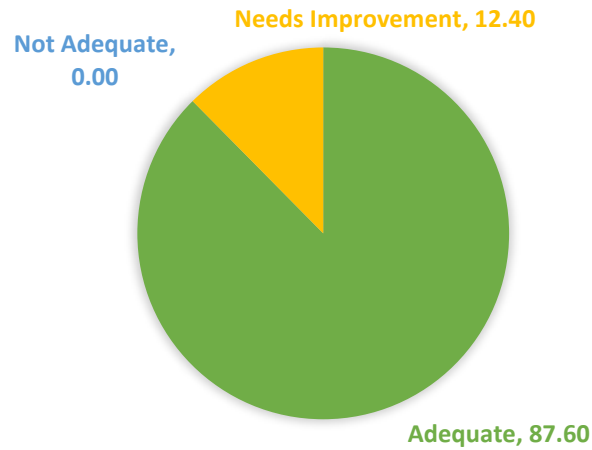

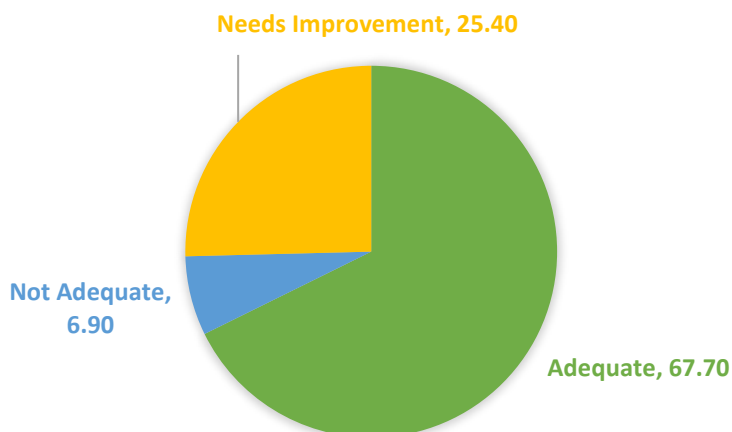

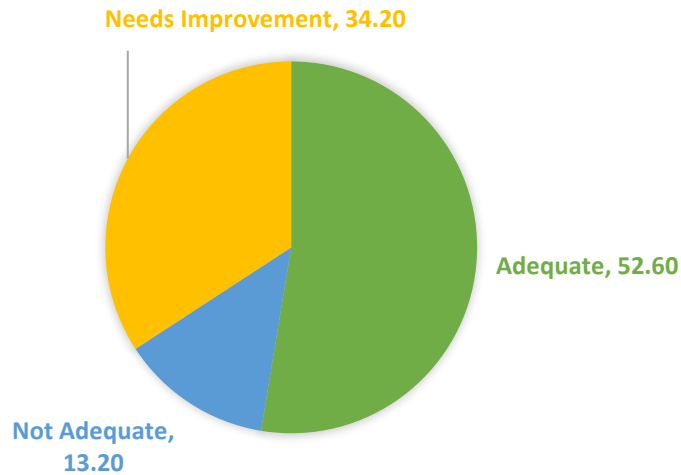

ADEQUACY OF THE FOLLOWING AS THEY WERE DURING YOUR TENURE AS A STUDENT - COMPUTER FACILITIES



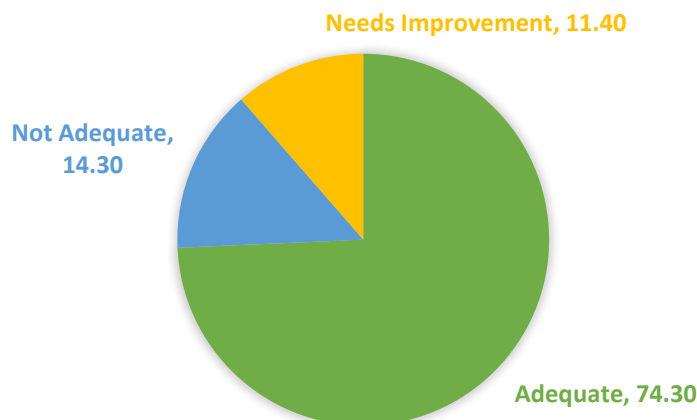

ADEQUACY OF THE FOLLOWING AS THEY WERE DURING YOUR TENURE AS A STUDENT - INTERNET & WI-FI



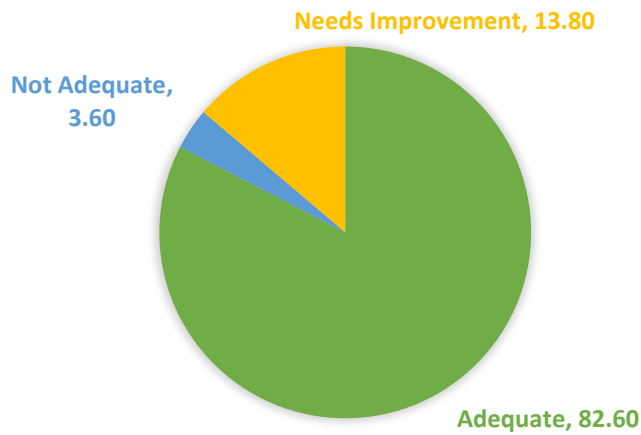

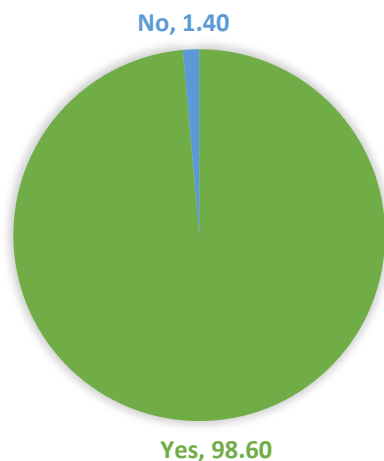

ADEQUACY OF THE FOLLOWING AS THEY WERE DURING YOUR TENURE AS A STUDENT - CLASSROOMS



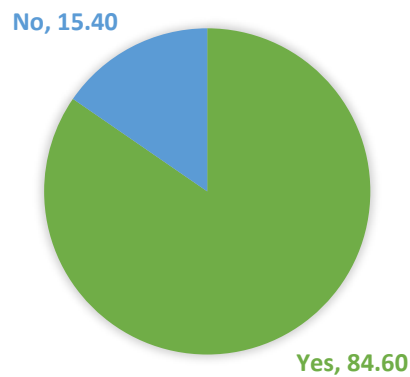

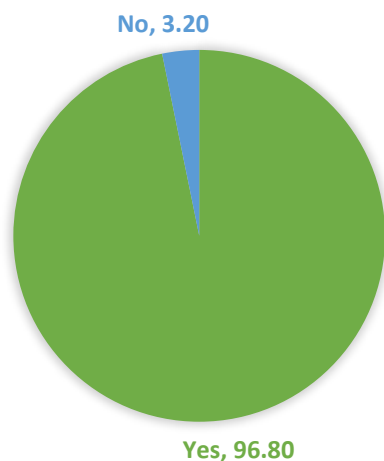

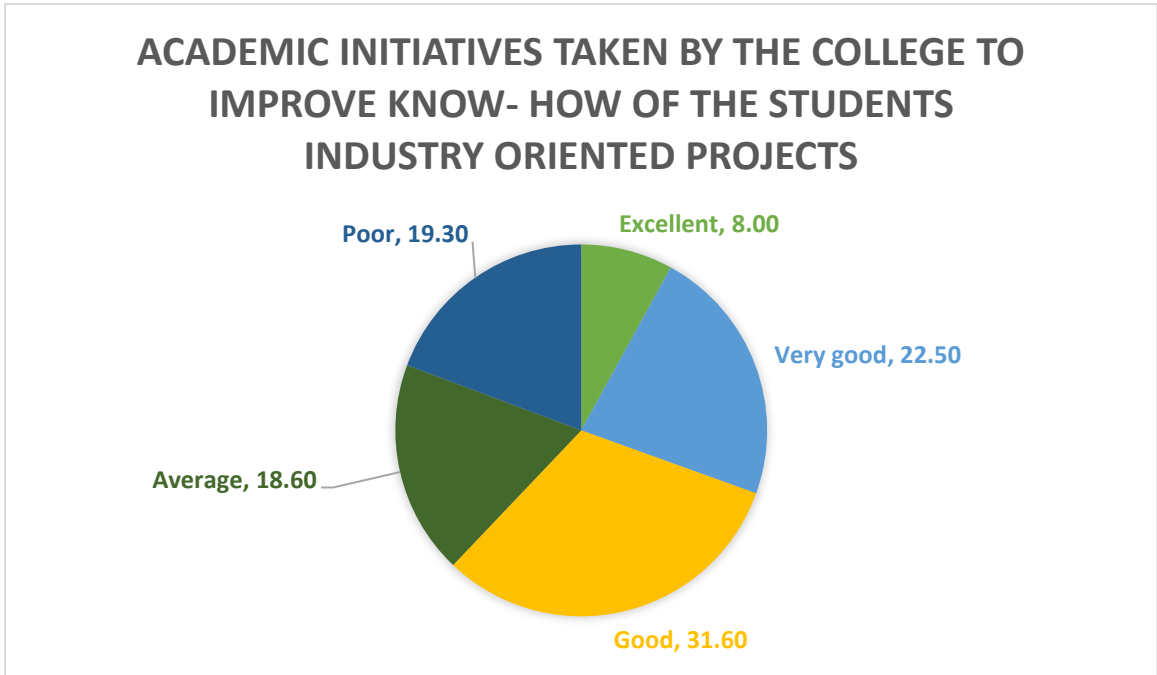

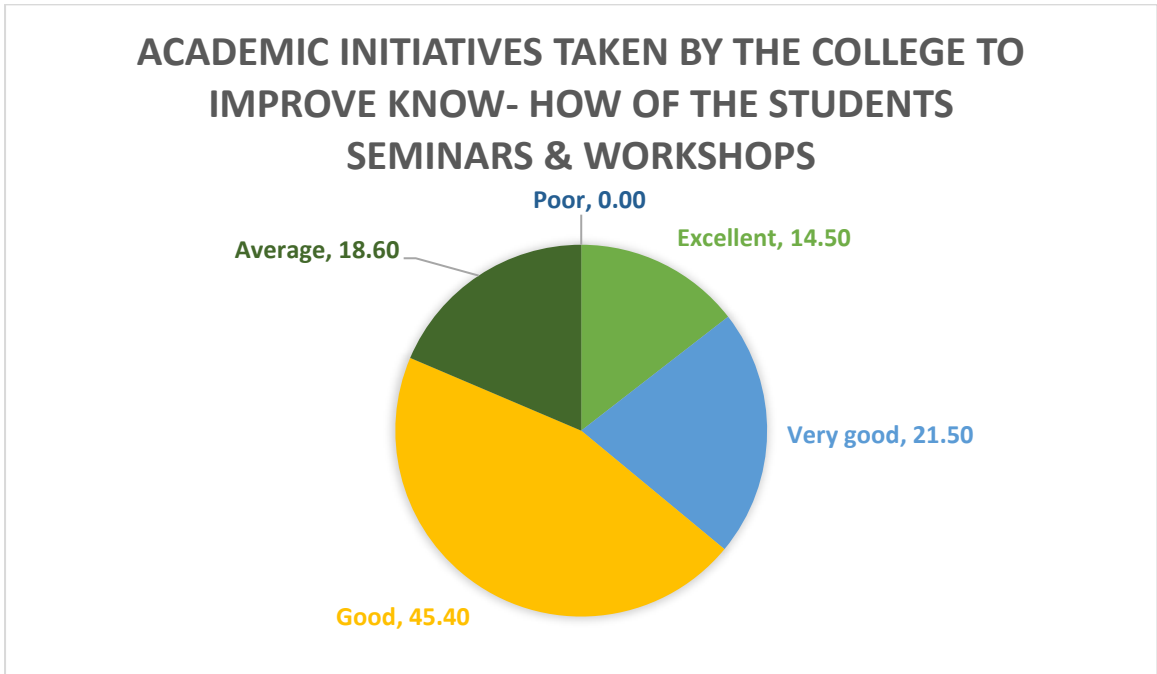

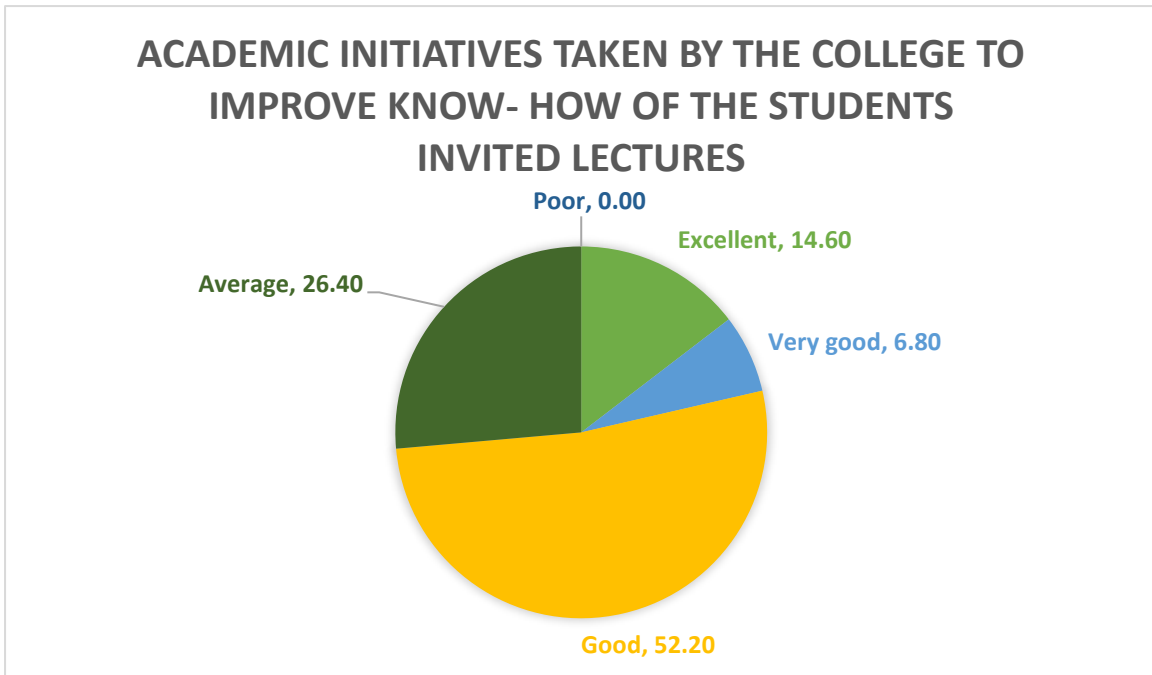

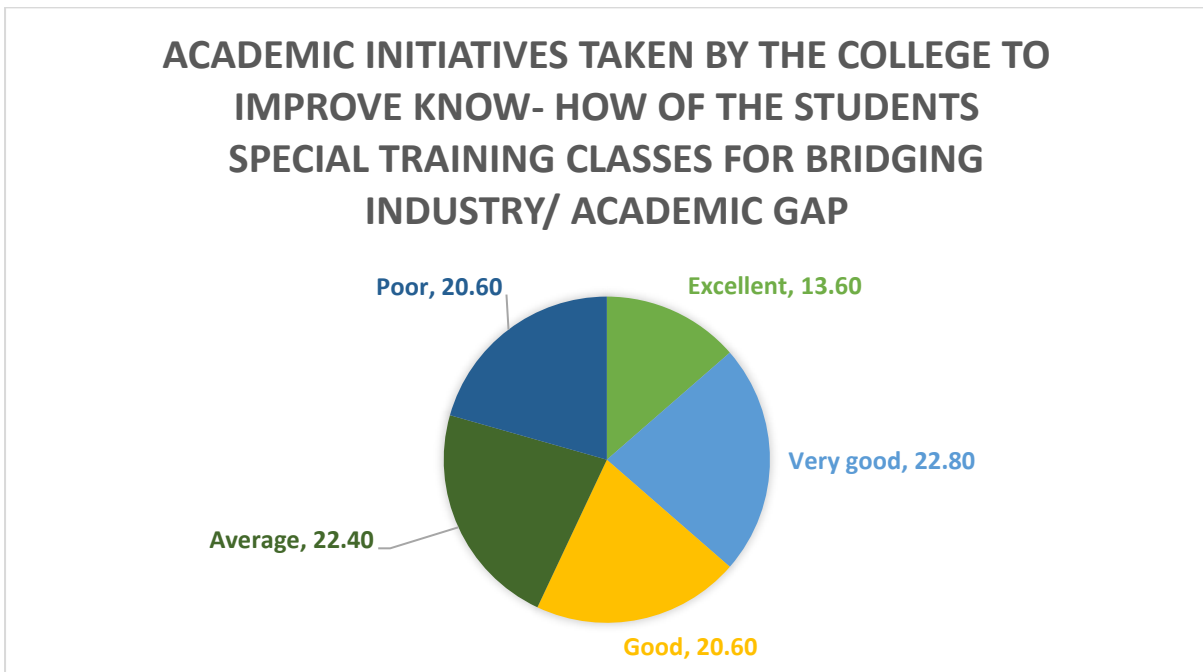

Internet & Wi-Fi: While considered adequate by some, improvements could be made to Internet and Wi-Fi services.

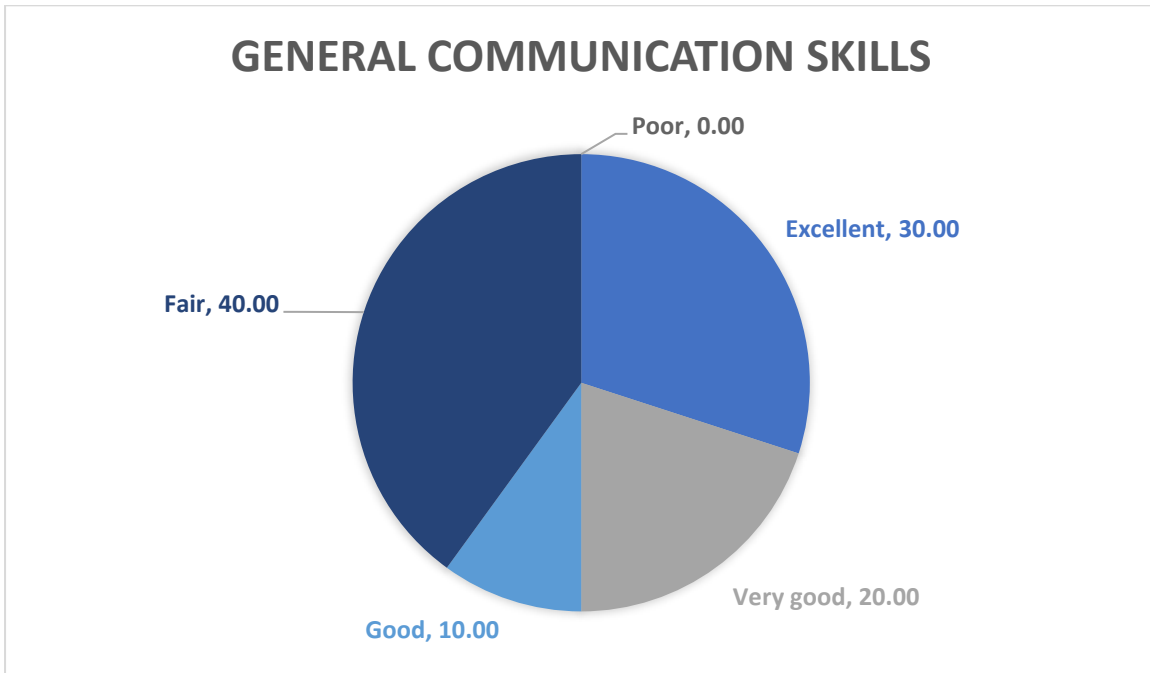
Special Training: Alumni responses on special training classes aimed at bridging the industry-academia gap were varied, suggesting potential for improvement in targeting specific needs.

Overall: Alumni seem to have a very positive impression of their experience at the college, with a majority rating various aspects as "excellent," "very good," or "adequate."

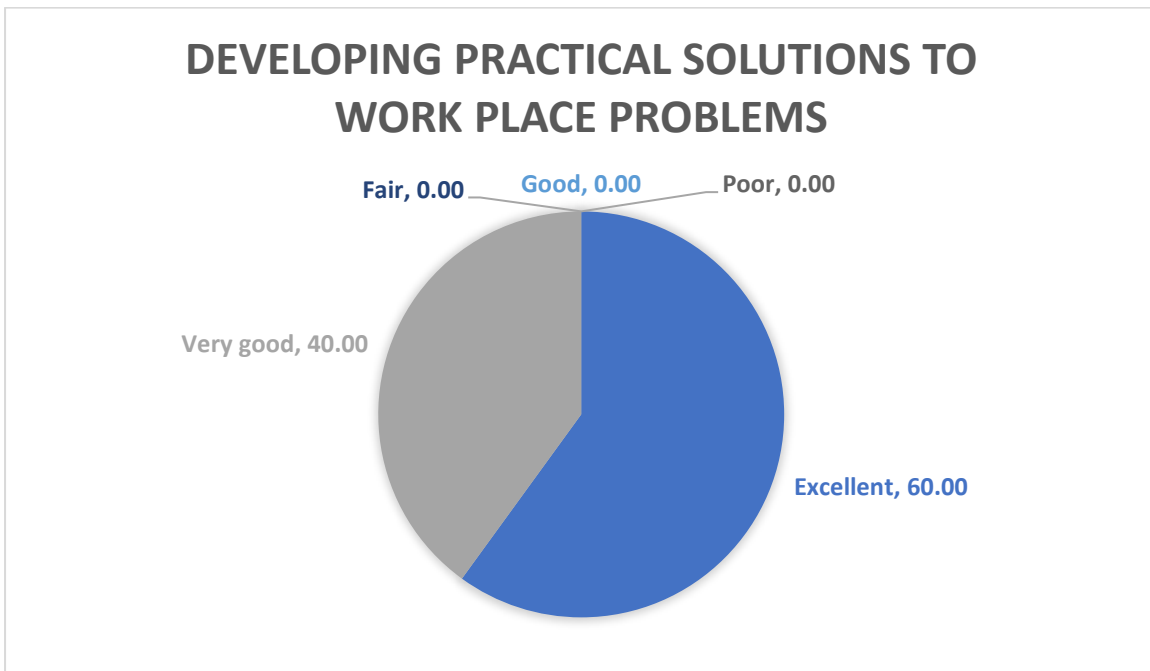

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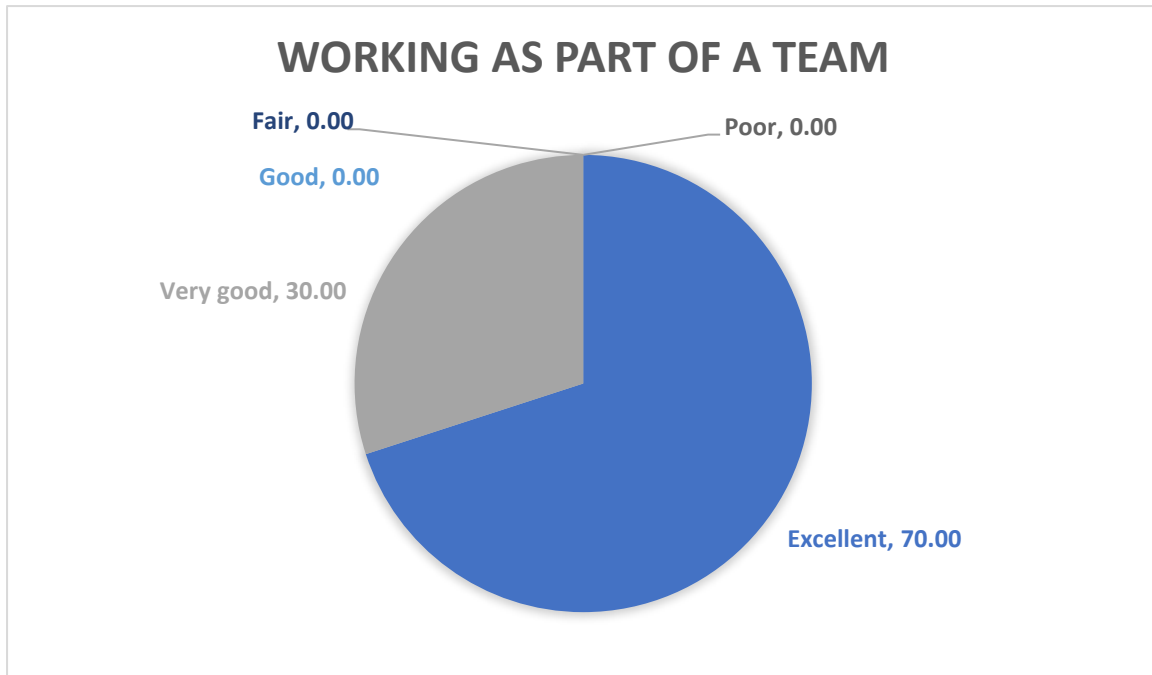

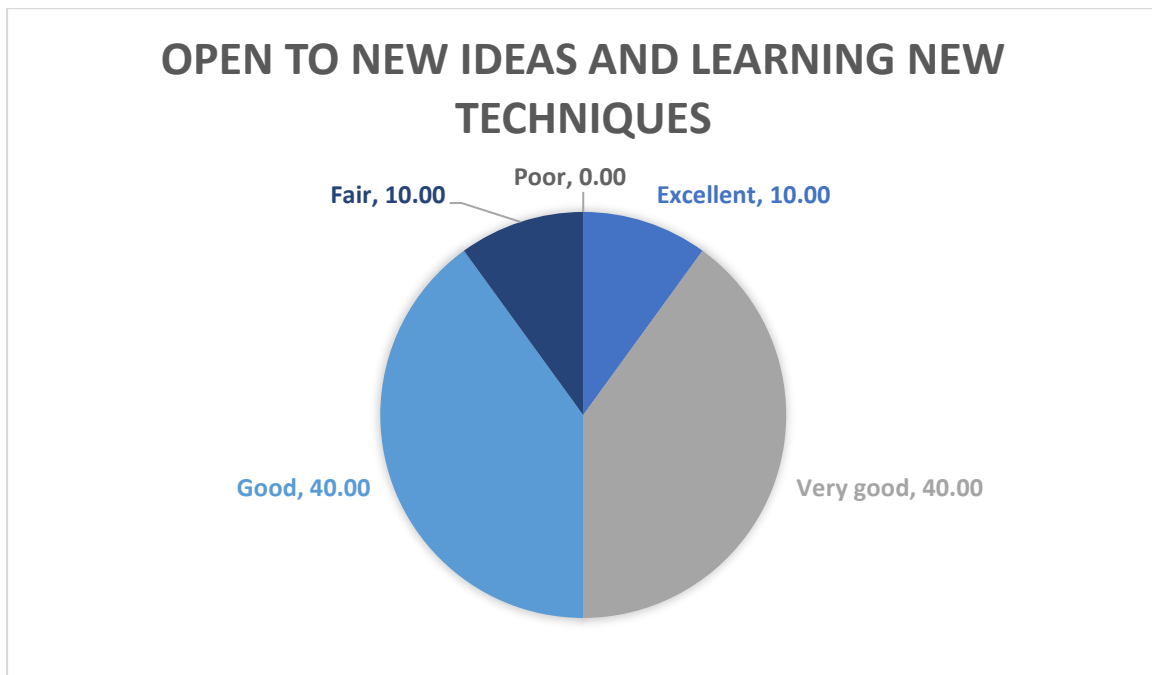

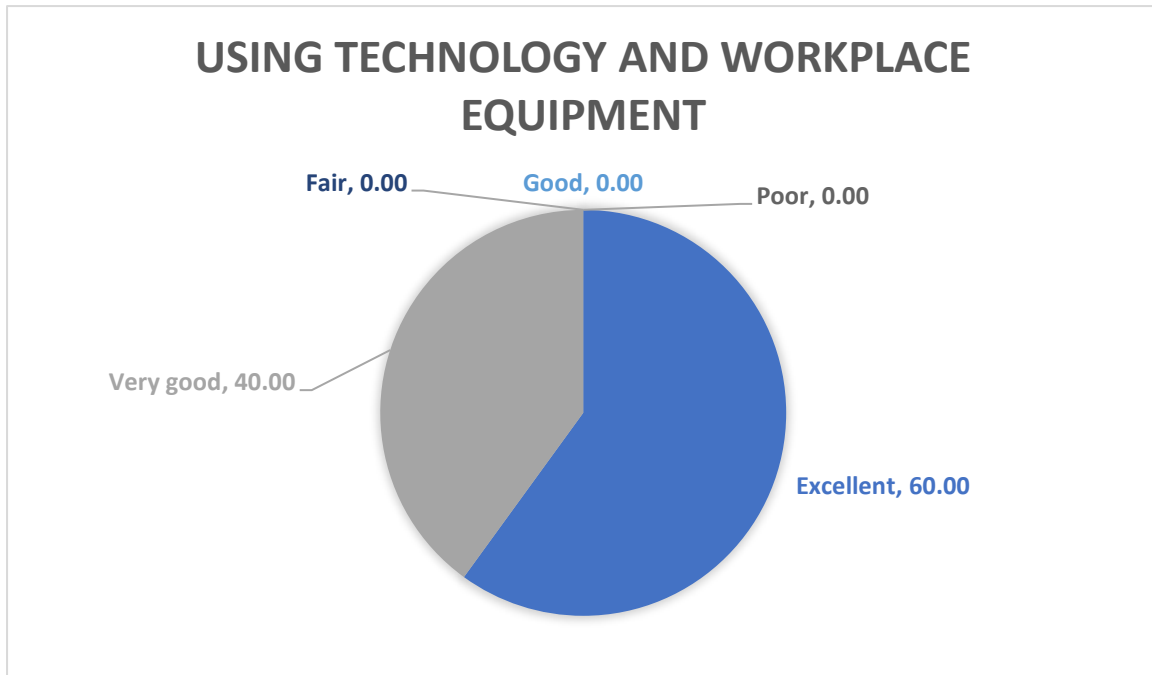

The pie chart showcases the evaluations for “Working as part of a team.” Impressively, 70% of respondents rated it as ‘Excellent’.



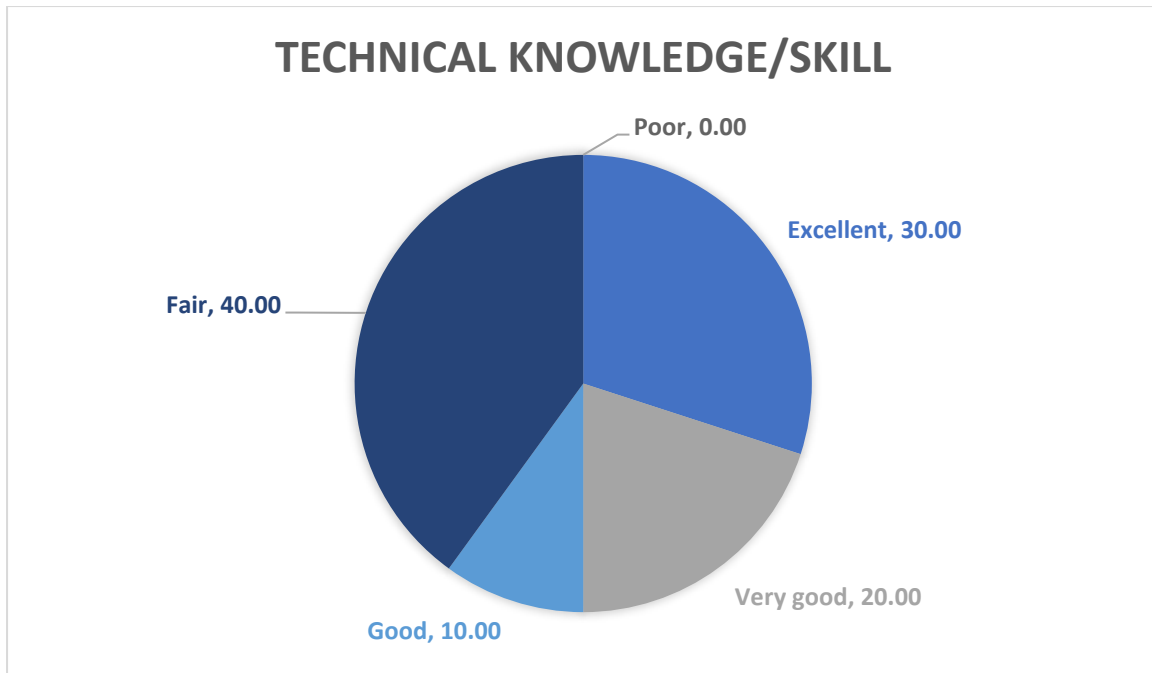

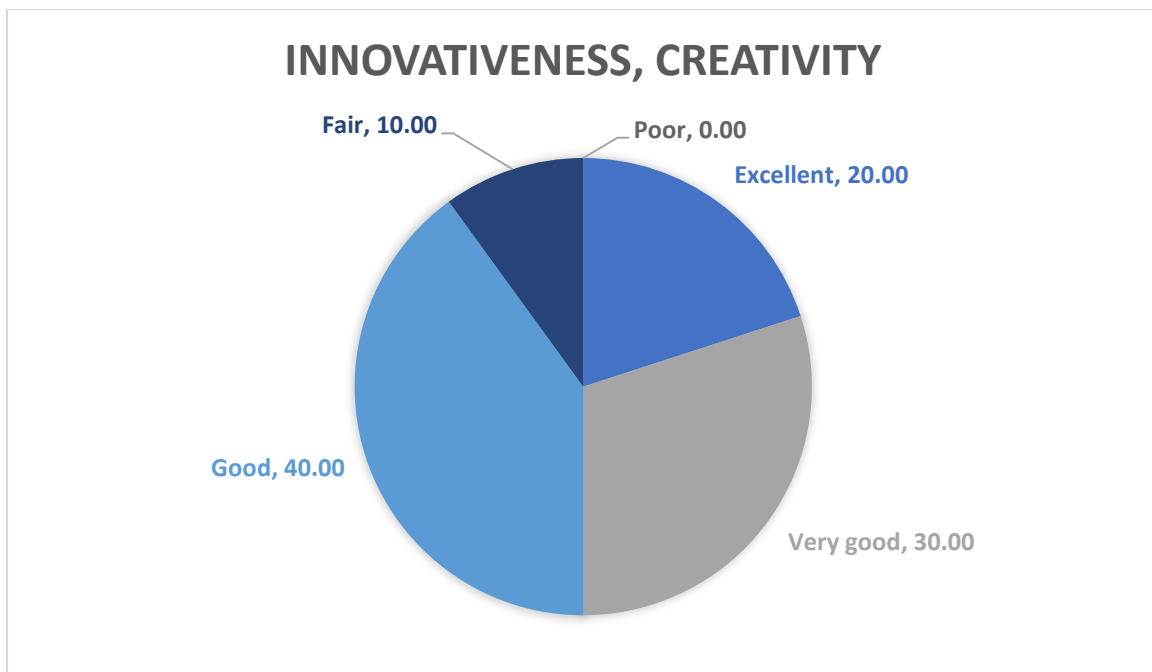
The pie chart depicts the evaluations for “Using technology and workplace equipment.” 60% of respondents rated this skill as “Excellent”.



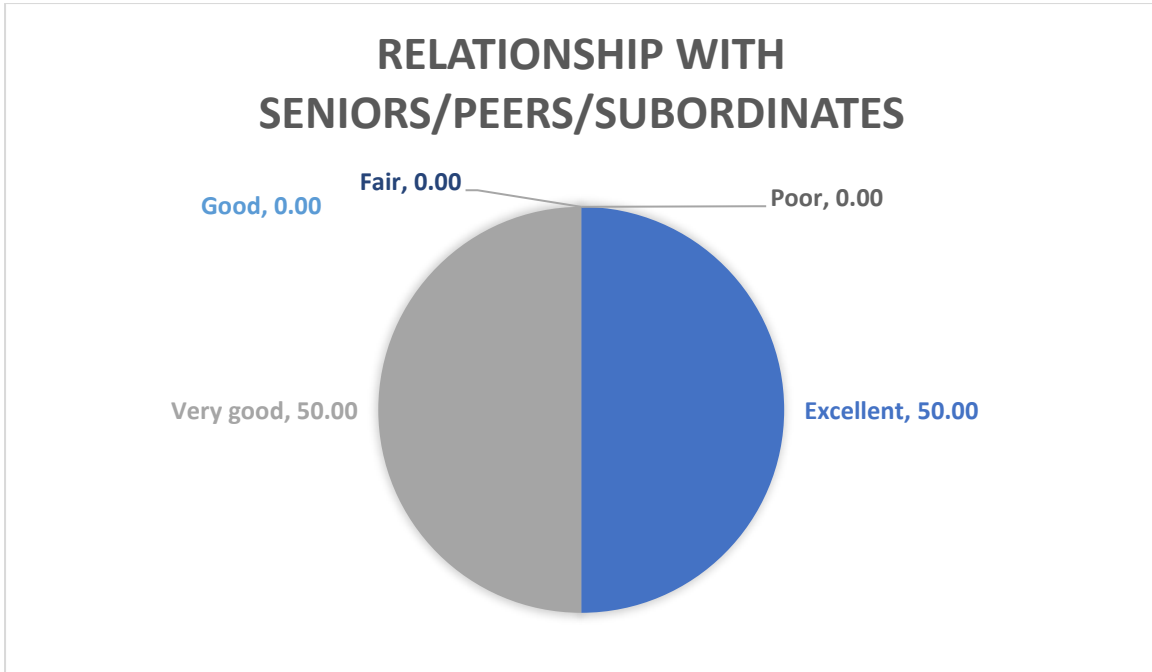

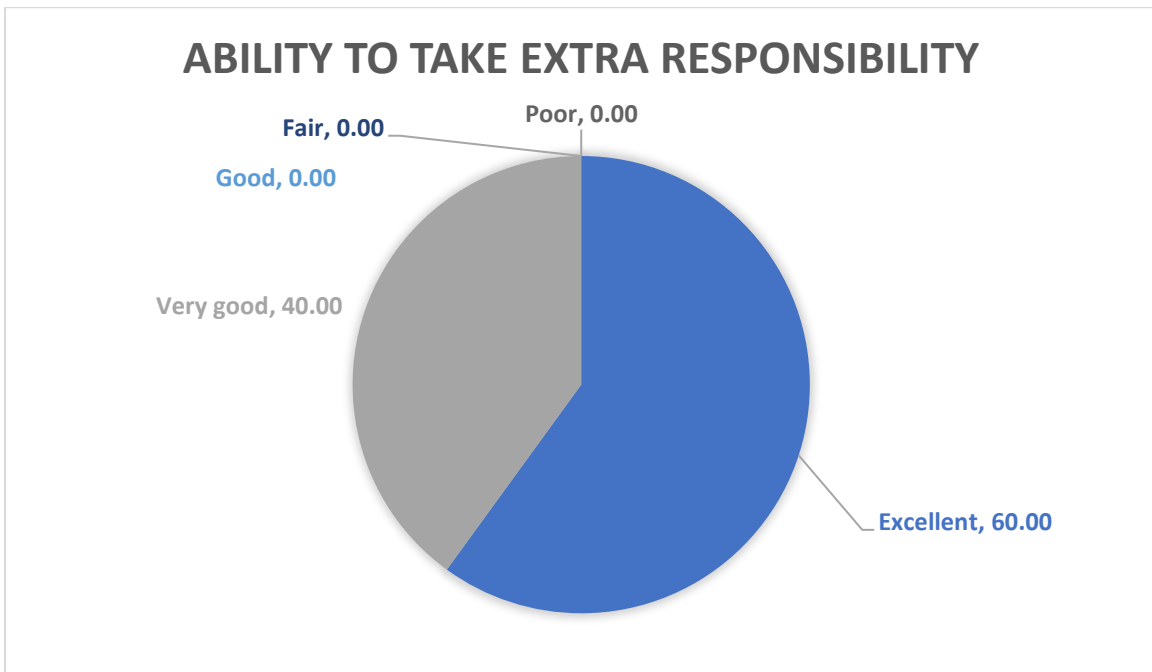
The pie chart depicts the evaluation for ‘Technical knowledge/skill.’ 40% of the respondents rated this skill as “Fair”.
