



Antoine Lavoisier Lecture Series

The lecture series, launched in 2017 under the title 'Antoine Lavoisier Lecture Series' in honour of the Silver Jubilee festivities, continued this year with two lectures. The first lecture of the year and the third of the series was conducted on the topic *A Small Dip in the Vast Ocean of Organic Chemistry* on September 5, 2018. Dr. Rony Rajan Paul, Assistant Professor, CMS College, Kottayam, handled the session. It was an engaging lecture that exported the chemistry of nature as well as human emotions. Rather than giving a lecture, he



used his experiences to illustrate the necessity of organic chemistry in the new period. The Principal,Dr. Sherly Kurian, presented a gesture of gratitude to the chief visitor.



The fourth session in the lecture series was presented on January 7, 2019, with the theme *How to Make Your Life a Success* to inspire students to take up their professional goals. Prof. Dr. P. C. 

The Chemistry Department, in association with Kerala State Council for Science, Technology, and Environment (KSCSTE) and DST, Govt. of India, organised a two-day programme and an intercollegiate quiz competition on the topic *Introducing Horizons of Effective Communication of Science to the Public* in connection with the National Science Day Celebrations 2019 on 14th February 2019 and 15th February 2019 in our college.

The programme was officially inaugurated by Dr. S Anas, Assistant Professor, School of Chemical Sciences, M G University, Kottayam on 14th February 2019. Principal Dr. Sherly Kurian presided over the inaugural function. Two lectures were conducted on that day. Dr. S Anas, Honorary Director, Advanced Molecular Materials Research and Centre, Kottayam delivered a lecture on the topic *'Synthetic Chemistry: Landmarks and Significance'*. 






12th Annual Training Programme for Administrative Staff


Distribution of Flood Relief Materials
